

# History of the Holy Trinity Roman Catholic Church & School

In the beginning of the century the European economy and political atmosphere forced many people to emigrate to America. Niagara Falls was well known by people all over the world for its waterfalls and electric power. This attracted many Poles to emigrate to Niagara Falls. They bought land and built new homes in the East Falls Street area between Portage Road and 10th Street.

The increase in the number of Polish people to Niagara Falls made many of them realize that there was a need for a church. The Bishop of the Buffalo Diocese, J.E. Quigley, assigned the East Side residents to the Irish Church - St. Mary's of the Cataract on 4th Street. On special Holy Days, the Bishop assigned a Polish priest. He also was to hear confessions, serve the sick and perform weddings and funerals.

As the Polish population grew to 100 families and 400 single men, they authorized Jacob and Agnes Pasek, Jacob Kaszyca and Stefan Ciesielski to petition Bishop Quigley to send a priest to organize a parish and build a church. The Bishop assigned Rev. Peter Pitass to organize the first Polish Fraternal Society. This was done and it was named the Holy Trinity Society. After the organization of the Society, the members agreed to plan to purchase or build a church. They agreed to lease a building on the corner of East Falls Street and 12th Street. The Bishop then assigned Rev. Peter Pitass as the first pastor.

By the Fall of 1901, the parish was established and operating in a temporary building. The first floor was used for church purposes and the second floor for teaching the children.

A short while later the Bishop transferred Rev. Pitass and assigned Rev. Bartkowski as pastor of Holy Trinity Parish. Since the lease on the building was for only one year, Rev. Bartkowski and the Holy Trinity Society decided to purchase the land on the corner of 14th Street and East Falls Street. Six lots were bought under the name of the Holy Trinity Roman Catholic Church of Niagara Falls, N.Y. The small building from 12th Street was moved on to the 14th Street lots. A sacristy was added and the church building was enlarged to accomodate 300 persons at church services. On November 3, 1902 Bishop Quigley blessed the new church building under the name of the Holy Trinity Roman Catholic Church.

Soon after, the Buffalo Chancery transferred Rev. Bartkowski and assigned Rev. Dr. Schultz as pastor. Within a month, August 1, 1903, Rev. Schultz was transferred and Rev. Michael Dymynski was assigned as pastor. He remained for many years.



In 1905 plans were made to build a new church. In 1906 the new church was completed and blessed by Bishop Carroll H. Colton. In May 1906 a home for the priests was started and completed by January 1907.

In August 1908 the old church was remodeled into 3 classrooms. This was in addition to the two classrooms in the 2 story frame building on the corner of East Falls Street and 14th Street. Another classroom was rented across the street at 1420 East Falls Street.

The sisters lived on the second floor of the old framed building. Their living quarters were small and as the school population increased there was need for more teachers. The order of nuns teaching at the school was the St. Francis order. They replaced the male teachers who taught at the original school. We know that Mr. Johnson was the first male teacher and that he was also the church organist, but there were several others who's names are not recorded. A new home for the increased number of nuns who were teaching was planned and built. By May 29, 1910 the new convent and the remodeled classrooms were completed.

In 1911 Rev. Michael Dyminski was transferred. The Bishop assigned Rev. Dr. Alexander Pitass as pastor. In 1913 the plans for the construction of the present school were made under Rev. Pitass, but he was transferred to St. Stanislaus Parish in Buffalo. Rev. Dr. Thomas Stabeneau, an expert in the Polish language and the Polish Parochial School system was assigned the task of completing the construction of the building.

The new school had 8 classrooms and a kindergarten on the first two floors, and an auditorium on the third floor. In the basement was a small hall, 3 rooms for fraternal meetings, a boiler room, and a kitchenette that was used as a cafeteria for the children and for small social affairs.

After several priest either died or were transferred, Rev. John Praczkajlo was appointed pastor. Shortly after his appointment, the Franciscian Sisters were transfered because of the decrease in enrollment. Rev. Praczkajlo was able to obtain the services of the Sisters of the Vincentian order because his natural sister was a member of this order. This lasted for several years, but by 1974 the Diocesan Director of Schools ordered the school closed because of the constant decrease in enrollment. The next school year saw our children enrolled at St. Joseph's School, St. Stanislaus School or others schools near to their homes.
