Mr. James D. Flood will present our next Gift of Music Concert on Sunday, March 23, at 3:00pm. Mr. Flood moved to Western New York in the early 1970's to work with a local pipe organ company and did graduate study with the late Squire Haskin. Mr. Flood has installed and tonally finished over two hundred organs in eastern United States and Canada. He has concertized extensively throughout the Northeast. In 1989 he was elected a Fellow of the Wessex Theological College. In August 1991 he toured England, playing several programs in historic churches. A practicing church musician for over forty-five years, he is Minister of Music at University Presbyterian Church where he presides over their new pipe organ, conducts the semi-professional adult choir, the handbell choir and supervises the youth and cherub choirs.

In 1995 Mr. Flood released a recording, "The American Impressionist Organ" on cassette and CD. Mr. Flood is a member of the American Guild of Organists and a Life Member of Phi Mu Alpha, the men's professional music fraternity. He currently lectures at Villa Maria College in Buffalo, where he teaches piano and organ majors.
