EXECUTIVE MANSION.
ALBANY.

Aug 30. 1854

My dear Sir:

I have just returned
from my little vacation & find
your two letters of the 28th
& 28th - also one of the 22d.
I return you the Clippings
contained in the latter and
also the letter of Mr. Dean.
The Libel I have not seen;
but what I hear of it leads
me to think that it is of
such a nature that a child
could not believe it. Was there
ever such an exhibition of
party madness?

I don't see how on Earth I
can go to Louisville. It is
impossible for me to get away
and leave the table for so
long a time.

I do hope that Service
will run for Congress again.
I hear that he is becoming
quite interested in the anti-
slavery campaign.

I rather think I shall
go to Buffalo soon of
other days. Though I have
thought during the last
two months that I never
wanted to see the town
again. I received an anonymous
letter to day that the table
graph containing the "Rule"

was still being printed &
sent off by the hundred
clubs and suggesting that
something ought to be done
to cure the effects.

You may be sure that
I fully appreciate all that
you are doing and the im-
portance of your work. With
