Dear Fellow Church Member:

As General Chairman of our Expansion Fund Canvass it is my great pleasure to tell you more of the Canvass and its events.

The Canvass will be limited to the solicitation of individual members and member families and any other persons and families who consider themselves affiliated with or use our Church, although not technically members. We will concentrate our efforts to obtain pledges from all our families during an intensive solicitation period between the fifteenth and the twenty fifth of March.

Since we believe face-to-face solicitation to be the best, each family of the Church will be visited and solicited individually and privately in their home during the Canvass period. There will be no solicitation in groups or meetings - nor will any solicitation be conducted by mail or telephone.

Every member of the Canvass Organization (a member of the Church) will have made a generous and realistic pledge before he visits any family of the Church. Also he will be giving much of his time toward the Canvass and its successful conclusion on March 25th.

The Canvass is being conducted in an effort to increase our present Church facilities, to renovate the existing structure, to pay off the present indebtedness and to properly finance the operation of the Church. This will allow our Church Leaders to plan a more effective over-all program than is possible at the present time.

A Loyalty Dinner meeting will be held at Howard Hall (YWCA) at 6:30 PM, Monday, March fourteenth. The objective and other phases of our canvass will be explained.

As we enter into this cooperative program together, all of us must try to do whatever we are able to do, willingly, thoroughly, and promptly in accordance with the plan of the Canvass.
