	Parkside neighborhood. Jewett Parkway was originally opened in 1875
	by Elam R. Jewett whose estate was at the southwest corner of Main
	Street and Jewett Parkway. The street followed Olmsted's plan for the
	Parkside neighborhood and can be seen on his 1876 map ot the City
	of Buffalo. In 1884 Elam Jewett deeded the street to the City of Buffalo, "on condition that it shall be placed in charge of the Park
	Commissioners, and be by them maintained as a Park approach, in the
	same manner as the other Park approaches now are or hereafter may be maintained."
