Two and a half story frame house with Stick styling. Cross gable roof with three dormers. Two gabled dormers on front facade have single pane double hung windows. Gabled dormer on east side of house. Clapboard with half timbering on second floor and in gable. First floor is brick. Porch on east side of front facade has squared columns and curved brackets with brick balustrade. Entrance on east side of house. One story SIGNIFICANCE pavillion in center of east side of house.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Good example of the stick style as it was used around the turn of the century. Jewett Parkway was originally opened in 1875 by Elam J. Jewett whose estate was at the southwest corner of Main Street and Jewett Parkway. The street followed Olmsted's plan for the Parkside neighborhood and can be seen on his 1876 map of the City of Buffalo. In 1884, Elam Jewett deeded the street to the City of Buffalo, "on condition that it shall be placed in charge of the Park Commissioners and be by them maintained as a Park approach, in the same manner as the other Park approaches now are or hereafter may be maintained."
