

re Gr th wh Ru st	HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: A typical frame double sidence. Russell Avenue extends from Parkside Avenue to eenfield Street. It was laid out in a map of 1886, paralleling e northern border of the lands of Washington Russell, after om the street was named. However it was early 1889 before ssell Avenue was deeded to the city. While this particular reet does not appear in Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The rkside," Olmsted felt cross streets would allow easy access to jor thoroughfares and to the park, and he did include similar oss streets such as Jewett Avenue in his early plans.
