

17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS: (Indicate if building or structure is in an historic district)

Building is situated on a standard sized corner lot within Olmsted's Parkside subdivision. House is located two blocks from Delaware Park, which was designed by Olmsted and is listed on the National Register, and southeast of the Zoo.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): Two and a half story Craftsman style. Front facing gable roof with extending side eaves. Exposed rafter tails. Bargeboard with curved ends. Over-scale curvilinear brackets. Partial width trellised porch. Trellised entrance hood with supporting bracket. Glass and wood paneled door. First and second floor SIGNIFICANCE 6/6 windows. Second floor window shutters with heartshaped cut-out pattern. Gable has pair of 4 light

windows.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: Typical vernacular version of the Craftsman style. Summit Avenue is a truncated north-south street, located between Woodward and Crescent Avenues and extending from West Oakwood Place to the northern section of Crescent Avenue. A similar street, ending south of Jewett Avenue, appears in Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." Summit Avenue was deeded to the city in 1889, except for the small section between Amherst and Crescent which was deeded in 1892. This street follows Olmsted's rule that it "not lead with special directness toward the town."
