





Dear Friends and Music Lovers,



Welcome to our second annual Holiday Concert, "Joyful and Triumphant". It's wonderful to see so many old and new friends here, and we hope you'll find something special on this concert that will touch your heart and keep you warm for the rest of the winter. For me, each of the songs are special, but there are two this time that touch my heart every time we work on them. I'm not going to tell though — we'll check with each other during the receiving line.

One of the fine conductors in our GALA movement shared with all of the other Artistic Directors on our E-List the following excerpt from a wonderful new book called *The Elegance of the Hedgehog* It's from the journal of a precocious 12 year old French girl, who happens to be on her way to the gymnasium for the school concert. Every word went directly to my soul – I laughed and cried and my heart was full. I hope you feel the same way!!

She says, "Every time, it's a miracle. Here are all these people, full of heartache or hatred or desire, and we all have our troubles and the school year is filled with vulgarity and triviality and consequence, and there are all these teachers and kids of every shape and size, and there's this life we're struggling through full of shouting and tears and laughter and fights and break-ups and dashed hopes and unexpected luck- it all disappears just like that when the choir begins to sing. Everyday life vanishes into song, you are suddenly overcome with a spirit of brotherhood and sisterhood of deep solidarity, even love, and it diffuses the ugliness of everyday life into a spirit of perfect communion. Even the singers' faces are transformed. I see human beings surrendering to music.

"Every time, it's the same thing, I feel like crying, my throat goes all tight and I do the best I can to control myself but sometimes it gets close. I can hardly keep myself from sobbing. So when they sing a canon I look down at the ground, because it's just too much emotion all at once. It's too beautiful with everyone singing together, this marvelous sharing. I'm no longer myself, I am just one part of a sublime whole, to which the others also belong, and I always wonder at such moments why this cannot be the rule of everyday life, instead of being an exceptional moment, during a choir.

"When the music stops, everyone applauds, their faces all lit up, the choir radiant. It is so beautiful. In the end, I wonder if the true movement of the world might not be a voice raised in song."

I believe those words with my whole heart because beautiful and loving choirs have taught them to me.

Have a wonderful Holiday Season, and we hope that you enjoy our concert.

Music Notes

Cedric "Flip" Taporco, Jason Ward and Barbara Wagner

Veni, veni Emmanuel is a synthesis of the great "O Antiphons" that are used for Vespers during the octave before Christmas (Dec. 17-23). These antiphons are of ancient origin and date back to at least the ninth century. The hymn itself was composed in the 12th century in French and the Latin version of the hymn is from the 18th century. BGMC is singing the first antiphon, which is sung on December 17, in both Latin and English.

Shehecheyanu

The Shehecheyanu blessing was introduced to encourage the Jewish people to offer thanks for new and unusual experiences. It is typically recited at the beginning of holidays and to celebrate special occasions. Hence, it is always recited or chanted on the first day of Hannukah. The Hebrew text and translation follow:

Baruch atah Hashem (Adonai*) eloheinu melech ha'olam shehecheyanu v'ki manu v'higiyanu lazman hazeh.

Blessed are you, our God, Creator of time and space, who has supported us, protected us and brought us to this moment.

The use of Hashem replaces Adonai. Both words mean God. Hashem, which literally means "the name", is used in more casual speech.

Named an "American Choral Master" by the National Endowment for the Arts in 2005, Lauridsen was awarded the 2007 National Medal of Arts, the highest artistic award in the United States, by the President in a White House ceremony "for his composition of radiant choral works combining musical beauty, power and spiritual depth. The men of BGMC and I couldn't agree more!

Am I Welcome Here?

Eric Lane Barnes

Many gay people (male and female) have struggled with finding acceptance in a community of faith. This tender ballad describes the journey of a gay man as he tries to find a loving church home.

Goin' To Bethlehem

Jay Althouse

This rollicking modern spiritual by Jay Althouse is a celebration of the birth of Jesus by those who were witness to it.

The First Noel/Canon in D

This lovely arrangement by Michael Clawson combines the tune and text for the traditional English Carol, The First Noel, with the tune for the well known Canon in D by Johann Pachelbel (1653-1706), one of the most famous composers of the Baroque Period. The result is charming.

The Virgin's Slumber Song Max Reger (1893-1916)
This seemingly simple lullaby finds us listening to the new Mother, Mary, singing to soothe her newborn baby into slumber. "Mary rocks her Jesus Child, while the Summer breeze sighs through the leaves. A tiny bird sings softly – sleep sweet, tiny baby. Sleep now. Happy is your smile. Lay your tired head on your Mother's breast. Sleep, sweet tiny baby."

Max Reger was a prolific composer, contributing to every genre. He was considered a revolutionary composer, yet he had the distinction of drawing passionate criticism from both ends of the musical spectrum. To conservatives, his harmonic progressions were harsh and unmannerly; to musical progressives, his love of Bach, Brahms and Mozart as well as his elaborate counterpoint were considered "retro!" He is quoted as saying, "I can say with a clear conscience that of all living composers, I am perhaps the one who is most closely in touch with the great masters of the past." This comment, of course, pretty much alienated him from both sides, although Debussy, Bartok, Szymanowski and Prokoviev were his staunch admirers.

El Nacimiento "The Birth"

"The night of love's power is announced. Jesus is born of petals and flowers. All is silent. Peace to the people – it is Christmas. Low in the manger, the baby sends peace and love. His smile brings a radiant glow. Angels are singing over the door. The baby has been born. It is Christmas."

Los Reyes Magos "The Three Kings"

"Three Kings have come riding from afar – Melchor, Gaspar and Balthazar. They bring soft, white alpaca ponchos and Christmas cakes. See how sweetly the baby sleeps. The kings are weary from following the star. The infant awakes and laughter lights his eyes and then he smiles and the sun lights the skies."

"Move on, little donkey. Herod is here with a sword at his side. We must hide the baby. Hush little one, don't cry. I am holding you safe in my arms. Move on little donkey. Beautiful child, don't cry. The land where we take you is lovely. We will be there soon. Move on ("Vamos").

"Navidad Nuestra," "Our Birth," was created for a native tableau, in which each moment of the Mystery of the incarnation is expressed in a popular manner, with all of the tenderness that the Miracle of two thousand years ago evokes in the spirit of the "simple people." Ariel Ramirez gave to each episode of the "Navidad" a distinctive regional voice. Tender and simple verses were necessary: words which were able to repeat the emotion with which the Nativity miracle was felt. Felix Luna was the poet who collaborated with Ramirez. The music and the lyrics together made possible the success of a form that has Hispanic American characteristics without losing its universal content. This presentation has joined together the creative talent and interpretative emotion of many men and women who give testimony to the continuing mystery of love and faith whose dimension acknowledges no boundaries, that expresses with dignity and beauty, with words and melodies the vivid spirit of the Hispanic American land.

Nigun Bialik

Traditional Melody arranged by Abraham Wolf Binder

A Nigun is a wordless or humming tune often used as "centering music" by Jews prior to the start of worship. Considered to be the language of children, some Jews say that singing a Nigun is the fastest way to "get the ear of God." This Nigun is by Abraham Binder and is a tribute to Hayyim Nahman Bialik (1873-1934), who is called the "national poet" of Israel to this day.

Believe

Alan Silvestri and Glen Ballard Arranged by Eric Lane Barnes

A gift from Jason Higbee to the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus

My dearest Barbara and to the most amazing group of men I will ever know, I began this journey of having this piece written just after our last Christmas concert. I was amazed with the arrangement and performance of "Thankful" last season and wanted to choose another piece that opened my eyes and made me see the beauty and joy that are the voices of the BGMC.

The lyrics in the refrain really touched my heart and soul most often in the times of change and indecision in my recent past.

> "Believe in what your heart is saying, Hear the melody that's playing. There is no time to waste, There so much to celebrate. Believe in what you feel inside, Give your dreams the wings to fly."

You have everything you need, if you just believe . I often teach my employees about my "blind faith" and how we may not know what the future will bring or why we do certain things, but know in our souls that, just as the lyrics state, "you'll have everything you need, if you just BELIEVE" This statement also holds true for our amazing group. Regardless of what is happening in the world, we are a family, we must stick together, if not for ourselves, for those in whose lives we make a difference. The BGMC has truly changed my life for the better. I couldn't imagine my life without it! "Tust Believe."

Eric Lane Barnes The Annoying Drummer Boy In a twist on the familiar tale of the young percussionist, the "Silent Night" is interrupted, much to the dismay of residents (human and otherwise) of Bethlehem. Needless to say, those present at the manger are not at all appreciative of the incessant drumming.

Hard Candy Christmas

This song was written by composer/lyricist, Carol Hall for the musical, "The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas." It's sung near the end of the show when the girls of the brothel are preparing to leave. This song is widely attributed to Dolly Parton, who played the role of Miss Mona in the film version of the musical and was the featured soloist for the piece.

White Christmas Irving Berlin

One time Buffalonian Irving Berlin wrote this song in 1940 while sitting poolside at the Arizona Biltmore Resort and Spa in Phoenix. It was introduced by Bing Crosby in the 1942 film, "Holiday Inn", where he sang it as a duet with Marjorie Reynolds. The song went on to win an Academy Award for best original song. "White Christmas" was also the title theme for the 1954 film starring Crosby, Rosemary Clooney, Vera-Ellen and Danny Kaye

O Tannenbaum/Trees

This lovely arrangement (by a favorite composer of the BGMC, the one and only Eric Lane Barnes) pairs the traditional German carol with a poem by the American poet, Alfred Joyce Kilmer, known as "Trees." Kilmer was a prolific poet whose works celebrated his religious faith, as well as the common beauty of the natural world.

Ave Maria

Franz Biebl

Probably German composer Biebl's best known and beloved choral composition, the work was brought to the United States by the Cornell Glee Club after hearing it while on a European tour.

We Rise Again

Leon Dubinsky

Leon Dubinsky lives with his wife and children on Cape Breton Island at the tip of Nova Scotia, in Canada. On the day he composed "We Rise Again," he recalls, he was watching his ailing father play with his grandchildren. Dubinsky's father had immigrated to Canada from the Ukraine, settling in Cape Breton. He would die a year later in 1985. The words just came to him, Dubinsky says, explaining that the words, "waves roll on over the waters and the ocean cries", refer to the cycles of immigration and the struggles of the uprooted who must begin anew in a strange land. Young Leon, the immigrant's son, grew up in Temple Sons of Israel in Nova Scotia. It was there that he sang in the Temple choir and was soon developing his own musical style.

Auld Lang Syne

Old Scottish Tune

Arranged by Kathleen McGuire

Auld Lang Syne is a traditional Scottish poem that was adapted by Robert Burns in 1788. In English, a literal translation is "old long since," or more colloquially, "long, long ago" or "days" of long ago. When Burns presented the song to the British Museum, he remarked: "The following song is an old song, of the olden times, and which has never been in print or even in manuscript, until I took it down from an old man's singing." The arrangement emphasizes the song's Scottish roots, including voices imitating bagpipes, melodic ornamentation and accompaniment provided by tin whistle and acoustic guitar.

About the Artists

B Gay Men's Charus

Incorporated in 2000, the **Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus**(BGMC) performs a rich catalog of classical, contemporary,
Broadway, pop and multi-cultural music. The repertoire

is as diverse as the 62 men who are singing with pride as members of the BGMC.

The BGMC has been honored by the Empire State Pride Agenda with a Community Service Award. This award was given in recognition of BGMC's efforts to raise awareness and to enlighten our region through song. To that end, the BGMC has performed in a variety of venues throughout Western New York and in Pennsylvania and Ontario for many community events. Additionally, the BGMC traveled in 2004 to Montreal and again in 2008 to Miami to participate in the seventh and eighth quadrennial GALA Festivals, international gathering of gay and lesbian choruses. BGMC won the *Artvoice* Best of Buffalo 2008 Award for Best Choral Group. Also in 2008, the BGMC was honored by the Arts Council of Buffalo and Western New York, with its prestigious award for Community Service. It was a glorious day.

While maintaining a strong presence within the gay community, the BGMC also has been privileged to perform with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra at Kleinhans Music Hall on two occasions. It has also done benefits for the Amherst Unitarian Universalist Church music program, Blessed Trinity Roman Catholic Church's restoration, the annual World AIDS Day Memorial Service and the AIDS Community Services fundraiser, Cause for Celebration. Additionally, BGMC performed for the arrival of The Amistad, participated in Gusto at the Gallery at the Albright-Knox Art Gallery, sang a Viva Vivaldi Concert with the Ars Nova Musicians, sang at Fredonia College for its diversity and multicultural groups and also performed at the Nichols School as part of its Diversity Week activities. Of course, our six major concerts annually bring our work to thousands of listeners in the Western New York area.

The BGMC is a New York not-for-profit corporation of member singers and supporters, dedicated to producing high quality vocal music in the rich tradition of men's choral singing. Through its music, the Chorus endeavors to entertain and enlighten, create harmony and celebrate personal and community pride.



Barbara Wagner, Artistic Director of the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus, has served as Minister of Music at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo for 45 years and was Director of Vocal Activities at Nichols School for more than 24 years.

The Choir at the UU Church, in addition to its Sunday morning responsibilities, enjoyed two highly acclaimed European tours: the first to Germany, Austria and the

Czech Republic, and the second to Ireland, Wales, England and Scotland. The Choir, under Ms. Wagner's direction, has recorded for American Public Radio, performed locally with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra (BPO), the Amherst Saxophone Quartet and the Ars Nova Musicians. Ms. Wagner was the conductor for the Peace Odyssey Concert Tour of Hungary and the former Soviet Union. Choral singers from all over the US participated in this tour.

She ran a choral program at Nichols High School that involved more than 100 young singers, including a Concert Chorus, Women's Ensemble, Men's Ensemble and a Mixed Chamber Group. She was also guest conductor for the City of Good Neighbors Chorale, Buffalo's Gay/Lesbian chorus in the mid 1980s.

Ms. Wagner earned a BFA Degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo, where she studied organ with Squire Haskin, and completed graduate work at Westminster Choir College. Her advanced studies include organ with Karl Richter at the Munich Conservatory and conducting with Raymond Harvey, formerly Assistant conductor of the BPO and presently Music Director of the Kalamazoo Symphony.

She is a member of the American Choral Director's Association, the Erie County Music Educators Association, MENC; Unitarian Universalist Musicians Network (founding member, former vice president and board member); NYSSMA; the American Guild of Organists (former sub-dean and program chair for the Buffalo Chapter); and the Chromatic Club of Buffalo. She was a member of the Hymnbook Commission for Singing the Living Tradition and served as chair of the New Hymns Task Force of the Unitarian Universalist Association. She is presently the Moderator of the 900 member Unitarian Universalist Musicians' Network.

Ms. Wagner is the recipient of the Buffalo Philharmonic/Erie County Music Educators Award for Excellence in Choral Music in 2002, and has been included several times in Who's Who in American Women and Who's Who in America.



A native of North Carolina, Debi Overton (Accompanist/Conductor), has held positions as coach/ accompanist at the University of Texas at Austin and served as Director of the Chamber Music Program at The New School of Music in Philadelphia. For many vears she was active at the Summer Music Festival in Aspen, Colorado. As the coach/accompanist for the Choral Department in Aspen, she served as assistant to noted conductor Fiora Contino. She has assisted

in preparing choruses and soloists for such conductors as Tamara Brooks, John Nelson, Robert Shaw and Sergei Commissiona. Additionally, she has coached with coach/accompanists David Garvey, John Wustman, Brooks Smith. Dalton Baldwin, and the local master, Livingston Gearhart.

Ms. Overton has accompanied Master Classes for Luciano Pavarotti, Phyllis Curtin, Jessye Norman, Leontyne Price and Sylvia McNair. She has accompanied the regional Metropolitan Opera auditions in Greensboro, NC; Philadelphia, PA; Atlanta, GA; and New York City.

In addition to her duties as Organist and Choir Master at Calvary Episcopal Church in Williamsville, NY, Ms. Overton has enjoyed the position of accompanist for the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus since it's inception in 2001; is a past chair of the Music Commission of the WNY Episcopal Diocese: currently serves as a member of the Board of Directors for the American Guild of Organists; and is active in Western New York teaching, guest conducting, accompanying and performing with singers and instrumentalists. In November of 2007, Debi was the musical director and conductor for the WNY premiere performance of Leonard Bernstein's MASS.
