





A Winter's Night

by John Marohn

"In the bleak mid winter," the poet tells us, "frosty wind made moan." For those who have grown up in Buffalo and Western New York, window scrapers, snow plows, anti-freeze, insulated doors, down jackets, ear muffs, and gloves have become a way of life. We may pride ourselves on having "three and a half seasons," but it is the "Buffalo winter" that has given the city its notoriety. Ice storms, blizzards, twenty five mile-an-hour winds, lake effects, school closings, the morning traffic reports have all become part of the litany of language that seems to define us more readily than the somber orange and red colors of fall or the glistening green-filled summer days in Delaware Park.

All of us here tonight undoubtedly "may have miles to go before" we "sleep" in our daily routines of graduate school, two minimum wage parttime jobs, taking care of an invalid mother, fretting about a new babysitter we've hired, mending fences with a former lover, or worrying about how we're going to pay next month's rent. But tonight, we ask you to join with us in taking time out from the cares of our "bleak mid-winter" crises to enjoy the serenity of song, a quiet interlude between what we've left to come here and the still remaining fears of what we have to face when we walk outside these doors. It is inside this room tonight that the cold of what's outside and all the "troubles" we've "seen" can come to a gentle stop, a brief hiatus in our lives as we let the music and songs wash over us for one brief shining moment when those troubles can be quieted, can be put on hold.

And what better excuse can we find to warm up to the world, to caress the ones we love, to "hold" them in our arms to avoid the "cold wind" that "blows." In our isolated winter selves and those sometimes interior lives we are often forced to live because it's too "darn" cold to go outside, maybe, just maybe we can stop worrying about the "birds" that flew south, the "fruit" that "dropped," the "leaf" that fell from the tree, or the "brown earth" we can't see for four months. Perhaps we can just catch a "glimpse" of "ourselves" as the two lovers in the Whitman poem, "amid the noises of coming and going," just being "happy in being together, speaking little, perhaps not a word."



About the Artists

The Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus (BGMC) performs a rich catalog of classical, contemporary, Broadway, pop and multi-cultural music. The repertoire is as diverse as the 90 men who are singing with pride as members of the BGMC. A balance of educating, entertaining and enlightening allows us to maintain our integrity as a gay chorus while providing inclusion and appreciation by all members of our respective communities. The BGMC has been honored by the Empire State Pride Agenda with a Community Service Award. This award was in recognition of efforts to raise awareness and to enlighten our region through song. To that end, the BGMC has performed in a variety of venues throughout Western New York and Ontario for many community events. Additionally, the BGMC has traveled to Montreal to participate in the seventh annual GALA Festival, an international gathering of gay and lesbian choruses. While maintaining a strong presence within the gay community, The BGMC also has been privileged to perform with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra at Kleinhans Music Hall and has done benefits for the Amherst Unitarian Universalist Church music program; Blessed Trinity Roman Catholic Church's restoration; the annual World AIDS Day Memorial Service; and, the AIDS Community Services fundraiser Cause for Celebration. Additionally, BGMC performed for the arrival of The Amistad; participated in "Gusto at the Gallery" at the Albright-Knox Art Gallery; sang at the Ars Nova Musicians "Viva Vivaldi"Concert; sang at Fredonia College for their diversity and multicultural groups; and, at the Nichols School for Diversity Week. Of course, our four major concerts annually bring our work to thousands of avid listeners. Incorporated in 2001, The BGMC is a membership association dedicated to producing high quality vocal music in the rich tradition of men's choral singing. Through song, the Chorus endeavors to entertain and enlighten, create harmony and celebrate personal and community pride.

Barbara Wagner (Artistic Director) has served as Minister of Music at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo for 42 years. She was the director of choral activities at the Nichols School for more than 24 years and served the congregation of Temple Beth Am as its Music Director for 12 years. She was in charge of vocal activities at the Buffalo Seminary and conducts the Unitarian Universalist Church Choir as well as the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus. In addition to its Sunday morning responsibilities, the UU Church Choir has made two highly acclaimed European tours, the first to Germany, Austria and the Czech Republic and the second to Ireland, Wales, England and Scotland. The UU Church Choir, under the direction of Ms. Wagner, has recorded for American Public Radio, performed locally with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, Amherst Saxophone Quartet and the Ars Nova Chamber Orchestra.


Ms. Wagner was the conductor for the Peace Odyssey Tour of Hungary and the former Soviet Union. Choral singers from all over the USA participated in this tour. She was a member of the prestigious seven member Hymnbook Resources Commission that was responsible for the denominational hymnbook Singing the Living Tradition, published in 1993. She was chair of the New Hymns Task Force, which produced, Singing the Journey, another denominational songbook, published in June, 2005. She ran a choral program at Nichols High School that involved over 100 young singers including a concert chorus, women's ensemble, men's ensemble and a mixed chamber group. She was also guest conductor for the City of Good Neighbors Chorale.

Ms. Wagner earned a BFA degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo, where she studied Organ with Squire Haskin, and has done graduate work at Westminister Choir College. She did advanced Organ study with Karl Richter at Munich Conservatory and has done advanced conducting study with Raymond Harvey, the form Assistant Conductor of the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra and presently the Music Director of the Kalamazoo Symphony. She is a member of The American Choral Director's Association. Erie County Music Educators Association, MENC, Unitarian Universalist Musician's Network (founding member, former vice president and board member), NYSSMA, American Guild of Organists (sub dean of the Buffalo Chapter) and Chromatic Club. She was presented with the Erie County Music Educator/Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra award for excellence in choral education in May of 2002. Ms. Wagner is included in the 2004 edition of Who's Who in American Women, and will be included in the 2006 edition of Who's Who in America. She is the charter Artistic Director of the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus.

A native of North Carolina, **Debi Overton** (**Accompanist**) is the Organist and Choirmaster at Calvary Episcopal Church in Williamsville. Ms. Overton has held positions as coach/accompanist at the University of Texas at Austin and served as Director of the Chamber Music Program at the New School of Music in Philadelphia. From 1979 to 1986, she was active in the summer music festival in Aspen, Colorado as the coach/accompanist for the choral department. In this capacity she served as assistant to noted conductor Fiora Contino. She has assisted in preparing choruses and soloists for such conductors as Tamara Brooks, John Nelson, Robert Shaw, Sergei Commissiona and has herself coached with coach/accompanists David Garvey, John Wustman, Brooks Smith and Dalton Baldwin.

In addition to her duties at Calvary Church, Ms. Overton serves as Chair of the Music Commission of the Western New York Episcopal Diocese and is active in this area teaching, accompanying and performing with singers and instrumentalists.



Lyric Soprano, Jennifer Grace Mernitz appeared as a guest artist in the BGMC's first concert in February 2002. She has gladly appeared with them as a guest artist on a number of occasions since that time. She is a graduate of Baldwin-Wallace College Conservatory of Music, with a Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance, and holds a Master of Music in Vocal Performance from Boston University's School of Fine Arts. As soprano soloist and section leader for the Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo Choir, Ms. Grace Mernitz has participated in many acclaimed local performances and has toured with the choir to Germany, Austria, the Czech Republic, Ireland, Wales, England and Scotland. She has appeared as a concert soloist with the Ars Nova Chamber Orchestra and made her opera debut in the Greater Buffalo Opera Company's production of Mozart's *The Magic Flute*. She received her New York State Teaching Certificate from the State University of New York at Buffalo in June 2003. She currently teaches Vocal/General Music in the Clarence Central School District.

Cantor David M. Goldstein has served Temple Beth Zion as Music Director since 1992. He holds three master degrees in music and theater from the University of New Orleans and Tulane University. He holds a fourth master degree from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion School of Sacred Music where he was invested as cantor in 1987.

He has performed as solo artist with the New Orleans Opera Guild, Gulf Coast Opera, Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, Amherst Symphony and the Greater Buffalo Opera among others. Critics have said of him that his singing is "wonderfully communicative;" he "sings with great care;" his "singing is refreshingly lyrical;" and that he was "mesmerizing." He has been a featured performer at Merkin Hall and Town Hall in New York City and in many prestigious concert venues in the United States, Canada and Israel. Mr Goldstein is a featured cantor on a five CD set, documenting music of the Holy Days, entitled Yamim Noraim published by Transcontinental Music. He was the first cantor to be presented as the featured soloist at the "Interfaith concert" at the Chautauqua Festival in the main amphitheater. Cantor Goldstein released a CD B'chol Libeinu – With All Our Heart in 2003.

In addition to vocal performing, Cantor Goldstein has been invited to teach and give master classes at the University of New Orleans, Tulane University, Mercer University, Georgia State University, and the State University of New York at Buffalo. He is a member of the Amherst Symphony Orchestra playing violin. Cantor Goldstein has arranged pieces performed by the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra and the Amherst Symphony Orchestra.

Mr Goldstein has been active in the American Conference of Cantors, serving as President, Vice-President, Secretary, and as chair of many committees. He continued on page 18

served on the boards of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, ARZA/World Union NA and the local chapter of the American Jewish Committee. Presently he is an ex-officio member of the Board of the American Conference of Cantors where he serves on the Endowment Fund Committee, and is the Chair of the ACC Pension and Insurance Board. He devotes time and energy to the Executive Board of Buffalo Suzuki Strings. Cantor Goldstein serves as chaplain for the Amherst Police Department.

He lives in Williamsville with his wife Lauri, daughter Rachel, and son Max.

The Clara String Quartet was formed in 2002 by four Buffalo Philharmonic musicians and friends — Amy Glidden and Jacqueline Galluzzo, violins, Kate Holzemer, viola, and Amelie Fradette, cello. The Clara Quartet has a strong commitment to sharing the string quartet repertoire with audiences throughout Western New York, as well as collaborating with friends in other chamber works. Named after famed pianist and composer Clara Schumann, the quartet has appeared as soloists with the Buffalo Philharmonic and performed at many venues throughout Buffalo.

Though she did not always know it, Laura Wilder (program cover) has always had an artistic style similar to those of the early 20th Century. Laura followed a fairly traditional course of study in college, but felt disconnected from the contemporary art that her college emphasized. She looked instead to the masters of the early 20th century and before for her inspiration. After college, and searching for her style, Laura worked as an illustration and graphic artist for several years.

When she was first exposed to the work of the masters of the Arts and Crafts movement, she was both stunned and exhilarated. This style fit her perfectly, and a style she had been personally developing. Dissatisfied with commercial art, Laura decided to make her way independently, cultivating her own style reminiscent of the Arts and Crafts movement. She decided to do a series of block prints depicting "Artisans at Work," feeding her passion for portraiture. She met a Roycroft potter, Master Artisan Janice McDuffie, and asked her to model for a block print she named "The Potter." When McDuffie saw her completed work, she urged Laura to apply to Roycroft for membership. Not only was Laura accepted, but she was honored with the title "Master Artisan" just two years later. You will see the Roycroft Renaissance mark on Laura's work.

Program Notes for A Winter's Tale Jason Ward & Barbara Wagner

When I think about the voices of the men of the BGMC, colors and textures come to mind. We work diligently at every rehearsal to find the sound and the balance that is perfect for each song. The early numbers in the first half of this concert demand a lovely warm, velvety sound that will be flexible enough to provide the exciting fullness we need for The Snow and Sim Shalom. The colors and textures of the voices must reflect the meaning of the words. We owe that to you, our discerning audience and to ourselves as intelligent, skilled singers. How does that happen? Rarely is it luck. Often it's as simple as saying a word like "lace" or "weep" or "snow," or working for 20 minutes on a light "head voice" in warm-ups. I can't count how many times I've said, "remember how that feels when you sing Velvet Shoes," "drop your jaw," "raise your eyebrows," "put an 'H' before the vowel, so you'll come in on the air," "Shoulders down, chests up," "Sing 'aw, not ah,' we sound like Western New Yorkers." The vowels must be uniform. It's never easy, but worth every minute we spend striving for the very best. When we begin the second half, you'll hear a very different sound in some of the songs. We don't sing Sleigh Ride the same way we sing In the Bleak Midwinter. You'll hear a bright sauciness in the sounds. This too doesn't just happen. We work as hard to achieve that as we do to honor what we believe Elgar and Mozart wanted. So sit back and let the gorgeous warm sounds of these mens' voices flow into your hearts and souls.

"Shivering, frozen mid the frosty snow in biting, stinging winds: running to and fro to stamp one's icy feet, teeth chattering in the bitter chill. To rest contentedly beside the hearth, while those outside are drenched by pouring rain. We tread the icy path slowly and cautiously, for fear of tripping and falling......this is winter, which nonetheless brings its own delights." The poet, Elinor Wylie invites us to "walk in the white snow in a soundless space — at a tranquil pace." Laura Wilder's serene woodblock print, reproduced on the program cover, urges us to listen for the "sweep of easy wind and downy flake" and the "voices of the angels" sounding over the moonlit land. It is midwinter and we rejoice that Johannes Chrysostomus Wolfgang Gottlieb Mozart came into this world to bless us with his music on January 27, 250 years ago. His music speaks of "secrets of the heart that both humankind and the artist well understood." And so, we hear the tinkle of sleigh bells, complain about the bitter cold, curl up beside a blazing fire, bask in the warmth and love of our families and friends and pray for peace for all people.

We open our fifth anniversary concert with the gentle carol, In the Bleak Midwinter, by Gustav Holst, set to Christina Rosetti's elegant poem, followed


by Randall Thompson's peaceful setting of Elinor Wylie's **Velvet Shoes**. The elegance of the marriage of music and poetry in both pieces is evident immediately. We follow this dreamy processional with Randall Thompson once more – this time his ageless setting of Robert Frost's **Stopping By Woods on a Snowy Evening**. For many years, I've known of **The Snow** by the 19th century Romantic composer, Edward Elgar, of **Enigma Variations** fame. **The Snow** was originally set for Womens' Chorus, later Mixed Chorus, and now, to my great delight, it's been revoiced by Stan Hill, Artistic Director of the Twin Cities Gay Men's Chorus for male voices. The text and music are a wonderful combination of old fashioned, unabashed, in your face, romanticism. Close your eyes and let this marvelous song, accompanied by two violins and piano cover you like Wylie's "white lace."


Next we turn to the wonderful old Austrian Carol Still, Still. This tender song about the birth of a child needs no introduction. A Glimpse is the third of the Adamic Songs that were composed for the BGMC by Roland Martin almost two years ago. Set to poetry by Walt Whitman, this song tells of a crowd of workmen and drivers in a bar room, sitting around a stove, while two lovers sit contentedly in a corner, holding hands, "happy at being together, speaking little, perhaps not a word."

The beautiful **Sim Shalom**, (Grant us Peace), is by the late Chicago based composer Max Janowski, whose settings of many of the ancient Jewish prayers are beloved in Reform Congregations everywhere. We are grateful to Cantor David Goldstein for revoicing this wonderful prayer for the BGMC and most importantly for singing it with us on Saturday evening.

Mozart composed **Eine kleine Freimaurer**, (A Little Masonic Cantata) in 1791 to celebrate his Masonic Lodge's brand new facility, dedicated to the ideals of brotherhood. He completed the work on November 15, conducting the first performance three days later. It was to be the last work he composed. Mozart died just 2 weeks later. As with his other compositions for Masonic ritual, he writes a fairly straightforward part for Men's Chorus. Many of his melodic phrases contain a frequent Masonic symbol; two notes, usually eighths, slurred together as a suggestion of the bond or "tie" between 2 friends. Listen for those in the tenor/bass choral duet. In tonight's performance, you will hear the opening chorus, a tenor/bass recitative, a duet for tenors and basses and a final chorus. There is some unsubstantiated talk among musicologists that Mozart may have composed this piece as a way of apologizing to his brother Masons for giving away so many Masonic secrets in **The Magic Flute**. Who knows?

The second half of our concert opens with Leroy Anderson's **Sleigh Ride** which, ironically, was composed in 1948 during a July heat wave while continued on page 26



Baby, Its Cold Outside was written by Frank Loesser for the 1949 movie Neptune's Daughter. Sung twice in the film, first by Esther Williams and Ricardo Montalban then by Eve Garrett and Red Skelton, it went on to win Loesser an Academy Award in 1950 for Best Song. It's our pleasure to bring our spin on these winter classics to you. Too Darn Hot is one of the best known songs from Cole Porter's musical, Kiss Me, Kate. Porter experienced a terrible accident in 1937 which left him in continuous pain. Following the accident he continued to write songs and musicals but with limited success, and some thought he was past his prime. Kiss Me, Kate was in fact his biggest hit, receiving five Tony awards in 1949 (and again in its revival in 2000), and is the only Cole Porter musical to have more than 1,000 performances on Broadway.

Winter Song, from the Celtic Folk Tradition was arranged by one of our fine GALA composers Jeffrey Jones-Ragona. In this gentle winter song, accompanied by the harp and piano, we sing of winter snows, the autumn wind, the sea running high and the mournful cry of the wild geese. The incomparable Robert Seeley, another GALA composer brings us If and When, a song of love and passion that says that even when the wind blows and winter bears down on us, "I will hold you close and never let you go." Listen as the music gives every word life. Hymn to the Night is an atmospheric piece about night and its silence and solitude. Listen for the wind chimes, the strings of the piano being strummed from the inside and the whispers of the chorus. Sssshhhh!!! There are secrets!! We're very excited about The Angels Sing for many reasons, the first and foremost being that it was composed by another brilliant GALA composer, Eric Lane Barnes who also arranged it for the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus. As the voices of the angels hover around us, they sing of peace on earth for all. No one or no thing is excluded. What a lovely thought.

I'll Cover You, Without You, and Seasons of Love come from Jonathan Larson's rock opera Rent, which is a retelling of the "La Boheme" story, but based in AIDS-era East Village, New York City. The theme of love striving to endure beyond all obstacles remains central to the story. I'll Cover You tells of two men declaring their new found love for one another. Without You shows the pain felt at the end of a relationship, and that no matter what may happen, life will still go on. Seasons of Love answers the question of how the life of a man or woman can be measured. It can be measured in love. Larson died unexpectedly four months before Rent premiered on Broadway. His passing is a sobering reminder to make the most of the time we have, and to celebrate all the love we have in our lives.
