

	work as a Naturalist, The Parkway was designed by Olmsted "as a route of access"
	from the secondary parkland, The Parade to the "large common park of the City",
	Delaware Park. This broad thoroughfare was designed with central roads and walks
	for "pleasure travel." Roadways outside of this area would "answer the purpose

Second floor has two semi-hexagonal bay windows. The eastern bay window has a center multi-light door. Double hung 1/1 windows. Fluted end corner Ionic pilaster strips. North side has second floor oriel with supporting end brackets. Paired brackets under projecting cornice. Tri-part window has 3 lights each decorated with stain glass.
