# Vocalis to be our guests in January concerts

One of the premier musical groups in Western New York will be guests of the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus on January 25 and 26. Vocalis Chamber Choir began in September 2002 with the mission of encouraging the singing of great a cappella choral music from the Middle Ages to the present. Along with the BGMC, Vocalis is one of the contributors to the long choral tradition of Western New York.

Currently in its sixth season, the choir has performed at many venues around Buffalo, including St. Paul's Cathedral, Christ the King Seminary Chapel, St. Joseph's University Church, Blessed Sacrament Church, and Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. Consisting of 16 voices, membership consists of music educators, church musicians, and other talented professionals. Vocalis strives to achieve a uniquely intimate and moving choral experience.

The choir rehearses weekly and presents six to eight concerts a year. "New Day," their first CD, has been praised by the Buffalo News and regularly featured on WNED-FM. The choir's 2007-2008 season includes performances throughout Western New York with music celebrating faith, love, folk and popular song, and the prose of William Shakespeare. In addition to their regular concert schedule and being our guests in January, the choir will travel to Pittsburgh in April for a concert at First Presbyterian Church.

# BGMC helps raise \$2,500 to benefit Darwin Martin House

What happens when the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus, Amherst's Ethan Allen Design Center, and Frank Lloyd Wright's Martin House Restoration Corporation join forces? Music, high-end design products, and a dedicated non-profit group come together to benefit the world's most famous architect's premier Prairie-style complex, the Darwin Martin House in North Buffalo.

About one hundred invited guests raised \$2,500 at the three-hour event on November 14. "The Martin House was Wright's Prairie-style 'Opus,'" said Mary Roberts, Restoration Corporation's executive director. "That's a great musical metaphor for this collaboration with the BGMC tonight and Ethan Allen."

About fifty-five of the BGMC's seventy voice chorus performed atop modular cubes in the conference area. Artistic director Barbara Wagner led the ten selection thirty minute program, which included songs from the chorus' repertoire and newer material from "The Proud and the Passionate" concerts to be performed January 25 and 26.

"It was a well-planned event, one of the more fun benefits we've done," said Ms. Wagner. "This is always one of the more rewarding aspects of the chorus, to help worthy causes in our community and the region."

A question and answer segment followed Ms. Roberts' twenty minute presentation on the current status of the Darwin Martin House located near the Buffalo Zoo.

According to Roberts, the initial \$7 million project has increased to \$50 million for the five structure project at 125 Jewett Parkway. So far, \$19.5 million in public funds and \$17.5 million has been invested in the restoration. A gift shop is now open and a visitor's center is planned.

The Frank Lloyd Wright complex includes the Martin House, George F. Barton House, the Martin pergola, conservatory, carriage house and Gardner's cottage. Wright's iconic "Tree of Life" art glass window is among almost four hundred others and original furniture featured. Surrounding gardens also are being restored.

Almost every morning, before I begin my day, I spend a few minutes thinking about the many things I'm grateful for - the things I'm proud and passionate about, if you will. Inevitably, my beloved BGMC singers are very near the top of the list and some days right at the top. The love, the dedication, the lovalty and the exuberant singing are amazing things to behold. Our own joys and sorrows bubble over at breaks in rehearsals, in phone calls, e-mails, even at Pano's and we're there to exult with the joyful and comfort the sorrowful among us. This young organization is most worthy of the passion and pride many of us


We'll be singing the music that magnifies these powerful feelings at our January concerts, "The Proud and the Passionate" on January 25 and 26. (For those of you who plan far in advance, the Spring Concerts will be held on June 20 and 21 this coming year.) The "Ave Maria" by Franz Biebl and the rapturous "Amor de mi Alma" by Z. Randall Stroope are two of the most breathtakingly beautiful songs we've ever sung. They're about two of the powerful emotions that tend to touch our lives the most deeply - our profound faith, whether it be religious or an abiding faith in humanity, and a love so deep and passionate that it transcends life. We feel privileged to be able to perform these masterpieces for you.

Johannes Brahms composed a stunning piece for mezzo soprano and men's chorus. I'm absolutely delighted to tell you that we now have a fine countertenor, Rob Szustak, singing with us. Rob will be singing the mezzo soprano solos. As you might suspect, mezzo sopranos are usually not too fond of countertenors! At my behest, Rob will be singing this gorgeous solo along with the chorus, in lieu of any of the fine female mezzos in Buffalo.

We'll also be singing the well known "Barcarolle" from "Tales of Hoffmann." Think about handsome Venetian gondoliers with fabulous voices. There is a cry for peace section, where we'll sing Stephen Stills' (of Crosby, Stills and Nash) "Find the Cost of Freedom" as well as local composer Marty Wimmer's award winning "Peace." On the lighter side, you'll hear a very silly song about alley cat love and a funky song called "Good Old A Cappella." It's time to get serious again with Rogers and Hammerstein's "We Kiss in a Shadow" from "The King and I." Billy Joel's "For the Longest Time" and the big Queen Latifah number from "Hairspray," "I Know Where I've Been."

Vocalis, the finest chamber chorale in the area, will perform on this concert with us as well. We are very proud that they and their fine conductor, Jamie Burritt, have agreed to join us.

We've been busy these past few months both organizationally and individually. The BGMC board has been working at a record pace. Russ Link has had an exhibit of his spectacular photos



## In the spotlight: Russ Link

Born in the borough of Queens, in the great city of New York in 1932, Russ Link's life was rich and colorful even before he ever became a part of the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus. He was in the Air Force between 1950-1954 serving one year in Korea. His photos of that time have been on display at the Karpeles Museum on Porter Avenue, Michael Gillis' Elmwood Framing, and the Butler Library on the campus of Buffalo State

College. Russ taught English and theater in the Buffalo Public School system for thirty years before his retirement. A cancer survivor since 1992, Russ lives in Arlington Park with John Jubulis, his partner of 28 years. Their beautiful house is home to several feline companions: Luigie, Cali, and Frizzy.

Bill Smith, a friend of Jim Estep, invited Russ to host what might have been the first fundraiser for the BGMC. That event earned over \$1000 but it was just the beginning. Next came Russ' service on the first board of directors. He joined the chorus as a singer during the second season and never looked back. Russ has sung in every concert since and made the trip to GALA in Montreal in 2004.

"I never dreamed there would be a gay men's chorus in Buffalo," he says, "nor that I would have such a part in getting it started." Russ places great emphasis upon the leadership of Barbara Wagner. "She's the greatest, superb," are just a few of the praises Russ heaps upon our esteemed artistic director.

What is Russ' favorite piece of music? I was not surprised by his answer. "I Ain't Afraid" by Holly Near. That choice fits perfectly along side Russ' adamant position that, at its formation, the chorus should be named the Buffalo GAY Men's Chorus. He also has a fondness for "Non Nobis Domine" and the "Rhythm of Life."

Russ' devotion to the chorus shows itself in the long, long hours he spends selling ads for the concert programs and working with Robin Johnson at Vilardo Printing in seeing the final product completed. But as important as the regular concerts are, Russ believes that the pro bono work of the chorus is even more vital. The recent fundraiser for the Darwin Martin Complex at the Ethan Allen Gallery is just one example. And who will ever forget when we "raised the roof" at Blessed Trinity Roman Catholic Church on Leroy Avenue.

Now in cyberspace, Russ is even a radio personality with his own program on internet radio www.ThinkTwiceRadio.com. Click on his program "Sunglasses at Midnight" where you can listen to his interview with Barbara Wagner from last December as well as his programs on gays in the military, gay marriage, and gays in politics.

Looking back over his life, Russ counts his 28 year relationship with his partner John, being a part of the chorus' beginning, and singing under Barbara's leadership as the things he cherishes most. He was deeply touched by the generous donations for the Friends of the BGMC at his 75th birthday celebration.

We of the BGMC cherish Russ' contributions to our common life as well as the joy of his friendship.

During the slide presentation, Roberts showed shots of different reconstruction phases including major repairs to the foundation, exterior and interior. Gutters alone cost \$2 million. More than 100,000 visitors are expected to visit every year.

Graycliff, the summer estate of the Darwin Martin family, also was designed by Wright. Found in Derby, NY south of Buffalo, the house is situated on several wooded acres high above the shore of Lake Erie and is also open for summer, holiday, and winter tours.

Mike Liska, president of the BGMC board of directors, shared a brief history of the chorus and its mission statement. He followed Ken Slomovitz, a managing partner of the Ethan Allen Design Center, located at 3875 Sheridan Drive near Harlem Road and the I-290. Slomovitz welcomed BGMC and invited guests.

Michael Osika, an Ethan Allen partner and Martin House docent, spoke briefly after Ms. Roberts' presentation. A BGMC supporter, he originally made the 'Opus' connection between Wright's Prairiestyle complex and the chorus.

"We've done many events here for groups as Buffalo Hospice, Womens and Children's Hospital as well as Kevin Guest House, the first such non-profit home in the nation for families of those in hospitals," added Osika. "This was a great tie-in for the BGMC, the Martin House, and Ethan Allen."

The BGMC has performed at many, diverse benefits in Buffalo, Western New York, and Northern Pennsylvania. These have included the Buffalo Animal Shelter, World AIDS Day Memorial Service, restoration of Blessed Trinity Roman Catholic Church, and AIDS Support Group in Erie, PA.

Food and beverages were served afterwards as BGMC singers mingled with invited guests and Ethan Allen staffers. People enjoyed walking through the design center's many separate showrooms, containing stylish furniture, and decorative pieces.



A venture of this magnitude takes great financial support. Coming up:








Voting members of the chorus elected Ryan McKane at a special election held in December to fill the unexpired term of Tim Mahiques who resigned because of work commitments.
