THE PYSRA ACTION PLAN - 1987 REVIEW AND UPDATE

Introduction

In fulfilling its purpose to represent the public's need for nursing care services in New York State, the 1982 Board of Directors of The New York State Marses Association initiated a two-year Nursing Needs and Resources Assessment.

The assessment included review of trends, a membership questionnaire, review of existing relevant data and refinement of ideas in regular and special meetings of Association groups. A final report was made to the 1984 Voting Body.

In the ensuing years the Action Plan has been reviewed on a regular basis by the responsible organizational units. Progress reports have been prepared for the NYSNA Board of Directors annually.

This 1987 report of progress toward meeting the recommended actions and plans for future activities is consistent with the NYSNA Board of Directors wish to keep The New York State Nurses Association membership fully informed as to completed and planned activities.

Concerns related to the nursing shortage, including decomaing enrollments in schools of nursing and nurses leaving the nursing profession to pursue other careers, only highlight the imperative need to recommit ourselves to the underlying assumptions of the NYSNA Action Plan:

- . The people of New York State must have direct access to provision of nursing care services by highly qualified professional nurses.
- . Nursing must be a powerful influence in analyzing and planning health care services.

The nine action proposals remain vital in the pursuit of the Association goals and mission:

- . Expedite enactment of NYSNA's Entry Into Practice legislation.
- . Establish distinct scopes of practice for associate and professional nurses.
- . Strengthen statewide planning for nursing education to assure sufficient numbers of nursing personnel.
- . Assert control over nursing practice.
- . Undertake programs to consolidate and maintain nursing's position in its control of nursing practice.
- . Institute statewide planning mechanisms for nursing practice and services.
- . Promote the advancement of research in nursing.
- . Promote nursing as a professional service providing competent cost-effective client health care.
- . Strengthen bonds of association among nurses through participation in the professional organization.

Actions

- 1. Expedite enactment of NYSHA's

 Entry Into Practice legislation.
 - a. Develop a written plan for NYSNA members' use in influencing other nurses, consumers and legislators to support the bill. Include information about sources of support and opposition as well as forces and factors facilitating and impeding enactment of the proposal.
 - b. Implement the plan utilizing activities such as:
 - -coordinated constituency based lobbying efforts -networking with other organized nursing groups -networking with consumer groups -education efforts targeted
 - at nurses, parents, high school students, guidance counselers, colleges and university officials -target people for submission
 - of articles and other informational notices to lay press (e.g., relevant events such as meetings, speeches, elections)

Council os Certification was deleted from Bylews by the 1986 voting body. NYSNA will continue to critique ANA certification system and follow with recommendations.

A definition of "professional supervision" is being developed. Complete definition development. Work with State Education Department, Department of Health, Office on Aging and Department of Social Services nursing groups to improve standards.

CPUs are planning ways to raise nursing consciousness. Education about use of the Nurse Practice Act through convention programming and Journal will be undertaken. Use existing data and pertinent literature.

NYSNA has influenced code changes for Primary Care Mursing, discharge planning, personal care aides and documentation by psych-mental health nurses in progress notes and the operation of diagnostic and treatment centers.

NYSNA participated in a review of the revision to the Rospital Code (Section 405). Efforts continue to remove incomsistencies in the code and seek new privileges for nurses.

g. Promote accreditation of nursing education programs by an appropriate body of professional nurses.

- Undertake programs to consolidate and maintain nursing's position in its control of nursing practice.
 - s. Establish nursing as an independent competitor in the provision of health care services through alternate health care delivery;
 - Design organizational models and support the establishment of independent nursing services with special provisions for the underserved (e.g., community nursing centers).
 - c. Work for allocation of a greater percentage of health care dollars to health maintenance and illness prevention through nursing services:
 - -maintain public funding levels for nursing in all areas of current allocation
 - -shift allocations to independently controlled nursing services from non-nursing allocations

The Task Force on Entrepreneurship prepared meterials, conducted forums and a convention workshop and made follow-up recommendations.

Consider providing direct consultation to the nurse-entrepreneurs by a qualified person. Consider an issue of the Journal of the NYSNA to feature relevant articles.

A new ANA publication has been completed. Community Nursing Center legislation is a top priority of ANA and a top priority for NYSHA support.

ANA has been successful in influencing Congress on nursing and health care funding. MYSNA has actively supported ANA.

There is interest in moving school health from the State Education Dept. to the Department of Health. Continue to work closely with ANA. Work with CNP's in school districts and work with the clinical practice unit for School Health Nursing.

d. Promote legislative action to broaden reimbursement specifically for nursing services.

- e. Document nursing autonomy through such activities as court action and gaining recognition of nursing as a scholarly discipline, and increase consumer education of nursing.
- Promote the adoption of a professional model for nursing department autonomy and promote practice privileges for nurses.
- g. Promote nurses' direct accountability to clients through peer review, using validated outcome criteria based on ANA Standards of Nursing Practice where possible.
- h. Require current practice competency through:
 - -continuing education
 - -peer review systems
 - -constructive inter-employer communication

Nursing Practice and Services has worked energetically to assist nurses to obtain 3rd party reimbursement.

Progress is being made in obtaining Medicaid reimbursement. NYSNA legistative program contains relevant plank. Continue; and collect data regarding who is being reimbursed for what services.

1986 Convention voting body passed Resolution on Rights and Responsibilities of Nursing.

Plans have been made to increase visibility of research at 1987 Convention. Special issues of Journal on advanced practice and research are completed. Plans are under way to make the Journal a peer-reviewed publication.

NYSNA will continue to work for nursing acquisition of practice privileges.

Nursing staff bylaws and a selfgovernance model have been updated. Peer review materials are currently being developed. Magnet hospital study will be used

as a resource.

Nursing Practice & Services has an employment reference pack available. A position statement on c.e. was adopted by the 1985 voting body. Every Nursing Practice and Services Program unit is contributing to the peer review discussion. A special volunteer subgroup is responsible.

The ANA peer review guidelines draft is currently being critiqued. Development of outcome criteria will be undertaken for independent practitioners.

NYSNA member has been appointed to the Committee on Professional Assistance of the State Education Department. A peer assistance brochure was developed for wide distribution. Diversion legislation was supported. District Nurses Association networking is ongoing. The Council on Nursing Practice collaborated with the Task Force on a Position Statement on Drug Testing of Nursing Practitioners. The Task Force is cooperating with the Foundation of the NYSNA on a Peer Assistance Resource Proposal for Hurses' House.

A document addressing nurses' role in accepting, protesting or rejecting assignments is being developed.

A resource directory of nurses in private practice is being prepared and will be available January 1988. Forms requesting members to send Report notice of newsworthy activities are generating a steady response. Information is being used in internal publications; coverage in external media is planned.

 - a. Review, correlate and disseminate information about health problems, health needs, and distribution of nursing services. Update this info@ation annually.
 - Establish priorities for nursing in relation to the need-distribution analysis. Update this annually.

Two booklets related to Occupational Hazards in the Workplace and a sound/slide production were completed. ANA statement on alcohol and substance abuse was reviewed by the Task Force on Alcohol and Substance Abuse, Legal Counsel and the Council on Human Rights.
