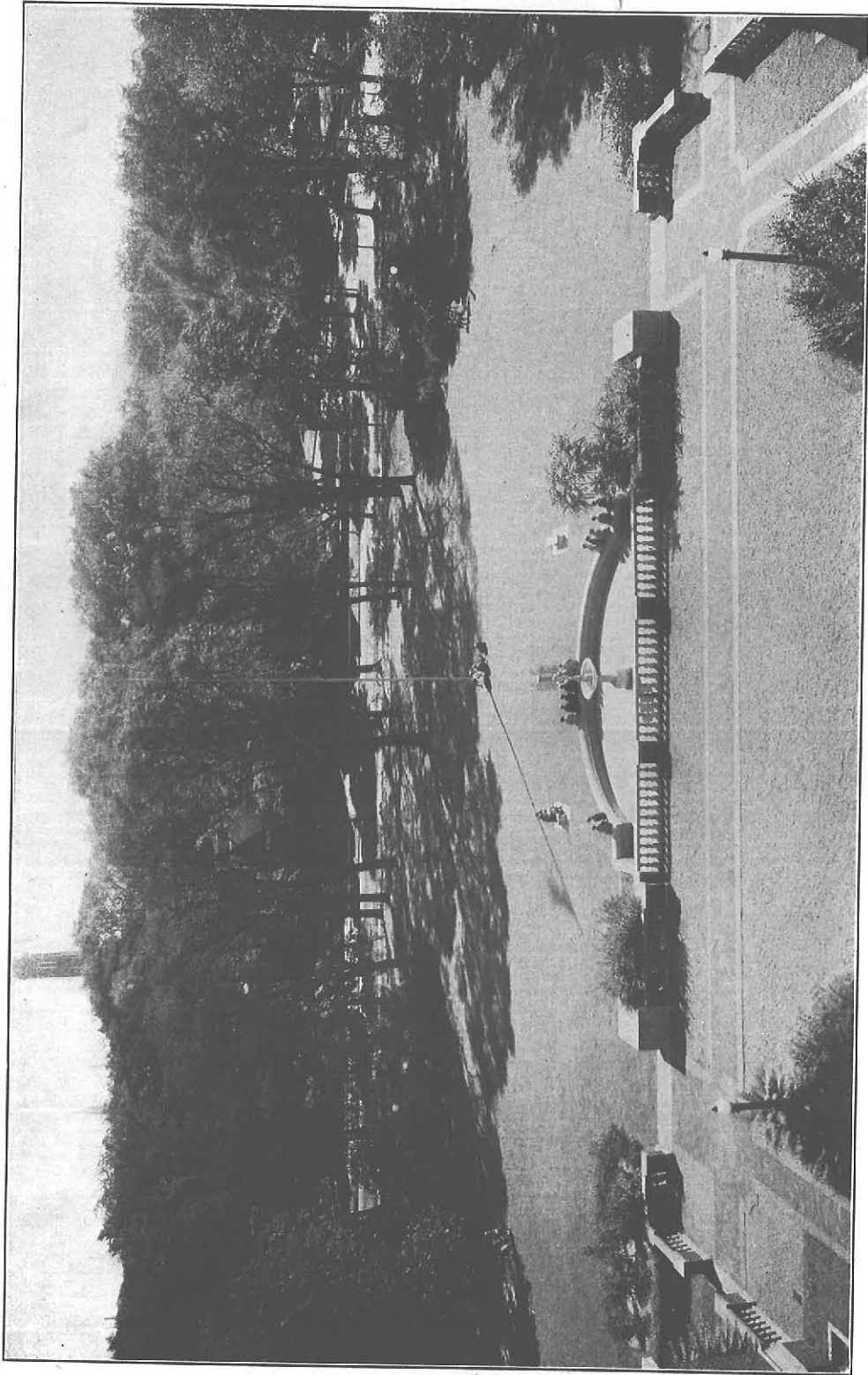

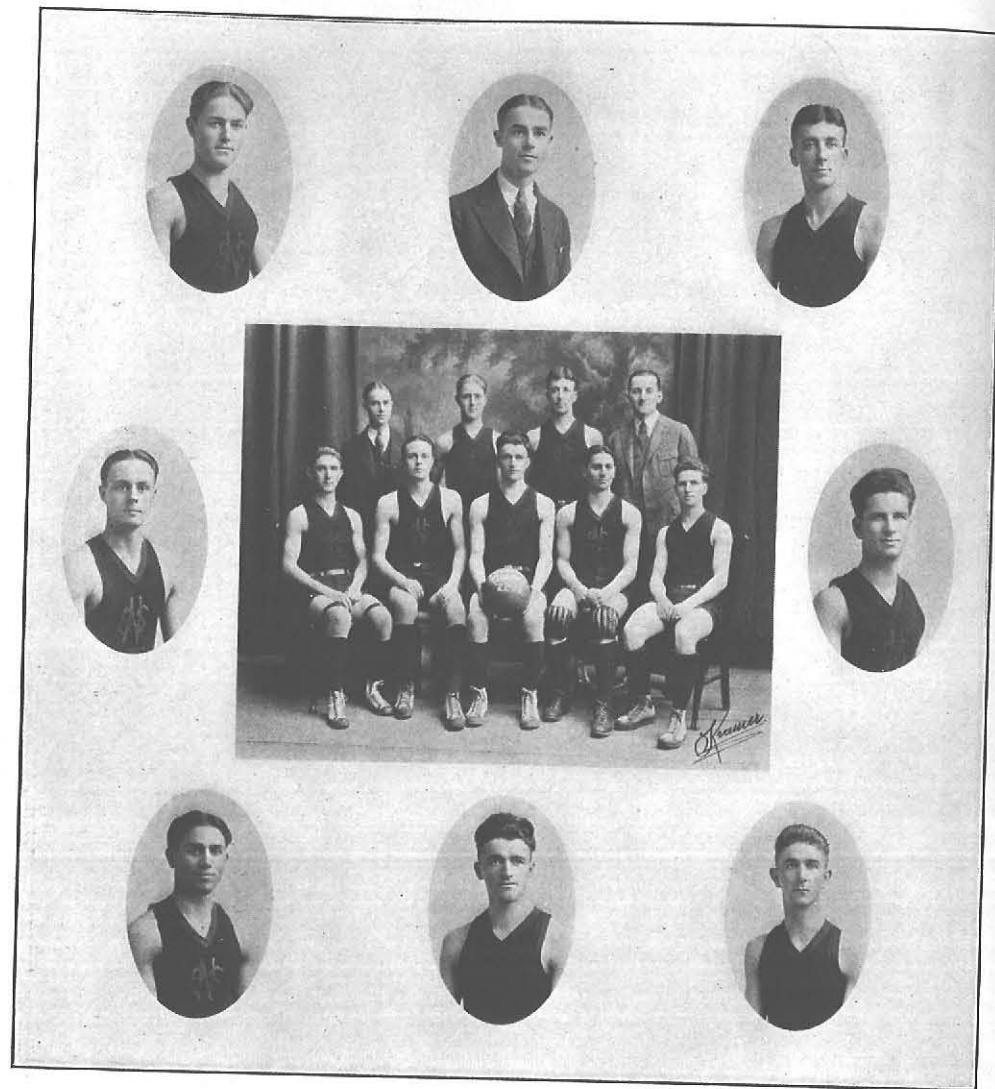

ATHLETICS

The Basketball Team with the help of three new players, namely, Abate, Grisely and McMahon, enjoyed a very successful season, winning thirteen out of seventeen games and the championship of the New York State Normals. The work of the team throughout the season was not characterized by much individual playing, although "Migs" Finch obtained a total of 60 field goals in seventeen games. Starting in the season as a guard, Finch's ability to hold his man scoreless and at the same time score from the field, earned him the position of forward which he held permanently after the fourth game. After taking over foul shooting as part of his game, Abate scored consistently from the foul line, thus helping to win many games through that department.

Too much cannot be said for Captain Tom Cleary, who, with the help of Abate, represented the best pair of guards Buffalo Normal ever had on a basketball court. Tom came to us from Canisius College and has given of his time and experience unsparingly, winning and holding the admiration of every man on his team.

Then there is our center, Dan Grisley, who must not be forgotten. Dan was a Technical High School star for two years and proved his ability to us by holding down the center's position for the full season.

Darling and ex-captain Harsch played at forward or guard whenever needed and displayed their characteristic fight and speed when most needed. Both of these boys deserve credit for the spirit and self sacrifice shown in their two years with the team.

McMahon started in mid-season and played opposite Finch as forward from that time on to the end of the season, displaying rare ability in making difficult shots. Salisbury came out for a few games and showed ability that will very likely be put to good use next season.

Next comes our manager, Al. Stalker, and his assistant Walter Smith. Through the efforts of Al., who was manager of last year's team, and his assistant, a schedule was prepared that would test the strength of any State Normal championship team. We will always remember dapper Al. for his thoughtfulness and care for the team on their out of town trips. A manager's life is hard at the best, but Al. came through with team behind him to a man.

Last, but not least, to receive his share of credit is Coach Applebee. Very few men, in the team's estimation, rank with their Coach in self sacrifice and enthusiasm. Coach Applebee's work found an answering note in the men on the team and, without a doubt, that is the reason Normal can boast of a championship team today. *Our hats are off to you, Wendell Applebee.*
