Thank you for your participation as a presenter in the *Workshop for Prospective Members of the Buffalo Board of Education (and their campaign managers!)* on Jan. 27 at the Community Foundation's Community Room.

As you saw, the turn out was excellent, and it was rewarding to see the interest and commitment so many people feel for Buffalo's future and its school children. Your presentation helped to make this workshop a resounding success for these participants.

As part of our grant from the Tower Foundation, ECASB is submitting a comprehensive evaluation of the event, based upon participants' survey responses.
