




### A Little About the Library

Named for Edward H. Butler, Sr., Butler Library occupies the center of campus at Buffalo State University. In addition to supporting the University's academic mission, the building hosts events, art displays, and provides services for the campus and Buffalo community.

Edward H. Butler, Sr. recognized the importance of library resources to education. His bequest to the school enhanced its reference and art collections, and when the first separate library building was completed in 1952 it was named the Edward H. Butler Library. On April 14, 1970, his granddaughter presided at the dedication of the present structure, which was built over and around the first building.

This contemporary, 216,000-square-foot building holds over 500,000 volumes and welcomes nearly 300,000 visitors per year. The building features modern spaces including computer labs, study spaces, exhibition space for art and rare books, lounges, reading and meeting rooms, and a coffee shop.

## Improving the Heart of the Campus

Butler Library has undergone several major renovation projects in the last five years. These have made the building more welcoming to patrons, responsive to the academic mission, and improved our ability to preserve and display our collections.

In 2018, we began a radical transformation of the first floor, creating an Academic Commons to host student services such as Education Opportunity Program, IT Helpdesk, and the Writing and Math Centers.

Between 2022 and 2023, the library's windows were replaced with modern, energy-efficient glass. In 2023 the library's heating, ventiliation, and air conditioning systems were updated, necessitating the moving of nearly 200,000 books.


Additional improvements include the creating of a graphic novels space on the third floor and the updating of the Butler Room into a teleconferencing space that can host hybrid meetings.




















### Collections



### Our Evolving Collections

Butler Library holds over 550,000 physical items and over 648,000 eBooks. Patrons can access content from over 99,000 electronic journals and enjoy access to nearly 100,000 music tracks and videos.


The library circulates over 4,000 physical items per year. While this number is trending downward, that trend is largely explained by recent enrollment decreases and the gradual shift toward eBooks in many disciplines.

Usage of electronic resources continues to grow. Library patrons averaged over 43,000 ebook uses per year over the past four years. With regard to journals, over 115,000 unique electronic articles were accessed by Butler Library patrons in 2023.

#### **Adoption of SUNY resource sharing**



Interlibrary loan and resource sharing are increasingly important as they expand access to SUNY library collections.

2023 saw nearly 5,000 total transactions, with Buffalo State faculty and students borrowing nearly 1,400 items from partner libraries. 2023 also saw the start of electronic article resource sharing which allows rapid sharing of scholarly journal content between SUNY libraries.

### Archives & Special Collections

### **Archives**

The Archives & Special Collection Department at Buffalo State was established in 1975 and houses a growing and vibrant collection of primary and secondary source materials available to faculty, students, and the public. Our collections include various student publications, scrapbooks, speeches, memorabilia, photographs, annual reports, budgets, and statistics starting in 1860 and stretching to the present. In addition, we hold scores of unique collections of local importance, regional interest, and national significance.

### Digital Commons

Digital Commons @ Buffalo State is the open access campus repository for scholarly and creative works produced by faculty, staff, and students. Managed by Butler Library, Digital Commons promotes the discovery, dissemination, and preservation of our intellectual capital.


Usage of Digital Commons continues to increase, with both students and faculty choosing to preserve their academic outputs on the platform. Works deposited in Digital Commons are used all over the world and in 2024 we will surpass the two-million downloads milestone.

### Journals

### Archives & Special Collections

### Distinctive Collections

The Courier-Express Photograph Collection contains more than one million subject clippings, over one hundred thousand photographs, and several pieces of art and framed photographs. The collection includes the original photographs taken by

Courier-Express photographers during the course of their work.

### The Monroe Fordham Regional History

**Center**, established by former President Muriel Howard, continues the archival collection work begun more than thirty years ago by Dr. Monroe Fordham. Focusing on regional African-American history, the collection includes newspapers, photographs, personal papers, organizational records, and more.

The Madeline Davis LGBTQ Archive of Western New York was founded in 2001 to collect, safeguard, and provide access to archival materials that document the gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender experience in Western New York and Southern Ontario. The largest collection of its kind in the area, the archive houses the records of more than fifty organizations and the collections of numerous prominent figures from the region's LGBTQ+ community.






# Open Access & Open Educational Resources (OER) Initiatives

### Cambridge Journals Transformative Agreement


Butler Library is pleased to announce it has reached a three-year deal with Cambridge University Press to waive all article-processing charges (APCs) from Cambridge University Press journals for Buffalo State University faculty authors.

In addition to waiving APC costs for the duration of the new contract, Cambridge has granted Butler Library patrons access to an additional 397 Cambridge journals. This is a three-year transformative deal.

### In-Person and Online Library Help

Butler Library provides excellent research assistance to students, faculty, and local community members. At our full-service **Ask Us Desk**, credentialed faculty librarians provide research support and trained students provide peer-to-peer concierge services to Library and Academic Commons patrons. In the 2023-2024 academic year, we helped answer **3,788 reference questions**.

### Library Courses & Workshops

### Our Growing Library Course Catalog

LIB100: Introduction to Library Research (1 credit): teaches students how to effectively use the library and provides them with the fundamental information literacy skills they need to succeed at Buffalo State and beyond. We are now offering this course every semester.


**LIB300: Advanced Library Research Methods** (3 credits): students learn how to conduct higher-level academic research and gain indepth knowledge about finding relevant, scholalry sources to support their studies. Offered in the fall.

LIB389: Social Justice Through Zines (3 credits): examines social justice movements through the lens of zines (self-published, DIY works). Students study zines in the library collection and also create their own zines. Reflects on current and historical social justice movements to consider how to best support the information needs of those advocating for social justice. Topics course offered occasionally.



### Library Information Literacy Workshops

Butler Library offers information literacy workshops hosted primarily in our active learning classroom. These workshops help improve student research skils and increase the integration of library resources into the curriculum.
