

We were proud to sing the world-premier performances of "Yes!" at our June 2008 concerts. The text is based on the poem, "Tableau", published in the collection, "Color", by Countee Cullen*. It tells the story of two boyhood friends, one black, the other white, openly sharing their friendship in the racially hostile environment of a southern community of the early 1900's.

"Yes!" was composed in 2007 by Adolphus Hailstork, a world-famous composer, on BGMC's commissioning of the work.**
BGMC has commissioned and introduced a number of new musical compositions. The Chorus is proud that "Yes!" was one of them.

In July, the Chorus attended the GALA Choruses, Inc. week-long international gathering of member choruses in Miami (3,500 to 5,000 singers present), where it introduced "Yes!" to the international music community.

GALA Choruses, Inc. encourages the commissioning by its members of new musical works. At the Miami convention, GALA Choruses honored BGMC's role in the creation and presentation of "Yes!" to the GALA Choruses' repertoire with a \$3,500 grant toward BGMC's expenses. BGMC gratefully acknowledges this gift.

Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus

The meteoric artistic growth and audience expansion of this region's only all-male chorus led to its nomination and award as 2008's Outstanding Arts Organization. This award is given annually by the Arts Council of Erie and Niagara County. Under the professional direction of Barbara Wagner, the all-volunteer chorus presents a wide ranging repertoire including classical, contemporary, Broadway, pop and multi-cultural music that can only be produced by an established gathering of well trained male voices.

Entering their eighth year of performing, the chorus draws thousands of people to four major sold-out concerts annually. In 2008 – 2009, the chorus will expand its concert series to nine concerts. The Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra has invited the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus to perform with the orchestra on two occasions; under the baton of Associate Conductor, Ron Spiegelman in 2003 and in 2006 under the direction of Maestra JoAnn Falletta. The chorus has also performed as part of the Ars Nova Viva Vivaldi Series, conducted by Mary Louise Nanna. In 2007, the chorus recorded a double CD entitled "Celebrate!" to celebrate their fifth anniversary.

The chorus regularly donates its services to help fundraisers or simply to entertain at community-wide and gay community events. They have performed at benefits for the music program at the Amherst Unitarian Universalist Church, the restoration of Blessed Trinity Roman Catholic Church, the annual World AIDS Day Memorial Service and the AIDS Community Services fundraiser, Cause for Celebration, to name only a few. In 2005, they were recognized by the Empire State Pride Agenda Foundation with a prestigious community service award for "..... excellence of the music, raising awareness and their dedication to the (gay) community.

The Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus is dedicated to act as a positive model to those in the community who may be grappling with the negative connotations some people in our society place on gay people. To that end, they are committed to producing vocal music of high quality in the rich tradition of men's choral singing.

Music Notes Barbara Wagner and Jason Ward

In the Bleak Midwinter Gustav Holst; Christina Rossetti

This lovely poem, written before 1872, is in the posthumous collection "Poetical Works," 1904, of Christina Rossetti, the deeply religious daughter of an Italian émigrée academic and an English mother. Composed by well known composer, Gustav Holst (1874-1934), the tune "Cranham" was paired with Rossetti's poem in The English Hymnal, 1906.

Although Christmas was linked by the 4th century church with December 25 as part of a strategy to Christianize various mid-winter solstice pagan festivals, there is no biblical association of the birth of Jesus with midwinter.

Velvet Shoes Randall Thompson; Elinor Wylie

Randall Thompson achieved extraordinary success not only as the nation's pre-eminent composer of choral music, but also as a highly respected educator who was instrumental in establishing the great choral masterpieces as standard repertoire for fine college, university and community choruses. I daresay that Thompson's work inspired many of our church musicians to look long and hard at the caliber of choral music they offered their congregations each week. Leonard Bernstein and Samuel Barber were among his students during a two year stint as director of the Curtis Institute. Elinor Wylie was born in 1885 in Philadelphia to a very wealthy family. Well known for her beauty, she was privately educated. She was married three times and divorced twice. She spent much of her life in an unsuccessful search for her true soul mate. Elinor's poetry was distinctive for its irony, grace, elegant and subtle imagination and crystalline lucidity. I think you'll find a bit of each of those characteristics in her lovely poem, "Velvet Shoes."

Bel Bambino Alexander Peloquin; Paul Claudel

"Bel Bambino" was arranged by late composer and former music Minister of the Rhode Island Catholic Cathedral, Dr. C. Alexander Peloquin. Translated from a poem by French author Paul Claudel, it was said that Claudel had lost his faith, and later experienced a conversion while attending a service and listening to a choir sing vespers at the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Paris on Christmas Day.

Ocho Kandelikas

Flory Jagoda

Flory Jagoda (1925 - ____) maintains one of Judaism's rarest and richest cultural traditions through her perform once of authentic as well as original compositions of Sephardic songs. Flory grew up in the Sephardic tradition in Sarajevo, Bosnia. Known as the Feast of Dedication or the Feast of Lights, Chanukah celebrates the victory of the Jewish people over the Syrian Greeks in 165 B.C.E. and the miracle of a small cruse of oil burning for eighth nights.

Chanukah is celebrated with gifts, burning candles, parties and delicious food.

Lift a Glass to Friendship Norman Luboff

This rollicking drinking song, better known to Buffalonians of Polish descent as whoo pie, shoo pie, began its life 200 years ago as a Polish army song. Norman Luboff's arrangement has the men of the village drinking the night away, along with Mayor Drobney. We're not quite sure how Laszlo got in there, but he is having a grand time with his Polish friends.

Feliz Navidad

José Feliciano

This song is one of the most popular and often-heard songs of the holiday season. It was written and recorded by the Puerto Rican Feliciano in 1970. The words come from a common holiday greeting, "Feliz Navidad, prospero año y felicidad", and are meant to wish us all a prosperous year and happiness.

The Sleigh

Richard KuntzKountz

You'll think you're listening to the laughter and joy of a Russian sleigh ride, when you hear this rollicking song by Richard Kountz. Believe it or not, it was composed in 1926. Just for fun, try saying "with a hey, hah, hah, hah, ho, hah, ho" 5 times as fast as you can, and see what kind of trouble you'll get into.

Thankful

David Foster, Carol Bayer Sager and Richard Page

This song was composed by David Foster, Carole Bayer Sager, and Richard Page and had its debut on Josh Groban's 2007 holiday album entitled 'Noel'. It reminds us of how easy it is to get caught up in ourselves and lose sight of 'the joy that surrounds us' and that 'there is so much to be thankful for'.

Baby, It's Cold Outside

Frank Loesser

Frank Loesser wrote this pop standard in 1944 and premiered it with his wife at their housewarming party. Loesser sold the rights to MGM in 1948 after years of informally performing the song on various occasions. It was used in the 1949 film, 'Neptune's Daughter' which featured two performances of the song: one by Ricardo Montalban and Esther Williams, and the other by Red Skelton and Betty Garrett. The performances earned Loesser an Academy Award for Best Original Song.

You're a Mean One, Mr. Grinch Albert Hague

From the 1966 cartoon special 'How the Grinch Stole Christmas', the singing credit for this song is often mistakenly attributed to Boris Karloff. Though Karloff served as the narrator and speaking voice of the Grinch in the special, the lyrics were actually performed by Thurl Ravenscroft who was not listed in the closing credits. The lyrics were written by Theodore Seuss Geisel, who is better known to children all over the world as Dr. Seuss, and the music was written by Albert Hague.

Carol of the Bells

Mykola Leontovych

This choral miniature work was originally composed by the Ukrainian composer and orthodox priest, Mykola Leontovych. Although it has become a popular holiday tune, the original lyrics had nothing to do with Christmas. It was a winter well-wishing song titled 'Shchedryk' (which translated means 'bountiful') and told the tale of a swallow calling out to the master of a home and telling him of all the wealth he will possess in the coming year – healthy livestock, money, and a beautiful wife. American choir director and arranger Peter Wilhousky wrote new lyrics for the song because it reminded him of bells. It has since become associated with Christmas because of the new lyrics, which include references to silver bells, caroling, and the line 'merry, merry, merry Christmas'.

I Wonder As I Wander

Appalachian Carol collected by John Jacob Niles

This haunting song has its origins in a song fragment collected on July 16, 1933 by folklorist and singer, John Jacob Niles. He first heard the song in the town of Murphy in Appalachian North Carolina, where he was attending a fundraising meeting held by evangelicals who had been ordered out of town by the police. A little girl had stepped to the edge of the little platform hitched to a truck. She began to sing. Her clothes were dirty and ragged, and she, too, was unwashed. Her ash blond hair hung down in long skeins, but best of all, she was beautiful, and, in her untutored way, she could sing.

She smiled sadly, as she sang. It was only a fragment – two or three lines. She repeated the fragment seven times at 25 cents each. Niles left with three lines of verse, a garbled fragment of melodic material and "I Wonder as I Wander" became a part of folk history.

The Snow Lay On the Ground David Conte

This lovely piece for Male Voices, Piano and Harp was composed by the distinguished West Coast composer, David Conte. The anonymous 19th century poem tells the story of the Nativity as written in the Bible. Each verse is followed by a different setting of the Latin words, *Venite adoremus Dominum*. The music is exquisitely crafted by the brilliant Maestro Conte, who was one of the last students of the legendary Nadia Boulanger. Currently, Conte is Professor of Composition and Conductor of the Conservatory Chorus at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. In 2005, he collaborated with composer Todd Boekelheide on the film score for the documentary "Ballet Russes," shown at the Sundance and Toronto Film Festivals in 2005. He is having a brilliant career as a composer, conductor and scholar and we are proud to perform one of his fine works.

Hard Candy Christmas Carol Hall

This song was written by composer/lyricist Carol Hall for the musical, 'The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas'. It's sung near the end of the show when the girls of the brothel are preparing to leave. This song is widely attributed to Dolly Parton, who played the role of Miss Mona in the film version of the musical and was the featured soloist for the piece.

White Christmas

Irving Berlin

One time Buffalonian Irving Berlin wrote this song in 1940 while sitting poolside at the Arizona Biltmore Resort and Spa in Phoenix, Arizona. It was introduced by Bing Crosby in the 1942 film 'Holiday Inn' where he sang it as a duet with Marjorie Reynolds. The song went on to receive the Academy Award for Best Original Song. In the original script, Reynolds (whose voice was actually dubbed by Martha Mear for the film) ßßå©actually sang, not Crosby, who was to have sung the song. 'White Christmas' was also the title theme for the 1954 film starring Crosby, Danny Kaye, Rosemary Clooney and Vera-Ellen.

Do You Hear What I Hear? Noel Regney and Gloria Shane This seasonal standard was written in 1962 by Noel Regney and his then wife Gloria Shayne. More than 120 versions of this song have been recorded, in musical styles ranging from jazz and New Age to funk and

reggae. It was written as a clear and plaintive plea for peace at the time of the Cuban missile crisis, in October 1962. In a 1985 interview with The New York Times, Mr. Regney said "I am amazed that people can think they know the song -- and not know it is a prayer for peace."

Finally Here

Eric Helmuth is a composer of choral, concert and church music, with over 20 published works. His commissioned works have premiered in such venues as New York's Carnegie Hall and Symphony Hall, Boston. When we did our very first concert way back in 2002, we sang a beautiful love song composed by Eric Helmuth. He heard about it and sent the chorus and me a beautiful note congratulating us and wishing us well as we embarked on our BGMC journey. Eight years later, we're singing another gorgeous love song by Eric, called "Finally Here." This song touches our hearts in many ways and so we want to dedicate this song to our friends and loved ones in the gay community and to our friends and loved ones who are always at our sides.

About the Artists



Incorporated in 2000, the **Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus** (BGMC) performs a rich catalog of classical, contemporary, Broadway, pop and multi-cultural music. The repertoire is as diverse as the 62 men who are singing with pride as

members of the BGMC.

The BGMC has been honored by the Empire State Pride Agenda with a Community Service Award. This award was given in recognition of BGMC's efforts to raise awareness and to enlighten our region through song. To that end, the BGMC has performed in a variety of venues throughout Western New York and in Pennsylvania and Ontario for many community events. Additionally, the BGMC traveled in 2004 to Montreal and again in 2008 to Miami to participate in the seventh and eighth quadrennial GALA Festivals, international gathering of gay and lesbian choruses. BGMC won the *Artvoice* Best of Buffalo 2008 Award for Best Choral Group. Also in 2008, the BGMC was honored by the Arts Council of Buffalo and Western New York, with its prestigious award for Community Service. It was a glorious day.

While maintaining a strong presence within the gay community, the BGMC also has been privileged to perform with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra at Kleinhans Music Hall on two occasions. It has also done benefits for the Amherst Unitarian Universalist Church music program, Blessed Trinity Roman Catholic Church's restoration, the annual World AIDS Day Memorial Service and the AIDS Community Services fundraiser, Cause for Celebration. Additionally, BGMC performed for the arrival of The Amistad, participated in "Gusto at the Gallery" at the Albright-Knox Art Gallery, sang at an Ars Nova Musicians "Viva Vivaldi" Concert, sang at Fredonia College for its diversity and multicultural groups and also performed at the Nichols School as part of its Diversity Week activities. Of course, our four major concerts (this year, increased to nine) annually bring our work to thousands of listeners in the Western New York area.

The BGMC is a New York not-for-profit corporation of member singers and supporters, dedicated to producing high quality vocal music in the rich tradition of men's choral singing. Through its music, the Chorus endeavors to entertain and enlighten, create harmony and celebrate personal and community pride.



Barbara Wagner (Artistic Director) has served as Minister of Music at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo for 44 years. She was the director of choral activities at the Nichols School for more than 24 years and served the congregation of Temple Beth Am as its Music Director for 12 years. She was in charge of vocal activities at the Buffalo Seminary for several years and conducts the Unitarian Universalist Church Choir as

well as the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus. In addition to its Sunday morning responsibilities, the UU Church Choir has made two highly acclaimed European tours, the first to Germany, Austria and the Czech Republic and the second to Ireland, Wales, England and Scotland. In the Fall of 2006, the choir did a short concert tour of the Northern Adirondacks. The UU Church Choir, under the direction of Ms. Wagner, has recorded for American Public Radio, and has performed locally with members of the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, with the Amherst Saxophone Quartet and with the Ars Nova Chamber Orchestra. Ms. Wagner was the conductor for the Peace Odyssey Tour of Hungary and the former Soviet Union. Choral singers from all over the USA participated in this tour. She was a member of the prestigious seven member Hymn book Resources Commission that was responsible for the denominational hymn book, Singing the Living Tradition, published in 1993. She was the chair of the New Hymns Task Force, which produced Singing the Journey, another denominational song book, published in June, 2005.

She ran a choral program at Nichols High School that involved over 100 young singers, including a concert chorus, women's ensemble, men's ensemble and a mixed chamber group. She was also guest conductor for the City of Good Neighbors Chorale.

Ms. Wagner earned a BFA degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo, where she studied Organ with Squire Haskin. She has done graduate work at Westminister Choir College. She did advanced Organ study with Karl Richter at Munich Conservatory and has done advanced conducting study with Raymond Harvey, the former Assistant Conductor of the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra and presently the Music Director of the Kalamazoo Symphony. Ms. Wagner regularly attends choral workshops led by many of the most prestigious choral conductors in this country. Rodney Eichenberger, the late Robert Shaw, Paul Salumonovich, Robert Page, Vance George and Dale Warland are just a few of the greats with whom she has worked.

She is a member of The American Choral Director's Association, Erie County Music Educators Association, MENC, Unitarian Universalist Musician's Network (founding member, former vice president and board member), NYSSMA, American Guild of Organists (former program chair and sub dean of the Buffalo Chapter) and Chromatic Club. She was presented with the Erie County Music Educator/Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra award for excellence in choral education in May of 2002. Ms. Wagner has been included in editions of both Who's Who in American Women and Who's Who in America. She is the proud charter Artistic Director of the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus.



A native of North Carolina, **Debi Overton**(Accompanist/Conductor), has held positions as coach/accompanist at the University of Texas at Austin and served as Director of the Chamber Music Program at The New School of Music in Philadelphia. For many years, she was active at the Summer Music Festival in Aspen, Colorado. As the coach/accompanist for the choral department in Aspen, she served as assistant to noted conductor Fiora Contino. She has

assisted in preparing choruses and soloists for such conductors as Tamara Brooks, John Nelson, Robert Shaw and Sergei Commissiona. Additionally, she has coached with coach/accompanists David Garvey, John Wustman, Brooks Smith and Dalton Baldwin and the local master, Livingston Gearhart.

Ms. Overton has accompanied Master Classes for Luciano Pavarotti, Phyllis Curtin, Jessye Norman, Leontyne Price and Sylvia McNair. She has accompanied the regional Metropolitan Opera auditions in Greensboro, NC, Philadelphia, PA, Atlanta, GA and New York City. Considered by her peers to be "one of the finest sight readers in the country", she offers nuances and subtle interpretations of music that have been enjoyed and applauded by thousands of listeners throughout the United States. Recently reviewed, Ms. Overton was touted as "a musician's musician" in the *Buffalo News*.

In addition to her duties as Organist and Choir Master at Calvary Episcopal church in Williamsville, NY, Ms. Overton is a past chair of the Music Commission of the WNY Episcopal Diocese; currently serves as a member of the Board of Directors for the American Guild of Organists and is active in Western New York teaching, guest conducting, accompanying and performing with singers and instrumentalists.

Barbara Levy

Barbara began her musical career at the ripe age of 12 in 1958 when she was under contract with A.B.C. Paramount Records. Barbara Lyons (as she was called back then) recorded singles written by Carole King and arranged by Dick Wess ("Mack the Knife") and even cut a children's album with Woody Herman's bass player, Chubby Jackson.

During a 35-year hiatus, she raised a family, owned a lefty bookstore, graduated from business school and went on to earn masters degrees in special education and social work. Next, she launched and maintains today a flourishing practice in marriage and family therapy.

Announcing Barbara's return to performing in 1998 was the release of a CD of jazz and pre-war standards ("They're Writing Songs of Love...") and began gracing the stages locally and in New York City. She also performed in Havana, Cuba until travel restrictions halted such exchanges between musicians. A second CD, "Peel Me a Grape" was released in 2003 and was well received by jazz lovers everywhere.

Barbara's educational experiences included the Eastman School of Music as well as studying at the University of Massachusetts' famed "Jazz in July" program as one of only 14 vocalists selected through audition. There she worked with such greats as Yusef Lateef, Dr. Billy Taylor and Sheila Jordan.

Today, as Barbara enjoys her "golden years, she continues to study, perform and thrill audiences of all ages.
