Program Notes

Judy Garland

One of the gay community's most beloved artists of all-time has remained, Judy Garland. Her strong stage presence, her iconic movie roles and her recordings continue to live on. "Over the Rainbow," without question is one of the most popular movie songs in history. No tribute to this lady could be done without her "anthem". "The Trolley Song," from the 1944 film *Meet Me in St. Louis*, is also closely identified with Judy. In 1963 CBS produced *The Judy Garland Show*. On October 4th, a young singer, Barbra Streisand appeared. That appearance brought the now legendary duet with Judy singing "Get Happy," one of Judy's standards with Barbra's "Happy Days Are Here Again."

Barbra Streisand

Another long admired singer, Barbra Streisand, often referred to simply as Barbra, has spent the last several decades amazing audiences with her vocals. *Funny Girl*, a Broadway musical based on the life of Fanny Brice sold to packed houses nightly. Her 1964 album, *People* knocked The Beatles, *A Hard Days Night* album out of No.1. While the song "People" is closely identified with her, "Don't Rain On My Parade" also coming from *Funny Girl* was a huge showstopper. In 1965 she sang a medley of songs on her one woman special *My Name is Barbra* in which she closed with an original Brice song, "My Man," that has been a long Streisand favorite.

Cher

Another Diva with long staying power is Cher. Starting her career with husband Sonny Bono, they were the most popular singing couple from the 60's till the early 70's. During this time Cher did a lot of solo singles and albums that did even better. The haunting "Dark Lady" was a big hit for her. After some time her popularity slowed down a bit. Then in the late 80's she returned with even bigger hits like "If I Could Turn Back Time," which included a scandalous video at the time of its release. Today Cher continues to pack arena's everywhere. With her outlandish style, her iconic voice, her dance hits, her LGBTQ advocacy and her transgender child, Cher's connection with the gay community has grown over the years. She's one of the greatest gay icons. Her longevity in entertainment owes much to having one of the largest and most loyal gay followings ever.

Aretha Franklin

Aretha Franklin, who spent her early years in Buffalo, New York began singing in church. As she approached her late teens she began performing jazz, pop and soul with great success on the popular Columbia label.

However, when her contract ended she signed on Atlantic Records where she was crowned The Queen of Soul. Her No.1 hit, "Respect," was written and first recorded by a man, the late Otis Redding ("Sitting On The Dock Of The Bay"). She turned it big with the women's liberation movement and made it her anthem.

Bette Midler


Bette Midler, or as more commonly referred to by her informal stage name, The Divine Miss M, is a singer, songwriter, actress, comedian, and film producer with a career spanning over a half of century. Bette started to rise to prominence in 1970 when she began performing in the Continental Baths, a gay bathhouse in the Ansonia Hotel. During this time she became close to her piano accompanist, Barry Manilow, who produced her first album in 1972, *The Divine Miss M*. Bette's first album became a million selling platinum album making Billboards Top 10 and earning Midler the 1973 Grammy Award for Best New Artist. The Album featured three hit singles - "Do You Wanna Dance?", "Friends," and "Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy"- the third which became her first No. 1 Adult Contemporary hit. In the late 1990's, during the release of her Bathhouse Betty album, Bette commented on her time performing there, "despite the way things turned out [with the AIDS crisis], I'm still proud of those days. I feel like I was at the forefront of the gay liberation movement, and I hope I did my part to help move it forward. So, I kind of wear the label 'Bathhouse Betty' with pride."

Madonna

Often referred to as the "Queen of Pop," Madonna achieved popularity by pushing the boundaries of lyrical content in mainstream popular music, and imagery in her music videos. Madonna is known for reinventing her music and image, and received critical acclaim for her musical productions which have been known to induce controversy. In January of 1989 Madonna signed an endorsement deal with Pepsi, where she debuted her song "Like a Prayer." The corresponding music video featured images of many Catholic symbols, leading the Vatican to condemn the video. This resulted in Pepsi revoking her commercial and sponsorship. The song went on to reach No. 1 when it was released on the album Like a Prayer. "Express Yourself" was also a hit single from the Like a Prayer album. The lyrics talk about rejecting material pleasures and only accepting the best for oneself. "Express Yourself" received positive reviews from critics, who applauded the gender equality message of the song and complimented the song for being a hymn to freedom and encouragement to woman and all oppressed minorities. Shortly after the success of Like A Prayer, Madonna came out with "Vogue." The song

and video were inspired by the dance of the same name, performed in New York clubs in the underground gay scene, in which dancers used as series of complex hand gestures, body poses and movements to imitate their favorite Hollywood stars and cover models from "Vogue" magazine. Madonna has been known for speaking out for the LGBTQ community, she has spoken out against bullying, anti-gay laws in Malawi and Russia, and the Boy Scout's anti-gay policy. Madonna's advocacy for the LGBTQ community was acknowledged when gay news magazine "The Advocate," named her the "greatest gay icon" in 2012.

In June 2011, Madonna urged her fans to support same-sex marriage in New York, posting the following message on her website: "New Yorkers your voices must be heard. Tell your state Congressmen to support same sex marriage bill. All you need is love." The Marriage Equality Act passed one week later, legalizing same-sex marriage in New York.

Tina Turner

Tina Turner first covered "Proud Mary" in 1971 with her husband at the time Ike Turner. The Ike and Tina version differed greatly from the original version of the song, but has become one of Tina's most recognizable signature songs. Tina was recognized by the Kennedy Center Honors where then President George W. Bush commented on Tina's "natural skill, the energy and sensuality," and referred to her legs as "the most famous in show business."

Gloria Gaynor


Gloria Gaynor made her major breakthrough into the disco dance scene with her hit "I Will Survive." "I Will Survive" will always be a quintessential gay anthem because of its message of triumph over heartache and fear. The song was awarded the only Grammy Award ever for Best Disco Recording in 1980. Gloria would forever emblazon herself in the hearts of gays everywhere when she released "I Am What I Am," a cover of the song from the Broadway show *La Cage aux Folles* in 1984.

Diana Ross

"Ain't No Mountain High Enough" was Diana's first No. 1 hit after launching her solo career. Diana had been the lead vocalist with the Supremes. In 1980 she would launch her album *Diana*, which included international hit "I'm Coming Out." "I'm Coming Out" is one of the most energetic and inspirational gay anthems ever, forever enshrining Diana Ross, the beautiful, stylish pop legend, in the pantheon of gay icons. She's the epitome of glitz, glam, talent, a diva personality, big hair and an over-the-top wardrobe. With her 1980 hit she has made gay men feel like bosses just like Ms. Ross the Boss.

The Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus

At end of 1999, the vision for a Gay Men's Chorus in Buffalo was conceived. Guided by Roger Parris, a vigorous group of men explored this concept thoroughly. With the support and success of the Rochester Gay Men's Chorus behind them, these men decided that it was time for Buffalo to join the growing list of LGBT choruses all over the world.

After 15 months of intense work, a Steering Committee had written bylaws, filed papers of incorporation, raised seed money, written a mission statement and elected officers. After a thorough search, Barbara Wagner was asked to be the Founding Artistic Director and would join the ranks of only two female conductors of Gay Men's Choruses. Wagner, in turn, requested that Debi Overton-Niles be invited to serve as the Founding Accompanist.

The first auditions were held in May 2001, and rehearsals were to begin on September 11, 2001, a day of infamy in our nation. The men and Wagner held hands that first rehearsal and sang- "from you I receive, to you I give, together we share and from this we live." We also learned "How Can I Keep From Singing" and began forging the bonds that still hold us together today. "How Can I Keep From Singing" became our theme song and was the very first music our first audience heard as the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus processed down the aisles of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Buffalo.

Our February 2002 inaugural concert, "Music From the Heart", set the tone for our future. The energy that surrounded the BGMC that night validated the reality of our beloved chorus, and the bonds we formed continue to remain strong. The audience that first night was huge- the church was filled, chairs lined the aisles and sadly, people had to be turned away at the door. Our audiences continue to be large and diverse, and we now sing three performances in each concert series.

We have been the gracious recipients of many awards, including three awards from Artvoice's "Best in Buffalo" found us elected as "Best Chorus" and the prestigious Buffalo and Erie County Arts Council Award for exceptional contributions to the arts and cultural community in Western New York. The BGMC has also been a recipient of community service awards from AIDS Community Services, and has been recognized by the Empire State Pride Agenda in 2005 with the ESPA Award for Community Service for the excellence of their music and their dedication to the community. We have also had the tremendous honor of performing with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra twice, once in 2004 and again in 2006 under the direction of Joann Faletta. We have also performed on the Ars Nova "Viva Vivaldi" series, by the request of Marylouise Nanna.
