

Pa De	ailding is situated on a large sized lot within Olmsted's arkside subdivision. House is located two blocks from claware Park, which was designed by Olmsted and is listed on the National Register, and southeast of the Zoo.
Tw ea ro do wi	OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): To and a half story Colonial Revival style. Hip roof with flared aves. Modillions and dentils under eaves. Partial-width flat of porch. Ionic columns with stick balustrade. Wood paneled for with leaded sidelights. First floor single light windows the 10-light transoms. Second floor tri-part window with geometric shaped leading flanked by 6/2 windows. DATE OF INITIAL CONSTRUCTION: c. 1894 Paneled end Ionic pilaster strips. Pedimented gabled dormers, 1/1 light windows. BUILDER:
Av Wo	HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: A Colonial Revival style esidence with symmetrical facade and Classical details. Summit venue is a truncated north-south street, located between codward and Crescent Avenues and extending from West Oakwood lace to the northern section of Crescent Avenue. A similar creet, ending south of Jewett Avenue, appears in Olmsted's arly 1870's maps of "The Parkside." Summit Avenue was deeded the city in 1889, except for the small section between wherst and Crescent which was deeded in 1892. This street collows Olmsted's rule that it "not lead with special directness oward the town."
