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

	The building is situated on a standard size building lot in Olmsted's Parkside		
	subdivision. The north-south thoroughfare at its most southerly end runs		
	directly into the grounds of the Buffalo Zoological Gardens. The Nichols		
	School athletic field is located on the west side of the street.

18.	Two story Dutch Colonial Revival style. Side gambrel roof with clipped		
	gable ends. Full width shed dormer has brackets under extended eave. A set		
	of paired square-headed 6/6 windows in dormer. Window shutters. Shed roof		
	projecting wing and entrance. Brackets under projecting eave. Wing has a		
	a horizontal band of four square-headed 6/6 windows. Entrance has paneled		
	door with semi-circular light.

20.). HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:		
	A fine example of the vernacular adaptation of the Dutch Colonial Style. Colvin		
	Street takes its name from Peter Colvin, a Holland Land Co. Agent. In the		
5	1890's the street was known as Niagara Blvd. and Niagara Falls Blvd. Colvin is		
	a Zoo entrance from the north. It relates to Olmsted's 1876 Sketch Map of the		
	Park System. The land is part of a subdivision named "Meadow View Park" conveyed		
	to George L. Thorne and Byron Angell in July 1889 by James Tillinghast. The		
	restrictive covenants in the deeds of sale to subdividers provided for		
	residential use only, and said dwellings "shall all be oftasteful design."		
	residential use only, and said dwellings shart all be of tasteral design.
