Who waits the last clear trumpet-call of God.

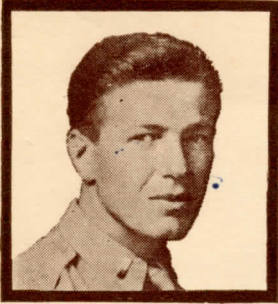
Long years ago as earth lay dark and still,

Look down to bless our lesser Calvaries.

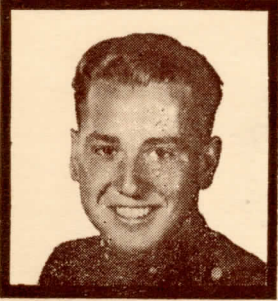
These were his servants; in his steps they trod,

Commits her children to thy gracious hand.

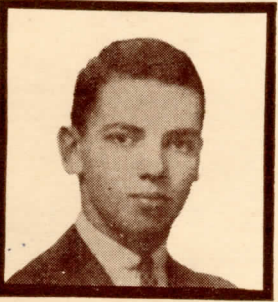
