

Locked arm in arm they cross the way, The black boy and the white, The golden splendor of the day, The sable pride of night.

From lowered blinds the dark folk stare, And here the fair folk talk, Indignant that these two should dare In unison to walk.

Oblivious to look and word They pass and see no wonder That lightning brilliant as a sword Should blaze the path of thunder.

The emotionally charged music and poetry help us take a powerful look at racism and homophobia, and how we are connected and affected by it. We hear explosive unpitched sounds like those of a work song – a chain gang, if you will - "locked arm in arm" - explosive, dissonant music. A young black boy and a boy that's white cross the way – the "splendor of the day" and the "sable pride of night," gently locked arm in arm. Soaring, joyous music describes the splendor of the day while the sable pride of night is reflected in quiet harmonies. Dissonance again reflects the racism and homophobia as they rear their ugly heads from behind the lowered blinds where the dark folks stare and the fair folk talk. How could they?!!! The boys, oblivious to the indignation, walk in the midst of music that informs brilliant lightning, blazing the path of thunder. They walk arm in arm in defiance and hope as the singers soar to the top of their ranges in triumph.

Down in the River to Pray

This wonderful Appalachian Folk Song brings forth images of mountain folk walking down through the verdant green valley toward the river so they can all pray together. It has much the same feel as "Shall We Gather At the River?"

Everything Possible

This amazing song by Unitarian Universalist Minister, Fred Small, has become one of the most beloved anthems of our movement. It comes in various arrangements and forms, but always with the same powerful words that give us comfort and courage: "You can be anybody that you want to be ... You can love whomever you will ... You can dream all the day never reaching the end of everything possible for you." The very end of the song tells us that the "only measure of your words and your deeds will be the love you leave behind when you're gone." In the end it's always the love and understanding that connects us, isn't it?

Rainbow Connection

Written by Paul Williams and Kenneth Ascher, "Rainbow Connection" was originally performed by Kermit the Frog in *The Muppet Movie* in 1979. The popular song's name has been used by a number of charitable organizations wishing to evoke its message of a driving urge for something more in life. It has been covered by artists ranging from Willie Nelson to The Pussycat Dolls, and now, the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus. We hope you enjoy our take on this classic.

From the mind of Eric Lane Barnes comes this traditional spiritual which offers sympathy to arguably the most famous middle child of all time. Can you guess who that would be? Barnes is a popular composer and arranger within the Gala Chorus Movement who currently serves as Assistant Director of the Seattle Men's Chorus as well as Director of Captain Smartypants (a breakout group of the aforementioned chorus).

Our Children

One of the things that Fred Small says in "Everything Possible" is "some raise children and some never do." In our case, at least two of the men in the chorus are indeed raising children, 2 families and 4 wonderful little boys. It's magical and possible. This heartwarming song from the musical *Ragtime* is sung by two parents who don't know each other, but are

THE ROYAL SERENADERS

I'm Gonna Sing

This rollicking spiritual, arranged by the inimitable Moses Hogan, may he rest in peace, will have you moving in your seats before you know it!

The Twenty Third Psalm

The long time director of the Royal Serenaders, the gifted Roy Mathis, first heard this song in a movie from the 50's *David and Bathsheba*. For those of you who are old enough to appreciate it, Gregory Peck played David and one of the most beautiful redheads who ever lived, Susan Hayward, played Bathsheba. It was one of those amazing Biblical blockbusters that we don't see anymore. Roy says that when he heard this lush setting of the 23rd Psalm, he knew his chorus had to sing it.

As you listen to the next 4 songs, be aware that it is no mistake that they are placed in this order.

Make Them Hear You

This rousing anthem from the musical Ragtime was arranged by the BGMC's own Jaime Goldfuss. Ragtime is a story of a black man who, after being humiliated by a racist fireman, decides to fight for justice. Just prior to his death at the end of the show, the character Coalhouse Walker admonishes his followers to "make them hear you." He goes on to say that "if you make them hear you, we will all be victorious". The song's message that justice and equality can only be obtained when you raise your voice and make yourself heard resonates strongly within the gay community.

Yes!!

Please see the listing in the program. It will help in understanding how the poetry and the music are all so powerfully linked.

Anthem

The musical *Chess* (with lyrics by Tim Rice and music by Bjorn Ulvaeus & Benny Andersson of ABBA and later *Mamma Mia!* fame) is the story of a romantic triangle between an American and a Russian player in the world chess championship, and the woman who manages the American but falls

in love with the Russian. The song comes at the end of the first act after the Russian wins the championship, then defects to the west. Answering reporters' questions about his loyalties, his "Anthem" declares that "my land's only borders lie around my heart."

The Storm is Passing Over

We are connected by hope and courage as we journey on through the night to the brightness of the morning light. The storm has passed over. Hallelujah!!

Big Spender

In the most famous number from the 1964 musical *Sweet Charity*, "Big Spender" shows Charity Hope Valentine and the other taxi dancers at the Fandango Ballroom go through the motions in order to entice their prospective clients. Rest assured that we're doing anything but going through the motions in our effort to entertain you tonight!

Naturally

This is an a capella doowop song was originally performed by Huey Lewis and The News on their 1986 album *Fore!* It's a reminder that love and relationships require effort, and with dedication, despite hardships, things will eventually work out: "You know that love is a struggle/and only the strong survive/so it's up to me and you/to do what we've got to do to keep our love alive."

Friendship

From the Cole Porter musical Anything Goes, this song was originally written for another Porter show DuBerry Was a Lady. Not a part of the original 1934 production, it was added for the 1962 revival. This song was made famous when it was sung as a duet between Lucy and Ethel in the 3rd season of the television show I Love Lucy.

Not While I'm Around

This song is from the 1979 Stephen Sondheim musical and the 2007 Tim Burton film, *Sweeney Todd.* This is the story of a man who returns to Victorian era London, England, after 15 years in prison for a crime he did not commit, with the sole intention of gaining his revenge. It is considered to be one of the most ghoulish and graphic shows in Broadway history and was the winner of nine Tony Awards in 1979.

Another One Down

"It was the mid 80s and AIDS had hit Buffalo with a vengeance. My friend Ron was the first to go, in 1981. Then Jack, then Dick, then we heard about Jim and Mike. Then Tom and Claude. And it went on and on. I sang at one funeral after another. Our hearts broke over and over. I think the song wrote itself out of our collective grief. I sang and the audiences sang and we cried and were able to go on. We needed a vehicle to allow us to weep as a community and "Another One Down" became that vehicle and helped us to heal." Words of Madeline Davis, Buffalo Composer, Singer and Leader of our Movement.

We Go Together

Grease opened in 1972 and went on to become the longest-running show in Broadway musical history at 3388 performances until it was beaten by A Chorus Line. It has since gone on to become a hugely successful film, a popular 1994 and 2008 Broadway revival, and a staple of community and regional theatre, summer stock, as well as high school and middle school drama groups. Those of you who attend our concerts are familiar with the term choralography; we hope you enjoy this year's attempt!

Color Out of Colorado

This crazy, bittersweet, hilarious little song comes from a show called When Pigs Fly. It begins with a slap at the powers that be, who want to regulate human nature. They want to tell you who to be and why it's not going to work for all kinds of reasons. And so it begins with the states; here's just a little teaser, "You can't take the Mary out of Maryland" – and we're off!!!!!!

Here's Where I Stand

From the 2003 independent film *Camp*, this song is sung at the end of the film by Jenna, whose father wanted to send her to weight loss camp, but compromised by having her jaws wired shut so she wouldn't overeat. Jenna is a last minute replacement for both the lead and understudy, whose feud turned violent. She has her jaws cut loose and belts this song out to her parents who are in the audience telling them, "Here's where I stand, here's who I am. Love me, but don't tell me who I have to be".



About the Artists

The Buffalo Gay Men's Charus

Incorporated in 2000, the **Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus** (BGMC) performs a rich catalog of classical, contemporary, Broadway, pop and multi-cultural music.
The repertoire is as diverse as the 67 men who are

singing with pride as members of the BGMC.

The BGMC has been honored by the Empire State Pride Agenda with a Community Service Award. This award was given in recognition of BGMC's efforts to raise awareness and to enlighten our region through song. To that end, the BGMC has performed in a variety of venues throughout Western New York and in Pennsylvania and Ontario for many community events. Additionally, the BGMC has traveled to Montreal to participate in the seventh annual GALA Festival, an international gathering of gay and lesbian choruses. Recently the BGMC won the *Artwoice* Best of Buffalo 2008 Award for Best Choral Group. Also in 2008, the BGMC was honored by the Arts Council of Buffalo and Western New York, with its prestigious award for Community Service. It was a glorious day.

While maintaining a strong presence within the gay community, the BGMC also has been privileged to perform with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra at Kleinhans Music Hall on two occasions. It has also done benefits for the Amherst Unitarian Universalist Church music program, Blessed Trinity Roman Catholic Church's restoration, the annual World AIDS Day Memorial Service and the AIDS Community Services fundraiser, Cause for Celebration. Additionally, BGMC performed for the arrival of The Amistad, participated in "Gusto at the Gallery" at the Albright-Knox Art Gallery, sang at an Ars Nova Musicians "Viva Vivaldi" Concert, sang at Fredonia College for its diversity and multicultural groups and also performed at the Nichols School as part of its Diversity Week activities. Of course, our four major concerts annually bring our work to thousands of listeners in the Western New York area.

The BGMC is a New York not-for-profit corporation of member singers and supporters, dedicated to producing high quality vocal music in the rich tradition of men's choral singing. Through its music, the Chorus endeavors to entertain and enlighten, create harmony and celebrate personal and community pride.



Barbara Wagner (Artistic Director) has served as Minister of Music at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo for 44 years. She was the director of choral activities at the Nichols School for more than 24 years and served the congregation of Temple Beth Am as its Music Director for 12 years. She was in charge of vocal activities at the Buffalo Seminary for several years and conducts the Unitarian Universalist Church Choir as

well as the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus. In addition to its Sunday morning responsibilities, the UU Church Choir has made two highly acclaimed European tours, the first to Germany, Austria and the Czech Republic and the second to Ireland, Wales, England and Scotland. In the Fall of 2006, the choir did a short concert tour of the Northern Adirondacks. The UU Church Choir, under the direction of Ms. Wagner, has recorded for American Public Radio, and has performed locally with members of the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, with the Amherst Saxophone Quartet and with the Ars Nova Chamber Orchestra. Ms. Wagner was the conductor for the Peace Odyssey Tour of Hungary and the former Soviet Union. Choral singers from all over the USA participated in this tour. She was a member of the prestigious seven member Hymnbook Resources Commission that was responsible for the denominational hymnbook, Singing the Living Tradition, published in 1993. She was the chair of the New Hymns Task Force, which produced Singing the Journey, another denominational songbook, published in June, 2005.

She ran a choral program at Nichols High School that involved over 100 young singers, including a concert chorus, women's ensemble, men's ensemble and a mixed chamber group. She was also guest conductor for the City of Good Neighbors Chorale.

Ms. Wagner earned a BFA degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo, where she studied Organ with Squire Haskin. She has done graduate work at Westminister Choir College. She did advanced Organ study with Karl Richter at Munich Conservatory and has done advanced conducting study with Raymond Harvey, the former Assistant Conductor of the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra and presently the Music Director of the Kalamazoo Symphony. Ms. Wagner regularly attends choral workshops led by many of the most prestigious choral conductors in this country. Rodney Eichenberger, the late Robert Shaw, Paul Salumonovich, Robert Page, Vance George and Dale Warland are just a few of the greats with whom she has worked.

She is a member of The American Choral Director's Association, Erie County Music Educators Association, MENC, Unitarian Universalist Musician's Network (founding member, former vice president and board member), NYSSMA, American Guild of Organists (former program chair and sub dean of the Buffalo Chapter) and Chromatic Club. She was presented with the Erie County Music Educator/Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra award for excellence in choral education in May of 2002. Ms. Wagner has been included in editions of both Who's Who in American Women and Who's Who in America. She is the proud charter Artistic Director of the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus.



A native of North Carolina, **Debi Overton** (Accompanist/Conductor), has held positions as coach/accompanist at the University of Texas at Austin and served as Director of the Chamber Music Program at The New School of Music in Philadelphia. For many years, she was active at the Summer Music Festival in Aspen, Colorado. As the coach/accompanist for the choral department in Aspen, she served as assistant to noted conductor Fiora Contino. She has

assisted in preparing choruses and soloists for such conductors as Tamara Brooks, John Nelson, Robert Shaw and Sergei Commissiona. Additionally, she has coached with coach/accompanists David Garvey, John Wustman, Brooks Smith and Dalton Baldwin, as well as the local master, Livingston Gearhart.


Ms. Overton has accompanied Master Classes for Luciano Pavarotti, Phyllis Curtin, Jessye Norman, Leontyne Price and Sylvia McNair. She has accompanied the regional Metropolitan Opera auditions in Greensboro, NC, Philadelphia, PA, Atlanta, GA and New York City. Considered by her peers to be "one of the finest sight readers in the country", she offers nuances and subtle interpretations of music that have been enjoyed and applauded by thousands of listeners throughout the United States. Recently reviewed, Ms. Overton was touted as "a musician's musician" in the Buffalo News. Considered a prodigy, and trained as a concert pianist, she took lessons at the University of North Carolina from a very early age,traveling two hours from her home in Roanoke Rapids to Greensboro for weekly lessons lasting six hours, and returning home again. Ms. Overton has toured in Europe but prefers the roots, both spiritual and local, offered by a career as a church musician.

In addition to her duties as Organist and Choir Master at Calvary Episcopal Church in Williamsville, NY, Ms. Overton is a past chair of the Music Commission of the WNY Episcopal Diocese, has been a member of the Board of Directors for the American Guild of Organists and is active in Western New York teaching, guest conducting, accompanying and performing with singers and instrumentalists. In 2007, she conducted the WNY premiere of Leonard Bernstein's Mass for Opera Sacra.

The Royal Serenaders Male Chorus

In 1945, Roy A. Mathis moved to Buffalo from Chattanooga, Tennessee, to join his three brothers who had already relocated here. Once here, he decided to form a Quartet with himself and his brothers. In 1946, two more local men were added to the group. Eventually several more singers, joined and the group became The Royal Serenaders. They sang at local churches in the city. At one point, they joined the Shriners, and traveled across the country competing at national Shrine Conventions, winning 1st or 2nd place nationally.

The Royal Serenaders have been singing together continuously for 62 years under the leadership of the founding Director, Roy A. Mathis. Their repertoire consists of both secular and sacred music; from spirituals to classical (including opera) and pop music. Roy's wife, Joyce Cameron Mathis, has been Accompanist for the group for 40 years.

Madeline Davis has been active in gay rights since 1970. She was a founding member of the Mattachine Society of the Niagara Frontier and taught the first Lesbianism course in the U.S. In 1972 she was the first out lesbian elected delegate and speaker at a major national political convention (Dem., McGovern.) She is co-author of Boots of Leather, Slippers of Gold: The History of a Lesbian Community (1993). She has been writing and performing music since 1959. "Another One Down" was written in response to the loss of many beloved friends during the AIDS crisis of the 1980s.

"I sang at so many funerals I thought the tears would never end." Madeline is currently Vice President of Stonewall Democrats, co-founder and co-chair of Rainbow Elders and founder and Director of the Madeline Davis GLBT Archives of WNY.

BGMC Commissions Song From Harlem Renaissance by Dr. Lawrence Van Heusen

The Chorus has commissioned a nationally acclaimed African American composer, Adolphus Hailstork, to compose a musical setting for the poem, "Tableau", from the collection, "Color", by Countee Cullen (© 1925; Copyright held by The Armistad Research Center, Tulane University). The choral work is re-titled "Yes!!" and will have its world premiere in Buffalo on June 20, 21, and 22, 2008.

Countee Cullen

Color, published in 1925, was awaited by New York City with baited breath. The anticipation had been fueled by Countee Cullen himself, the child prodigy whose earlier poem had made it to the front page of New York City newspapers. "I Have a Rendezvous With Life" was published at the conclusion of World War I when Cullen was still in High School. All of New York City had become involved in a discussion of that poem, and the Empire Federation of Women's Clubs had awarded him first prize in the city. For the general public in the 1920's, Cullen seemed to embody some the characteristics of "The New Negro," a heroic icon following in the wake of Jack Johnson's earlier win of the Heavyweight title against a white man and Marcus Garvey's emerging "Back to Africa" movement. Cullen's handsome features, personal charm, and extraordinary popularity as the model New Negro led to him being labeled as the most famous black American writer of 1925.

Having graduated from NYU as Phi Beta Kappa, and then studying at Harvard where he would earn his M.A. in 1926, Cullen was seen by black and white alike as a positive representation of his race. In the press, headlines appeared such as, "Black Pan Sings Again," "A Young Poet of Death and African Beauty," "Harvard Negro Poet Wins Another Prize," "A Negro Shropshire Lad." However, Cullen justifiably resented being exploited as the racial representative. He told the press that he wanted to be seen as a poet only, and he frequently adhered to classical European form in his writing, doting on Keats and other Euro traditions. He knew the pain of racism as evidenced in his most quoted line: "Yet do I marvel at this curious thing:/To make a poet black and bid him sing!"

While not all are convinced, at least three biographers (David Lewis, Jean Wagner, and Arnold Rampersad) have concluded that Cullen was gay. Three points are made: (1) The content of some of his poetry (including "Tableau"), (2) that he lived for many years with a "handsome" West Indian named Harold Jackson, (3) that his marriage to the daughter of W.E.B. DuBois was disastrous, lasting less than a year, and may have been a career move. He died six years after remarrying in 1940. Some say this was a marriage of convenience, though they genuinely loved each other.

Cullen only lived for 39 years, and his second wife, Ida, inherited his literary estate. Subsequent laws extended the copyright, so that when Ida died in 1987, the copyright would have continued in 2007; no one knew where or how. By 2020, the poetry would be entering the public domain, but the poem was too important to BGMC to wait. BGMC spent many hours researching the copyright, as the musical composer would need permission to proceed. The Library of Congress was not forthcoming. GALA agreed to use this unusually difficult search as an educational model during an internet conference, but fared no better. Finally, Marjorie Lord, a musician and librarian retired from Buffalo State College, whom Barbara Wagner had alerted to our quest, discovered that the rights were held by the Amistad Research Center, now located at Tulane University in New Orleans.

Adolphus Hailstork

When we first contacted Adolphus Hailstork in the spring of 2007, he had already been commissioned to write *Rise for Freedom*, an opera about the underground railroad to be produced in October 2007. (The *Opera News* gave it a great review.) Despite his busy schedule, he managed to devote the month of August to composing "Yes!!" for BGMC, using the Cullen poem. BGMC has exclusive performance rights for 2008, and lifetime rights thereafter.

BGMC is very fortunate to have been able to commission this work by "one of the greatest composers in the United States" (per Old Dominion University) whose work over the past 20 years has been commissioned and performed as opera, orchestral, and choral works in New York, Philadelphia, and Chicago. Like our own artistic director who has known "Dolph" for years, Dr. Hailstork has been a Unitarian Universalist choral director and a teacher. He is currently Composer in Residence at Old Dominion University in Norfolk, and is also well-known to Buffalo Philharmonic conductor Joanne Falletta who is the resident conductor of that city's orchestra as well.

Hailstork was born in Rochester, New York, but immediately moved to Albany where he was raised, and studied violin, piano, organ, and voice. He graduated from Howard University (BA), Manhattan School of Music (MA), and Michigan State University (PhD in Composition). His second and third symphonies were recorded on CD (Naxos) last year. Recent works have included "Earth Rise (A Song of Healing), Whitman's Journey" (Kennedy Center premiere in DC). Other premieres slated for the spring of 2008 are *Serenade* for chorus and orchestra, commissioned by Michigan State University, and "Set Me on a Rock", also for chorus and orchestra, commissioned by the Houston Choral Society.

Schola Cantorosa



Schola Cantorosa, the gay men's chorus of Hamburg, Germany, is coming to Buffalo. They will join forces with Forte, the Toronto Men's Chorus, and the BGMC to present a GALA Send-Off Concert on July 6 preceded by a chicken barbecue. You will not want to miss this triple header at the Unitarian Universalist Church.

History of the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus

At the end of 1999, the vision for a Gay Men's Chorus in Buffalo was conceived. With the support and success of the Rochester Gay Men's Chorus, it was time for Buffalo to join the growing list of GBLT choruses all over the world. After 15 months of intense work, a Steering Committee had written by-laws, papers of incorporation had been filed, fundraisers had successfully raised over \$5,000 in seed money, a mission statement had been crafted and officers had been elected. After a thorough search, area choral conductor, Barbara Wagner, was asked to be the charter Artistic Director. Wagner, in turn, requested that Debi Overton be invited to serve as the Charter Accompanist. Both women are highly respected musicians and continue to serve the chorus well. In fact, Wagner was to join the ranks of only four female conductors of Gay Men's Choruses at the time.

The first auditions were in May, 2001, and rehearsals were to begin on September 11, 2001, a day of infamy that would be filled with horror and fear and death. The decision was made to go on with the rehearsal on this day that was destined to alter the course of history. There was controversy around that decision, but, at the end of the day, it proved to be a wise one. Forty men, many of whom didn't know each other, began to gather, eerily silent, at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo. As the men and Wagner held hands for the very first time in a community circle, there were anguished murmurs of meditation and prayer. It was a birth fraught with complications and terror. Then they sang and began to forge the bonds that still hold them together to this day. That inaugural concert Music From the Heart presented on February 9, 2002, set the tone for all concerts to follow. The energy that filled that church that night validated the reality of the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus, and the bonds formed that night continue to remain strong after all of these years. The audience that first night was huge; the church was filled, chairs lined the aisles and, sadly, people had to be turned away at the door. All concerts after that were offered twice in one weekend and six years later, we are now adding a third concert to our series and a third performance to each concert. Our audiences continue to be huge and diverse. The awards began coming as we grew in stature and musical expression. Three awards of "Best in Buffalo" and "Best Chorus" were given to us from our local paper, Artvoice. Then we were invited to sing at Kleinhans Music Hall with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra twice, once for a subscription concert in 2004 and later for a benefit for the orchestra and the Olmsted Conservancy in 2006, with JoAnn Falletta conducting. Mary Louise Nanna, founder and conductor of Ars Nova asked us to sing on her Viva Vivaldi Series. BGMC was recognized by the Empire State Pride Agenda in 2005 with the ESPA Award for

Community Service for the excellence of their music and their dedication to the community. In March, 2008, the BGMC was chosen to receive the prestigious Buffalo and Erie County Arts Council Award for exceptional contributions to the arts and cultural community in Western New York. The citation reads as follows: "Your nomination and selection to receive this award is a testament to the years of time, talent, personal and professional resources you have invested in supporting, promoting and advancing art and culture in our region. You are an outstanding model of leadership by example."

Our success has brought many requests for Benefit Concerts, 21 to date. We try very hard to honor these and even have offered to sing benefit concerts for worthy organizations. We have received grants and gifts and much support from both the gay community and the community at large. We are eager to give back.

A major force in the success of BGMC has been the impressive dedication of the all volunteer chorus itself. These men take the chorus' artistic ambitions seriously; they are resolute rehearsal attendees and have worked hard to build their choral skills. The chorus' social impact on the community at large has been unprecedented and immense. The very existence of this chorus in a relatively conservative community has helped make enormous strides in acceptance and equality for the GLBT community here. In addition to enlightening the community at large, the chorus has been an important factor in raising the self esteem of a historically marginalized society. Its high profile has established the BGMC as a positive model for those who are grappling with the negativity all too often imposed on gay, lesbian, transgendered and bisexual people. And so the hard work continues with each note these intrepid men sing.

History of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo

The Unitarian Church in Buffalo was founded on December 2, 1831, when Buffalo was still a village. Shortly afterward, a lot was purchased at Franklin and Eagle Streets downtown and a cornerstone was laid for a church building in 1833. Among those who contributed to its construction was Millard Fillmore, church member and future U.S. President, who later welcomed John Quincy Adams and Abraham Lincoln as guests in his pew. Other Unitarian churches were built at Delaware and Mohawk (1879) and Amherst & Fairfield (1897) prior to the current edifice at Elmwood and Ferry (1904-1906).

The Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo was established in 1953, when the Unitarian and Universalist congregations in Buffalo merged and began using the Unitarian church building at Elmwood and Ferry.

History of the First Presbyterian Church

Architects Green and Wicks designed the First Presbyterian Church, which was built from 1889 to 1891. Located at One Symphony Circle at Richmond Avenue, it is a massive Medina sandstone structure and is a prime example of romantic Medievalism.

The slender soaring tower was inspired by the 12th century Church of St. Philibert at Tournus, France, and serves as a beacon along one of Buffalo's major residential thoroughfares.

The church showcases Byzantine decorations and features Tiffany stained glass windows. A Noehran Organ with 76 ranks and 3,668 pipes is a centerpiece of the church. It also features the faulted and domed interior.

During the Pan American Exhibition of 1901, President Theodore Roosevelt attended services there.

In 1924, William C. Francis, a local artist and member of the Church's congregation, installed an elaborate painted iconography.

The First Presbyterian Church is affectionately called The Mother of Churches; it enjoys a proud history and tradition of reaching out to the newest and poorest of immigrants as they came to Buffalo.

History of Williamsville United Methodist Church

In 1809 a determined 19-year old named Glezen Fillmore fulfilled his life's mission to preach the Word of God by becoming the first Methodist minister in western New York. In his years as a circuit rider, Fillmore started numerous church societies in many communities, including the new cities of Rochester, Buffalo, and Lockport.

Notable among them was the First Society of the Episcopal Methodist Church, founded in 1834, which was the first religious society formed in the Town of Amherst. The Holland Land Company bestowed a deed to a plot of land to the First Society for the purpose of building a church. When the building was completed, the first Methodist church in Erie County was dedicated in 1844. This church became Williamsville United Methodist Church after the portion of Amherst where the church was located became incorporated as the Village of Williamsville in 1896.

The walls of the original 1844 building still protect the sanctuary of the present church. Through the years, nearly every generation has improved the building to meet the needs of its members. The building as we know it today was dedicated in 1975. Within this sanctuary, more than 160 years of devotion to Christ and nurturing of a loving Christian community can be felt by all who come to worship here.



Williamsville United Methodist Church
