President's Column

Throughout our nation's history, gays, lesbians, bisexuals and transgender persons have seldom, if ever, had a "voice" in society in the fullest sense of the word - a comprehensive, recognized presence with complete participation in American culture. But in our nation today, gay and lesbian choruses are flourishing. Our voices, artistically and politically, are being heard. The NYS Senate's passage of the Sexual Orientation Non-Discrimination Act (SONDA) and the appearance of the Buffalo Gav Men's Chorus are two recent examples.

Although we have a registered membership of 69 singers and about 10 volunteers in our support group, few of our membership know where and when we originated; how we came to be the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus. Here's the story of how we came to be, the shortened version.

In December 1999, Roger Parris, a former music history student and parttime music critic, spoke to some friends about a dream he had for a gay men's chorus in Buffalo. An earlier gay and lesbian chorus had folded several years before. A new gay men's chorus would give our community a voice that would build bridges to join straight, gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people through beautiful music.

Roger asked several of his close friends, his partner, Mike Longo, Mike Bardo, a paralegal and Jeff Wilson, an accountant, to contribute ideas about building a new gay men's chorus. By January 2000, this Steering Committee was exploring the possibilities. They envisioned a singing group of out, proud, gay men who would produce music of high artistic excellence for a wide audience of men and women who love male choral singing; a chorus rising out of the gay men's community of which all of Buffalo could be proud. In March 2000, the original Steering

Committee expanded to include attorney Bill Gardner, music educator Bill Fay and retired US Navy pilot Jim Estep. By March 2001, the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus (BGMC) was incorporated by the State of New York.

In May 2001, Barbara Wagner, the Music Director of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo, joined us as our charter music director. She always wanted to direct a male chorus, but never imagined she'd get the opportunity. Barb was retiring from Nichols School and ready for something with a venturesome note to it. We were ready to hire a music director. We are proud to have one of the best music conductors in Western New York. We scheduled auditions for the BGMC on May 19, 2001. By the end of that day, we had a chorus: thirty-six men were singers in the nascent Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus. By the end of the month, we had 45 committed men in the chorus.

The Rochester Gay Men's Chorus gave us much support during this formative period, coming to Buffalo to do a benefit concert and "friend raiser" for us in June 2001. They were our mentors and we relied on their 18 years of experience to guide us. After fifteen months of planning and, seemingly, endless meetings dealing with by-laws, incorporation papers, fund raising and organizational details, we were ready for our first rehearsal.

On Tuesday, September 11, 2001, we gathered for our first rehearsal and mourned the tragic passing of the men and women killed in the unimaginable attacks that day on the World Trade Centers and the Pentagon. Many of us felt the need to be with one another, to share our feelings, and to find some relief from the horror of the day's events. We went on with the rehearsal, and we learned a song that night that brought us together. The Ouaker hymn entitled "How Can I Keep From Singing?" gave us comfort and has become a signature anthem for us.

We sang our first concert, Music

From the Heart, to a sold out house on February 9, 2002. None of us could have predicted the unbelievable support and response we received from the audience that night. Even before the last note died away, the audience was on its feet applauding. That energy validated us and made the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus a living reality. Our second sold out concerts of 2002, during Pride Week in Buffalo, were called The Sounds of Summer. We marched in the Pride Parade as a community of singers and we sang our songs in celebration of our gay heritage.

This year we've had some notable achievements which the public did not see, but which will make a difference in our concert performances: potluck dinners every month; a retreat to foster camaraderie and morale; music classes for chorus members, organized by Bill Fay (which will continue this Spring); and a retreat for Chorus members. We are well into planning for the GALA Festival in Montreal July 17-24, 2004. We attended the performance of Mamma Mia! at Shea's and had the cast and audience talking about "those guys in the front four rows." We'll be attending a performance of The Full Monty in May 2003. At the present time, we're in rehearsal for a real foot stompin', hand clappin' mid-Winter concert on January 24 and 25, 2003. Our vision is to live in a commu-

nity that supports gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender men and women. Our membership is open to any man who wants to sing and who can pass a simple voice placement audition. We welcome all men and women who want to support our singers by volunteering their support in ushering, receptions, mailings, coffee breaks during rehearsals and who wish a closer association with the BGMC. Our mission is to produce high quality vocal music in the distinctive and rich tradition of male choral singing that will entertain a wide audience and will enlighten by creating harmony and celebrating pride in ourselves and in our community. In our second performing year, we move toward realizing this vision through our music.
