





#### Themes of Liberation

Although our spring musical program for 2006 is ostensibly focused on entertainment, light fun, and Americana, it is no coincidence that the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus has chosen songs which speak seriously of liberation -- not only of gay and lesbian people, but also the liberation of Africans and African-Americans, and liberation from the restrictive historical trappings of certain music itself.

Typical of our concerts, songs such as "You Can Fly," "Come Away With Me," and "No Matter What" espouse liberation in broad terms which we can internalize as gay men. The lyrics of these songs imagine a place where we can kiss on the mountain top, awake safe in the arms of another, believe what we choose, be who we are, spread our wings and fly among the stars.

Other songs in the program connect our personal liberation to the fate and destiny of others. The rich strains of the anthem "Nkosi Sikelel' iAfrika" (1897) shake the bonds of European colonialism by evoking African emancipation and self-determination. The arrangement we are using in performance was edited for diction by Naomi Tutu, daughter of Bishop Desmond Tutu, and commissioned for publication by the Dallas Turtle Creek Chorale, one of the world's largest gay men's choruses.

The musical genius of Moses Hogan provides an equally liberating conceit for the concert -- that there is "Plenty Good Room" for all "in my Father's kingdom." This African-American spiritual is augmented by Hogan's trademark knack for syncopation and creative harmonic progressions.

A couple of pieces in the program have been subject to controversy. The minstrel songs, "Ching-a-Ring-Chaw," (circa 1825) and "O Susannah!" (1847) were originally written for performance by white men in blackened faces, and likely were intended to elicit laughter by ridiculing black slaves. This form of "entertainment" marks one of the darkest periods in American music. How can these songs possibly be liberated from such awful origins?

This was the question that gay American composer Aaron Copland no doubt asked himself. In the 1950's, he set out to transform and recover the musical spirit of "Ching-a-Ring-Chaw" by replacing the original text with a more universal and idealistic context: "I did not want to take any chance of it being construed as racist." The original text was about the African-American immigration to Haiti. To the amazement and perhaps horror of American slave owners, Haiti had become an independent nation of black citizens in 1804, unsuccessfully contested in its declaration of independence. Some U.S. slaves no doubt escaped to the Caribbean island. We can speculate that the "chings" and "rings" are imitative of the sound of chains and ankle irons of

moving slaves. But over time, and with the help of Copland, these associations have faded, and the piece has become a standard classic in American repertory.

"O Susannah!" by Stephen Foster is also an established piece, learned for many years by school children. But unlike Copland's work, its lyrics seem not to have been altered since the first performance in 1847. The lyrics, "The sun so hot, I froze to death," deprecate the first person narrator for his impaired logic, a racist characteristic of most minstrels when the narrator is perceived as black. But when sung in other contexts (by a racially mixed chorus without blackface), the effect is hardly the same. Prominent African-American scholar and author, Amari Baraka, (formerly LeRoi Jones), demonstrates in his now classic analysis of the history of African-American music, Blues People (1963), that minstrel shows can equally satirize the white performer underneath the blackface. Composer Stephen Foster apparently soon abandoned writing for minstrel shows and by 1864 he wrote "Beautiful Dreamer" which exudes beauty in each languorous phrase.

A peculiar bit of irony is that the song "Today" (1964) was a signature piece for the New Christy Minstrels, a modern popular choral group named after the original Christy Minstrels which was the longest-running minstrel group in the 1800's. Perhaps the name was adopted in the 1960's as an omen for success. But renaming, redefining, and transforming are a part of the liberating process of musical history.

Borrowing, trading, and altering are hallmarks of some of the best art. Both oral folk tradition and composed music model such creative transformations. In "Lambscapes" a familiar nursery tune is liberated from its juvenile context and humorously metamorphosed into seven musical conventions or styles. Like Copland, at risk of having his intentions misunderstood, Gershwin studied African-American music to compose Porgy and Bess, and applies the same syncopation and blues harmony to "I Got Rhythm" in the exciting arrangement, "Rhythm Medley." The jazzy handling of "I've Been Workin' On the Railroad" gives a new funky street-corner style rendition to a well-worn tune. "Let Us Entertain You" was originally written for burlesque strippers in the Broadway show Gypsy, but BGMC has turned the song into a show opener to welcome the audience into our music and into our lives as gay men. We have even taking the liberty of borrowing "Home on the Range" as a salute to Jack and Ennis of Brokeback Mountain.

Dr. Lawrence Van Heusen sings second bass in BGMC, and published his dissertation on James Baldwin and Black Religion in 1980. He is a trustee at Pilgrim-St. Luke's United Church of Christ and works for Jewish Family Service. He was a social worker on the East Side for ten years. #### About the Artists

The Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus (BGMC) performs a rich catalog of classical, contemporary, Broadway, pop and multi-cultural music. The repertoire is as diverse as the 75 men who are singing with pride as members of the BGMC. A balance of educating, entertaining and enlightening allows us to maintain our integrity as a gay chorus while providing inclusion and appreciation by all members of our respective communities.

The BGMC has been honored by the Empire State Pride Agenda with a Community Service Award. This award was in recognition of efforts to raise awareness and to enlighten our region through song. To that end, the BGMC has performed in a variety of venues throughout Western New York and Ontario for many community events. Additionally, the BGMC has traveled to Montreal to participate in the seventh annual GALA Festival, an international gathering of gay and lesbian choruses. Recently the BGMC won the Artvoice Best of Buffalo 2006 Award for 'Best Vocalist.'

While maintaining a strong presence within the gay community, The BGMC also has been privileged to perform with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra at Kleinhans Music Hall. BGMC has done benefits for the Amherst Unitarian Universalist Church music program; Blessed Trinity Roman Catholic Church's restoration; the annual World AIDS Day Memorial Service; and, the AIDS Community Services fundraiser Cause for Celebration. Additionally, BGMC performed for the arrival of The Amistad; participated in "Gusto at the Gallery" at the Albright-Knox Art Gallery; sang at the Ars Nova Musicians "Viva Vivaldi" Concert; sang at Fredonia College for their diversity and multicultural groups; and, at the Nichols School for Diversity Week. Of course, our four major concerts annually bring our work to thousands of avid listeners.

Incorporated in 2001, The BGMC is a membership association dedicated to producing high quality vocal music in the rich tradition of men's choral singing. Through song, the Chorus endeavors to entertain and enlighten, create harmony and celebrate personal and community pride.

Barbara Wagner, the charter Artistic Director of the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus, has served as Minister of Music at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo since 1962 and was Director of Vocal Activities at Nichols School for more than 24 years.





recorded for American Public Radio, performed locally with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra (BPO), Amherst Saxophone Quartet and the Ars Nova Musicians. Ms Wagner was the conductor for the Peace Odyssey Concert Tour of Hungary and the former Soviet Union. Choral singers from all over the US participated in this tour.

She ran a choral program at Nichols High School that involved more than 100 young singers, including a Concert Chorus, Women's Ensemble, Men's Ensemble and a Mixed Chamber Group. She was also guest conductor for the City of Good Neighbors Chorale, Buffalo's Gay/Lesbian chorus in the mid 1980s.

Ms Wagner earned a BFA Degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo, where she studied organ with Squire Haskin, and completed graduate work at Westminster Choir College. Her advanced studies include organ study with Karl Richter at the Munich Conservatory and conducting with Raymond Harvey, formerly Assistant Conductor of the BPO and presently Music Director of the Kalamazoo Symphony.

She is a member of the American Choral Director's Association, the Erie County Music Educators Association, MENC, Unitarian Universalist Musicians Network (founding member, former Vice President and Board member) NYSSMA and the American Guild of Organists (sub-dean and program chair for the Buffalo Chapter), the Chromatic Club of Buffalo. She was Chair of the New Hymns Task Force of the Unitarian Universalist Association, which recently completed Singing the Journey, a brand new supplement to Singing the Living Tradition, the hymnbook for the denomination. Ms. Wagner also served on the Commission, which worked for 7 years compiling and researching that book, which went to press in 1993.

Ms Wagner is the recipient of the Buffalo Philharmonic/Erie County Music Educators Award for Excellence in Choral Music in 2002, and is included in the 2004 edition of Who's Who in American Women. She is slated to be included in the upcoming 25th anniversary edition of Who's Who in America. She and the chorus were featured in About magazine's June, 2006 edition.

A native of North Carolina, **Debi Overton (Accompanist,)** has held positions as coach/accompanist at the University of Texas at Austin, and served as director of the Chamber Music Program at The New School of Music in Philadelphia. For many years, she was active at the Summer Music Festival in Aspen, Colorado. As the coach/accompanist for the choral department in Aspen, she served as assistant to noted conductor Fiora

Ms Overton has accompanied Master classes for Luciano Pavarotti, Phyllis Curtin, Jessye Norman, Leontyne Price and Sylvia McNair. She has accompanied the regional Metropolitan Opera auditions in Greensboro, NC, Philadelphia, PA, Atlanta, GA and New York City. Considered by her peers to be one of the finest sight readers in the country, she offers nuances and subtle interpretations of music that have been enjoyed and applauded by thousands of listeners throughout the United States. Trained as a concert pianist, she has toured in Europe but prefers the roots, both spiritual and local, offered by a career as a church musician.

In addition to her duties as Organist and Choir Master at Calvary Episcopal Church in Williamsville, Ms Overton is a past chair of the Music Commission of the WNY Episcopal Diocese, has been a member of the Board of Directors for the American Guild of Organists and is active in Western New York teaching, accompanying and performing with singers and instrumentalists.
