## Milton Lumpkin

Funeral services for Milton Lumpkin, a longtime Buffalo resident, were held Friday in Hartford, Conn.



Lumpkin, 60, died Friday (Aug. 10, 1990) at Sheehan Emergency Hospital in Buffalo after a brief illness.

Born in Hartford, Lumpkin joined the Army during the Korean War and served six years. He came to Buffalo in the early 1960s and worked as an asbestos insulation employee for Asbestos Workers Local 4 for more than eight years.

Lumpkin was a member of the Royal Serenaders, a male singing group directed by Roy Mathis of the Richmond Avenue United Methodist Church of Buffalo. He also was a member of the Lincoln Memorial Methodist Church choir in Buffalo and an affiliated member of the Hadji Temple 61 of Buffalo.

He is survived by two daughters, Lauren of Windsor, Conn., and Jackie Pinkney of Hartford; a son, Jeffrey of Windsor; three sisters, Catherine Noble of Atlanta, Grace Eastwood and Cecelia, both of Hartford, and two grandchildren.
