#### SOJOURNER TRUTH

Sojourner Truth was a former slave who became a leader in the battle against slavery. She was freed under the New York Gradual Emancipation Act.

Sojourner fought her battles from the lecture platform and in the courts. There is some evidence that Sojourner gave help to slaves escaping through the Underground, but the only slave she actually freed herself was her son, but he was freed through the court action. Her lecture activities brought her almost instant fame. Although she was illiterate, she had the power to captivate her audience. Her witty replies to hecklers became legendary, though in one famous instance she became a heckler herself and stopped Fredrick S. Douglas cold.

After the Civil War, Sojourner Truth was active in fund raising projects to assist the free men and women, and in the cause of women's suffrage. She settled in Battle Creek, Michigan but continued traveling on lecture tours until a few years before her death in 1883. She was about eighty five years old at the time of her death and was buried in Oakhill Cemetery in Battle Creek, Michigan.

#### HISTORICAL BRIEF

The Late Emma Odessa Young, a realtor in New York City and member of the New York Club Business and Professional Women, conceived the idea of a National organization. Unfortunately, Mrs. Young became an invalid and was unable to work toward this end.

However, on July 12 and 13, 1935, Mrs. Ollie Chinn Porter, President of the New York Business and Professional Women's Club, invited the Philadelphia and the Atlantic City Clubs to New York City to join to form a national organization. A three-day conference was held at the YMCA in New York City. A committee consisting of Ollie Chinn Porter, Effie Diton of New York City, Bertha Perry Rhodes, Josephine Keene, Adelaide Flemming of Philadelphia and Pearl Flippen of Atlantic City all came together to form the National Association of Negro Business and Professional Wom-

en's Clubs. Mrs. Porter was elected chairman, Mrs. Diton the national organization organizer and Mrs. Flippen the Secretary and Treasurer.

After a year of meetings, the first convention was held in Atlantic City, New Jersey on July 9, 1936 at the Asbury M. E. Church on Artic Avenue. Elected officers were: National President, Mrs. Ollie Chinn Porter, New York City; First Vice-President, Mrs.Bertha Perry Rhodes, Philadelphia; Recording Secretary, Mrs. Marguerite Creth Jackson, New York City, and Secretary/ Treasurer, Sara Taylor, Atlantic City, NJ. State organizer for New Jersey was Mrs. Emma Goodwin, State organizer for Pennsylvania was Mrs. Josephine Keene. Thus, was the beginning of charter clubs from New York City, NY, Philadelphia, PA and Atlantic City, NJ.

That these black women had the courage to find an optimistic organization is astounding and is lasting testimony to their faith in themselves, their people, and the future.

# Dr. Catherine Fisher Collins 2016 SOJOURNER TRUTH AWARDEE

Dr. Catherine Fisher Collins is an associate professor at SUNY Empire State College at Buffalo, NY. She is being honored for her outstanding work in health care in the Buffalo community focusing on the health care of women: homeless, incarcerated and African American women in particular. Her work is recognized throughout Western New York, state wide, nationally and internationally.

Her concern for the health care of the most vulnerable among us is commendable. She identifies the issues and seeks solutions to those issues. She arranges health screenings and follow-up sessions to help women address their particular needs. She is actively supporting a transition house for women released from prison. This is being done with the help of the New York Commission of Corrections. Dr. Collins started a women's radio program to educate and inform women in the area about health and social issues that affect them and their loved ones. The show, which is very popular, 'Women's Health with Dr. Catherine Collins'', airs twice monthly on 1400 WWWS AM. It is the only radio show devoted entirely to women's health.

Dr. Collins began Project Love and Hope that serves homeless children in New York, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Virginia and Washington, DC. She has partnered with the Army Reserve Health Center at the Masten Avenue Armory in Buffalo to set up a volunteer weekend clinic to provide needed health services for children attending Public School #44 and residents of the Fruit Belt neighborhood with limited or no insurance. The clinic was staffed by Army Medical Personnel, Dr. Collins and other health professionals who volunteered their time.

The author of numerous books and publications that focus on the health care of incarcerated women, African American women and girls, and the homeless, Dr. Collins is widely sought as a consultant and presenter. Internationally, she has presented to South African women prisoners, University of South Africa Law School, Women Prisoners in Johannesburg and Pretoria, guest lecturer in Nigeria on Child Development.

Dr. Collins received a Nurse Practitioner Certification-SUNY Buffalo, BS Education-SUNY Buffalo, MS Education-SUNY Buffalo, D, Ed. Degree-Education Administration/Leadership, Organizational Development SUNY Buffalo.

For her exemplary work, she has received many prestigious awards. One cherished award is the "Altes Prize for Exemplary Community Service". Other notable awards: National Board of Jack and Jill of America, Inc., (several), Western New Women's Hall of Fame, State of New Jersey Heritage Award, Black Achievers Community Service Award, Coalation of 100 Black Women Award, Buffalo Branch NAACP Community Service Award, Attica Prison NAACP Humanitarian Award, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Xi Epsilon Omega Chapter, and many more.

Dr. Collins has memberships in many organizations: For Women Only, Buffalo Board of Education, New York State School Board's Association Cultural Diversity Committee, Health Committee of WNY, Buffalo Links, Inc., Jack and Jill of America, Inc., Buffalo Black Media Coalition, and many, many more.




