

Brick one story projecting wing has horizontal band of four square-headed 6/1 windows. Upper porch balustrade with urn shape balusters, cut-out pattern. Square-headed seconfloor 9/1 windows. Hip roof dormer has a pair of 6/1 windows.

	was a pre-existing street incorporated into Olmsted's parkside subdivision with
	restrictive residential development. The land was conveyed to the Parkside Land
	and improvement Co., by Elam R. Jewett in November of 1885, at a cost of \$44,158 The land was to be developed according to a subdivision map drawn up by Jewett
	with one stipulation, that a "factory for the manufacture of cement shall not be
	erected."
