

Projecting entrance has glass and wood paneled door flanked on one side by 1/1 window. First floor 1/1 three-part window. Window shutters. Paneled doric pilaster  SIGNIFICANCE  19. DATE OF INITIAL CONSTRUCTION: 1906 strips flank windows on first floor. Second floor ARCHITECT: has a pair of 3-part windows; 9/1 center with 6/1 sides. Window shutters. | 20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: A standard version of a residential Colonial Revival style. Summit Avenue is a truncated north-south street, located between Woodward the Crescent Avenues and extending from West Oakwood Place to the northern section of Crescent Avenue. A similar street, ending south of Jewett Avenue, appears in Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." Summit Avenue was deeded to the city in 1889, except for the small section between Amherst and Crescent which was deeded in 1892. This street follows Olmsted's rule that it "not lead with special directness toward the town." |  |   |  |  |  |
