On Saturday, September 12, the Buffalo Gay Men's Chorus discovered the truth of this statement as they performed at Lenna Hall on the grounds of beautiful Chautauqua Institute. We were invited to be a part of the Rainbow Pride Connection Conference held that weekend. It was the first ever GLBT conference to be held on the grounds of the Chautauqua Institution.

In the off season as few as 400 people actually live on the grounds in contrast to 10,000 visitors at the height of the summer. One can barely walk around the busy streets.

Upon arrival the grounds seemed so large and empty that we wondered where the people would come from to fill the hall. Our fears were misplaced as the doors opened and the appreciative audience flooded in.

Our voices filled the acoustically wonderful hall with the one of our "best of" concerts. Compared to the silence outside, the contrast was amazing. Barb, Debi and the singers gave their all and the audience warmed to each selection.

Following the concert, many chorus members were housed overnight on the grounds as guests of those who reside at Chautauqua all year round. It was a unique opportunity to continue reveling in the atmosphere of one of the most respected institutions in the United States. The ambience of this unique place of Americana is not lost on even the most casual observer.

The whole experience was quite thrilling and well worth the round trip ride.




Again, thank you for your unswerving loyalty and generosity. We look forward to seeing you at one of our concerts.
