

This section of Amherst St., been Colvin and Parkside, was conceived by FLO around 1873 as part of a sidential "suburb" adjacent to Delaware Park. This suburb was called be Parkside" by Olmsted and appears on an 1876 map drawn by him as a sposed area of curved winding streets on the north and east sides of park. This section of Amherst St. was actually created by the City Buffalo in 1875 when Amherst St. was extended from Delaware Ave. to
