

House is located two blocks from Delaware Park , which was designed by Olmsted and is listed on the National Register, and southeast of the Zoo. 18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): Two-story hip roofed structure has fluted ionic pilaster corner boards. Porch supported on doric columns has serpentine shaped roof with fan arch decoration. Colonial Revival doorway with sidelights. Oriel on south wall has large turned finial above its roof.

	ver in str to man had str of nea sub str 21.	HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: Simplified Colonial Revival chacular building typical of the turn-of-the-century buildings the Parkside area. Crescent Avenue is the longest curvilinear reet in the Parkside subdivision, stretching from Humboldt Avenue Colvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's early 1870's of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue been modified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of the reet were deeded to the city by five different owners over a span five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending in 1892 ar Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends within the Parkside odivision, following Olmsted's rule that a suburban neighborhood reet "not lead with special directness toward the town."
