Financial Report

He listed expenditures of \$914,956 and income of \$729,231. In addition, the Community Chest contributed \$185,646, he explained.

President Horace Reed of the board of trustees presented the Gold Key award for 1951 to J. Frederick Rogers, a member of the board since 1930 and president of the YMCA from 1947 to 1951.

Group singing was led by Howard Chappell with Harold Chandler as accompanist. Vocal selections were presented by the Royal Serenaders of the Michigan Ave. Y under the direction of Roy A. Mathis. Dr. Ralph S. Hindman, minister of First Presbyterian Church, gave the invocation. YMCA President Frank W. Tindle was toastmaster.

Metropolitan directors elected for three-year terms were Whitworth Ferguson and Edward J. Laube. Re-elected were Frank W. Tindle, Harley F. Drollinger, George B. Kellogg, Ray A. Laub, Mr. Rogers and Hoover C. Sutton. The nominating committee was headed by Alten F. Baxter.
