

- THANKS -

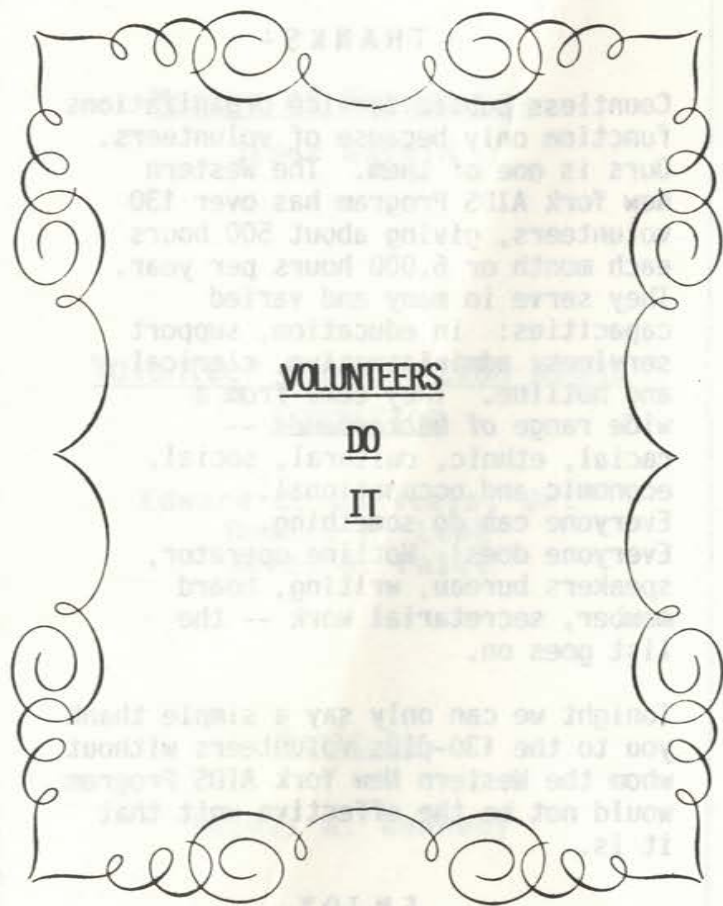

Why Volunteer? — A View from a Volunteer

How and why am I a volunteer at the WNYAP? I attended the seminar and workshop (very professionally done) sponsored by the WNYAP. These sessions heightened my knowledge about AIDS and the needed support programs. I also visited the County Public Library and researched and read books and periodicals on AIDS, and I am still doing this.

The "why" was more soul-searching. To me the AIDS patient is a neighbor facing a whole new and unexpected crisis in his life as he is confronted with physical and emotional pain. Upon diagnosis, he may become shocked, confused, bitter, rejected by society, subject to mood changes, facing hopeless pain and loss of dignity. He desperately needs the support of those in medical, professional and social services. I could not offer that type of assistance, so my only choice was to offer my volunteer service. Supportive care becomes very vital to the PWA. I can offer him understanding, compassion, passionate concern, and as the disease progresses, tender and loving care.

In addition, I can offer spiritual guidance as needed or requested by the PWA or by the family members at time of loss or bereavement. My frequent visits can also offer valuable feedback to the WNYAP.

There will be heart-warming times and heart-wrenching times. There will be days of joy and days filled with tears. But my strength will come from God who is my strength. I'm glad to be part of a pioneer program. The need is great, perhaps you could help.
