Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus Marches and Sings with Pride

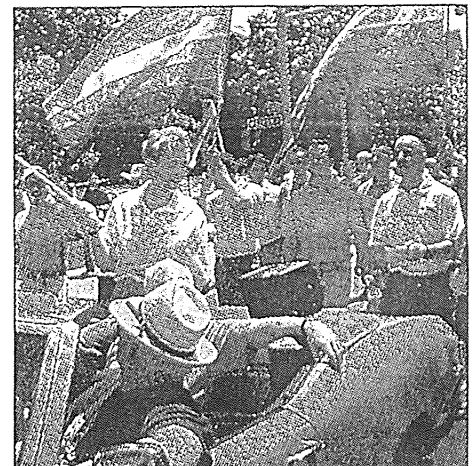

Lonnie Arnold to Lead BGMC Voice Class

Bill Fay will teach music reading to interested choristers

Chorus members will have a wonderful opportunity this fall to enhance their music skills.

Beginning at 6:00 PM on Tuesday, September 17 (our second rehearsal of the season), two music classes will be offered for the singers' consideration.

Lonnie Arnold, a retired music teacher from Monroe County, will offer a voice class. Lonnie holds a Master's degree from the Eastman School of Music and has recently moved to Niagara County. Enrollment in the voice class will be limited to eight singers.

Concurrently, our own Bill Fay will teach a music reading class, which will be capped at twenty enrollees. Bill teaches high school music in Niagara Falls and is a graduate of SUNY at Fredonia and SUNY at Buffalo.

Both classes will run for 45 minutes each Tuesday for ten weeks. At 6:45 both classes will break for a light supper provided by the BGMC, and all singers will reconvene at 7:00 for chorus rehearsal.

The board of the BGMC has voted to grant funds to support these educational ventures as a pilot project. While they are subsidized, classes will still

require payment of registration fees. The voice class fee will be \$25.00 (for the ten week series) and the music reading class will cost \$10.00 (also for ten weeks). To reserve a place in either class, please contact Bill Fay.

President's Column: 2002 Annual Report

The Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus is a thriving organization. Since our incorporation in the Spring of '01, we have grown well past our earlier expectations. I'd like to share with you our accomplishments this first year and our goals for this coming year. The Board's planning is outlined in a strategic plan document which we distribute to members each year. We have reason to celebrate: we have met all the goals set in the first year's plan!

2001-2002

Here's what we together have accomplished in our first year, by working as a community:

1. The BGMC enlisted the enthusiastic support and services of one of the most expert choral directors in Western New York, Barbara Wagner. Under her affectionate guidance, we auditioned and formed a men's chorus of over 60 voices that performed two well-publicized and well-received concerts with great style and flash.

2. We invited the participation of a diversity of men, both singers and non-singers, and supported chorus members with a scholarship fund.

3. We maintained financial stability and engaged in a wide range of fund raising activities. This was accomplished with singers' annual dues, with extra funding contributed by the members of the Board, with advertising and ticket sales, and, especially, with funds generated by the formation of the Friends of BGMC by Dennis Stuart. In short, our financial stability rests solidly on your shoulders.

4. We incorporated as a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization with a strong, enthusiastic, working Board of Directors. Our leadership has established the administrative direction that sets the Chorus on the right path toward inclusion as a strong member of the Buffalo arts and cultural communities.

5. The BGMC has set out to foster an inclusive, supportive and friendly organization that enhances the self-esteem of its membership. Most notably this attitude appears in our

rehearsals and at our frequent and exuberant potlucks and in our willingness to participate in community activities, which are important to the GLBT and arts communities.

6. Our newsletter and our website (www.BuffaloGayMensChorus.com) keep you informed of events and news, helps keep us connected as a singing group, and place us in front of the Buffalo community and beyond.

7. Barbara Wagner has done a great deal to integrate the BGMC into the larger musical and cultural communities through tireless networking with local artists, directors and members of the Buffalo choral community.

8. As a singing organization, we emerged out of a minority community and we encourage men from other minority communities to join us in our mission. We continue to actively seek to open the Chorus membership to a greater diversity. We did this last year by advertising in the local minority press, by word of mouth and by personal contact. We welcome any man who is capable of passing the minimum audition requirements to sing with us.

9. The BGMC has established a parallel non-singing group of volunteers on which the concert performances and fund raising activities rest. Buffalo Front Runners have generously given their time and effort to ushering our concerts. John Herbert and his team from Shea's track ticket sales and staffing the door at our concerts. Volunteers from GLYS have helped at the concerts and during receptions. Chorus members can focus on singing due to the support the Chorus has received from these other community organizations. Individual chorus members and a growing group of non-singing volunteers have shouldered the responsibility for receptions and concert setup.

10. We have met our first year's financial goal of raising approximately \$10,000 of unearned income and closed out the year at the end of June with over \$18,000 in the bank after our financial obligations were met. Approximately \$10,000 will be reserved for the trip to the Montreal GALA festival in 2004. The balance, bolstered by dues, will be used to

finance this year's operation; including Barbara's stipend, concert production, receptions, advertising, ticket sales, and venue rental—all things we need to bring to the Buffalo community the splendor and excitement of the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus.

Goals for 2002-2003

1. Expand the singing membership to 75 singers. In the interest of musical balance, we are especially looking for men with low voices to bolster the Bass II section. You can help by recruiting new members.

2. Open an office for the purpose of housing our ever-expanding music library and centralizing our communications.

3. In the interest of improving our singers' musicianship skills, Bill Fay has arranged music education classes in both sight-reading and vocal technique.

4. The Board has established standing committees (and designated chairs) to manage and supervise some administrative functions for the Chorus: Membership (John Herbert), PR and Marketing (Doug Levy), Development and Fund Raising (John Herbert), Production (Woody Sipprell), Communications (Roger Parris and Max Phillips). If you wish to participate in these activities, please see the committee chair.

5. We are planning for a Chorus overnight musical retreat.

6. We have established this newsletter for the purpose of informing chorus members and friends of our plans, needs, accomplishments, and successes.

7. Under the leadership of Dennis Stuart and Russ Link we are working to expand the Friends of Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus.

8. The board and supporters are actively working and writing grants to find a corporate sponsor and obtain greater financial support for our projects.

9. Expand the visibility of the Chorus and further integrate the BGMC into the arts and cultural communities of Buffalo and the surround-

ing area by attending workshops and cultural activities and by giving our support to other community events.

10. We are working to expand our audience from approximately 900 who attended last June's concerts to 1200 next January and to 1500 for the June

2003 concert.

11. Attract more non-singing volunteers who can support the BGMC when we put on concerts.

12. We are working to close the books at the end of our fiscal year with \$30,000 unobligated funds in the bank.

Based on our past accomplishments, we know that these modest goals are well within our capabilities. Reaching them will require each of you

to increase, by just a little bit, your level of participation over last year's effort by hustling an advertisement, selling 25 more tickets, recruiting a singer or a non-singing volunteer. We're well on our way—and we can't do it without you. Thanks for everything you've done in the past—now let's work together to build the BGMC's future!

Treasurer's Report

Our first year of existence was very successful financially as well as artistically. Thanks to loyal concertgoers, generous friends and supporters, committed singers, and a hard-working board, the Chorus made a profit from both concerts and set aside money as a foundation for our second year.

Since then expenses for the upcoming year have taken our cash balance down to around \$17,000. The Board has encumbered \$10,000 of that amount for the proposed GALA trip to Montreal in 2004. That trip is estimated to cost about \$35,000 so planning for it soon is important.

We anticipate some new expenses may arise in the near term, such as rental of office space. As the chorus grows, its budget will grow, reflect-

ing the dynamic and exciting organization that this is.

Finally, the current Treasurer and the Board wish to heartily thank Jeff Wilson who served

Generous support from the Friends of BGMC helps assure that more people are touched by the BGMC experience. The valued help of the Friends brings our community one step closer to an understanding and acceptance of diversity.

And what a diverse bunch the first group of Friends is! Not only does it

include some BGMC members, it also boasts lots of moms, dads, brothers, sisters, aunts, uncles, grandparents, neighbors and friends of choristers, too—and there are two banks that consider themselves Friends!

In our first season the Friends of BGMC raised approximately \$3,500. What does BGMC do with this money? Most importantly, BGMC has already put some money aside to represent the Western New York community at the GALA Festival in Montreal in July 2004. And it costs money to keep you informed of BGMC activities—this newsletter, for example, must be printed and mailed. We will be renting office space, buying a computer, and

recording our concerts—it's a very long list.

Yes, we want you to join the Friends group... you knew we'd ask, didn't you? All contributors of \$25 or more will have their names printed in both the January and June concert programs. Please clip the coupon on the back page, make your check payable to Friends of BGMC and mail it to Friends of BGMC, P.O. Box 448, Buffalo, NY 14207. Chorus members can simply give their checks to a Board member or to Dennis Stuart at any rehearsal. We need you in the Friends of The Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus!

Whether You Sing or Not, You Can be a Member of the BGMC

You don't have to sing to be a member of the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus — and you don't have to self-identify as gay or a man, either! As our Mission Statement says, "Singing membership is open to all men who pass a simple audition, pay modest dues and attend rehearsals regularly. Non-singers are also welcome, as there are many areas in which their talents are needed."

Men who pass an audition and sing in the BGMC are assessed \$50 dues per semester, and are considered "Singing Members" of the organization. Men and women who do not sing, but who wish

to have voting privileges as well as serve on committees and receive BGMC communications can join the organization as "Non-Singing Members" for \$50 per fiscal year (July-June). Singing members who may have to drop out of the Chorus will be automatically re-classified as non-singing members until the end of the fiscal year.

Please contact the Membership Committee, the Music Director or any member of the board to discuss joining the BGMC. Tell your friends about us—you'll be glad you did!

BGMC Singers Perform with Dance Company

Five men of the BGMC sang the National Anthem to open the performance of Puccini's *Sport* at the Nichols School's Glenn and Awdry Flickinger Performing Arts Center last July.

Presented as Pick of the Crop Dance's "New Moves 2002", Puccini's *Sport* featured six principal dancers and special guests The Buffalo Jills. Choreographer and former jock Peter Pucci drew all the exuberant dance movements in this full-length, "nine-inning" composition from the world of sports, from basketball to badminton and soccer to surfing.

BGMC Representatives Attend Arts Council Luncheon

On Thursday, August 15th, BGMC President Jim Estep and board member Max Phillips attended a luncheon sponsored by the Arts Council in Buffalo & Erie County, held at the Castellani Art Museum at Niagara University.

Keynote speaker Congresswoman Louise M. Slaughter (D-NY) spoke about her election campaign in New York's 28th Congressional District. Her discussion focused on issues surrounding the local and national arts communities. She believes that the promotion of arts and humanities can be critical in the revitalization of areas like Western New York that suffer from slow economic growth. Congresswoman Slaughter currently co-chairs the Congressional Arts Caucus, a bipartisan organization that supports the arts at a Federal level. The caucus's main focus is to secure annual funding for the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) and the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH).

The BGMC is a member of the Arts Council in Buffalo & Erie County.
