

Building is situated on a standard sized lot within Olmsted's Parkside subdivision. House is located two blocks from Delaware Park, which was designed by Olmsted and is listed on the National Register, and southeast of the Zoo.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): Two and a half story American Four Square form. Hip roof. Left bay first floor has glass paneled door. Aluminum hood. First floor has tri-part window, center single-light flanked by single-light casements. Second floor has two boxed bays. Paired double hung 1/1 windows. Hip roof dormer has paired double-hung 1/1 windows.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: A simplified American Four Square. Robie Street extends from Parkside Avenue to Main Street. Located in the center of the first section of the Parkside subdivision to be developed, on lands owned by Jacob Davis, Robie Street was deeded to the city in December 1887. Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside" show a street angling from Humboldt to Parkside Avenue; however when Robie Street was laid out, it paralleled Humboldt Avenue. The street nevertheless still followed Olmsted's plan to have short cross streets in the subdivision, giving residence easy access to main thoroughfares and the park.
