The Gay And Lesbian Association of Choruses (GALA) will hold its Seventh International Festival of Choruses in Montreal in July 2004. BGMC choristers are making plans to attend and perform! BGMC will represent the Buffalo and Western New York community at the week long Festival held every four years.

Founded in 1982, GALA Choruses is the world's only organization committed to serving the gay/lesbian choral movement. BGMC is proud to be a member of GALA. GALA fosters the artistic and professional development of member choruses through a wide variety of programs and services: production of choral festivals; educational conferences; advocacy; grants for commissioning of new choral works; a resource center for choruses

and individual members.

GALA has grown to over 200 member choruses representing more than 10,000 singers from all over the world. The GALA Festival in San Jose in 2000 attracted 110 choruses and 5,500 singers. The Montreal Festival promises to be the largest GLBT performing arts festival in history.

The BGMC choristers will have the opportunity to hear 150 men's, women's and mixed choruses from eleven countries perform in Montreal's magnificent Place des Arts, Wilfred-Pelletier Concert Hall Maisonneuve Theater. We are honored to have the opportunity to perform in this impressive concert space. BGMC also plans to take part in other concerts to be held in the Montreal vicinity throughout the week.

The second group is the Board of Directors, past and present, and the Steering Committee that spent time and money to launch the BGMC. With the president there are eight members of the Board who work to make the Chorus operate smoothly, effectively, and efficiently: Woody Sipprell, Roger Parris, Bill Gardner, Max Phillips, Dan Wasinger, Doug Levy, Mark Meyer, John Herbert. Former members are Bill Fay, Russ Link, and Jeff Wilson. These men and Mike Bardo formed the Steering Committee and, with Barbara's input, nurtured the BGMC into existence. All of these people came onto the Board expecting to work hard to make the Chorus a success. These with Music Director Barbara Wagner are the leadership of this organization.

Serving on the Board

We must replace three Board members each year for several reasons. We do not want to allow the Board to become an "Old Boys Club." We need new members to succeed those who have completed three years service (and frankly, three years is quite long enough). Perhaps most importantly, Chorus members should share the responsibility of leadership and determine the direction in which the Chorus is to grow.

If the level of shared responsibility in which you care to participate is singing, that is terrific. If you care to participate as a volunteer or as a member of the Board, these opportunities are open to you.

I have worked on several boards of magic. These volunteers have shown directors, but never on a board as hard working, as collegial and as dedicated to the success of the organization as the present group of leaders. This group of individuals, supporting Barbara Wagner and the rest of the Chorus, has made the BGMC the significant community resource that it is. Speaking for the Board, we could not have accomplished so much in so little time without the superb musical leadership of Barbara Wagner, the dedication of our volunteers and the participation of the Board of Directors.

Running for the Board

Please familiarize yourselves with our Mission Statement. Then, review the duties and responsibilities of Board members. It is the Board's responsibility to ensure that the Music Director can focus on the making music. When that happens, we are working as a team: Music Director, Board and volunteers. That teamwork will continue to produce beautiful music in the rich tradition of male choral singing.

This year, three Board positions will be filled at our annual business meeting June 17th. Whether or not you choose to run for the Board, voting members should carefully consider who they want to represent them at this level of leadership. It is the Board and the Music Director that set the BGMC's policy. If you have ideas about the direction you want the Chorus to go in the future, Board service is your best opportunity to make these ideas known. The Board has an Election Committee to ensure that those who wish to place themselves in nomination for a Board position know the requirements.
