

17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS: (Indicate if building or structure is in an historic district)

Building is situated on a standard sized lot within Olmsted's Parkside subdivision. House is located two blocks from Delaware Park, which was designed by Olmsted and is listed on the National Register, and southeast of the Zoo.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): Two story Tudor style. Side clipped gable roof. Front facade has segmental arched entrance. Windows flanking on one side, six light with three light sidelights casement style and 6 light rectangular window. Decorative half-timbering on front facade and two vehicular entrances to garage attached. Segmental SIGNIFICANCE arched dormers with 6 light casement windows.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: A late example of a Tudor style residence. Summit Avenue is a truncated north-south street, located between Woodward the Crescent Avenues and extending from West Oakwood Place to the northern section of Crescent Avenue. A similar street, ending south of Jewett Avenue, appears in Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." Summit Avenue was deeded to the city in 1889, except for the small section between Amherst and Crescent which was deeded in 1892. This street follows Olmsted's rule that it "not lead with special directness toward the town."
