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

We do not know how they accomplished such a task in the face of such formidable odds, but we do know what

motivated them...a human drive for freedom. A sense of decency and a love of humanity encouraged many people to aid these run away slaves. These people, the travelers on the Underground Railroad and those who opened their homes to them are our inspiration and our legacy.

The goals set forth by Ms. Lillion Batchelor towards increasing the awareness of the Underground Railroad are as follows:


Increase international awareness to the role Buffalo
