President's Column

Here's a behind-the-scenes look at what keeps the Chorus running.

We now have an office located in the Unitarian Church. It's a small space but one that is well suited to our present needs, convenient to our rehearsal space and to Barb's office. We have a phone: (716) 883-1277. Please be patient while we install an answering system. Having an office is an important step in establishing our stability. It says we are an active and lasting part of the Buffalo cultural scene. We're coming of age.

The Board of Directors recently established an Ad Hoc Committee. Chaired by Rob Donner, it worked hard all summer in the areas of communications, concert organization,

dues, rehearsal attendance, publicity and public relations, audience research, and program development. You'll be hearing more about these subjects as the Board puts the committee's recommendations into action.

The Chorus has had a busy summer. We sang for the annual Pride Celebration in June, opened Buddies Fest again this year as a fundraiser for AIDS Community Services, and made a guest appearance at the Elmwood Festival of the Arts in August where Russ Link raised over \$700.00 for the Chorus at his successful book sale. We sang during the visit of the Amistad on September 13. These special appearances are important because they bring us before potential new audiences and build goodwill with other not-for-profit arts organizations.

We will represent Buffalo at GALA Choruses Seventh International Festival in July 2004. In preparation for this event, the Chorus has commissioned Ron Martin to write a signature piece for the Chorus to perform in Montreal, the site of what promises to be one of the largest performing arts festivals in history. Chorus members need to send in their non-refundable deposit of \$100.00 no later than September 28.

The Board meets regularly on the third Monday of the month at the Unitarian Universalist Church. Board meetings are open to all BGMC members. The annual Chorus retreat is in preparation, tentatively scheduled for later this Fall.

I extend my personal thanks to all the men who worked so hard for the Chorus this past summer and to our Music Director, Barb Wagner, for her inspiring leadership.

Treasurer's Report

Our financial success continues, thanks to the love and support of so many people and organizations. From my vantage as treasurer, I can see how complex and how expensive an organization such as this chorus is! But I also see how valuable our web of friendships and supporters is. This should make us all glow with pride and gratitude.

The figures to the right show several interesting things. First, our sources of income have diversified with the addition of \$4550 in grants from organizations and businesses. Special thanks goes to Jim Estep and Doug Levy for writing the grant that garnered us \$2000 from the Arts Council in Buffalo and Erie County.

Second, though ticket sales rose a

modest amount, our expenses rose much faster, due in part to our more ambitious concert programs. Consequently, our net income for this year was a respectable but relatively modest \$5419. Since we are going to GALA in Montreal next year, our fundraising activities will have to intensity in order to cover the approximately \$35,000 cost. Currently, we have \$10,000 set aside from our first year of existence, specifically earmarked for Montreal.

I am confident that the energy and spirit of the chorus men, the wonderfully gentle but firm baton of Barbara, the wisdom of the board, and the help of all volunteers and friends will propel us into our most successful and exciting year yet.
