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

	subdivision. The north-south thoroughfare at its most southerly end runs
	directly into the grounds of the Buffalo Zoological Gardens. The Nichols
	School athletic field is located on the west side of the street.
18.	OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):
	Two story Prairie Box Style. Low pitched hip roof with projecting eaves, boxed.
	Single story enclosed porch has flat roof with tri-partitle single-light
	windows which emphasize the horizontality of the building. Paneled door with
	elliptical window tracery. Second story boxed bay window has a pair of square-
	headed 6/6 windows. Contrasting colored horizontal wood trim on sides of

- 0.	An excellent example of the Prairie Box Style. Colvin Street takes its name
	from Peter Colvin, a Holland Land Co. Agent. In the 1890's the street was known
	as Niagara Blvd. and Niagara Falls Blvd. Colvin is a Zoo entrance from the north.
	It directly relates to Olmsted's 1876 Sketch Map of the Park System. The land
	was part of a subdivision named "Meadow View Park" conveyed to George L. Thorne
Salt :	and Byron Angell in July 1889 by James Tillinghast. The restrictive covenants
	in the deeds of sale to subdividers provided for residential use only and said
	dwellings "shall all be oftasteful design."
