Hopewell Baptist Church was organized in the home of John F.D. Lyles, January 1956 at 474 Genesee Street. The attending ministers were, Rev. J.R. Williamson, Rev. John Washington, Rev. James Lee and Rev. Crockett.

The church was organized with eight members. We are blessed to have two of them with us today. They are Mother Marquerite Dunford and Mother Gladys Bonner.
