## Tennis

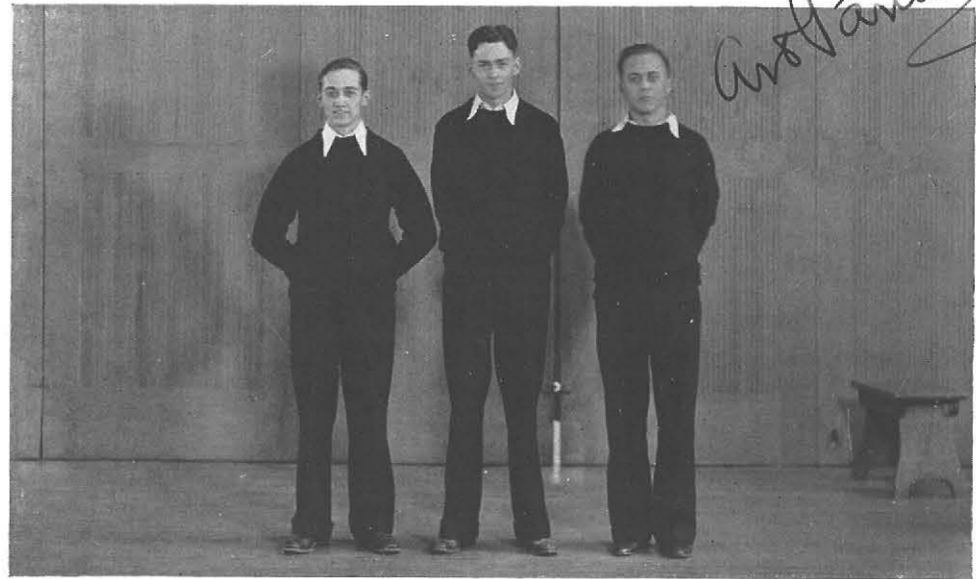
The Tennis Team which represented State for the past season of 1932 was in every way worthy of the college and the sport.
