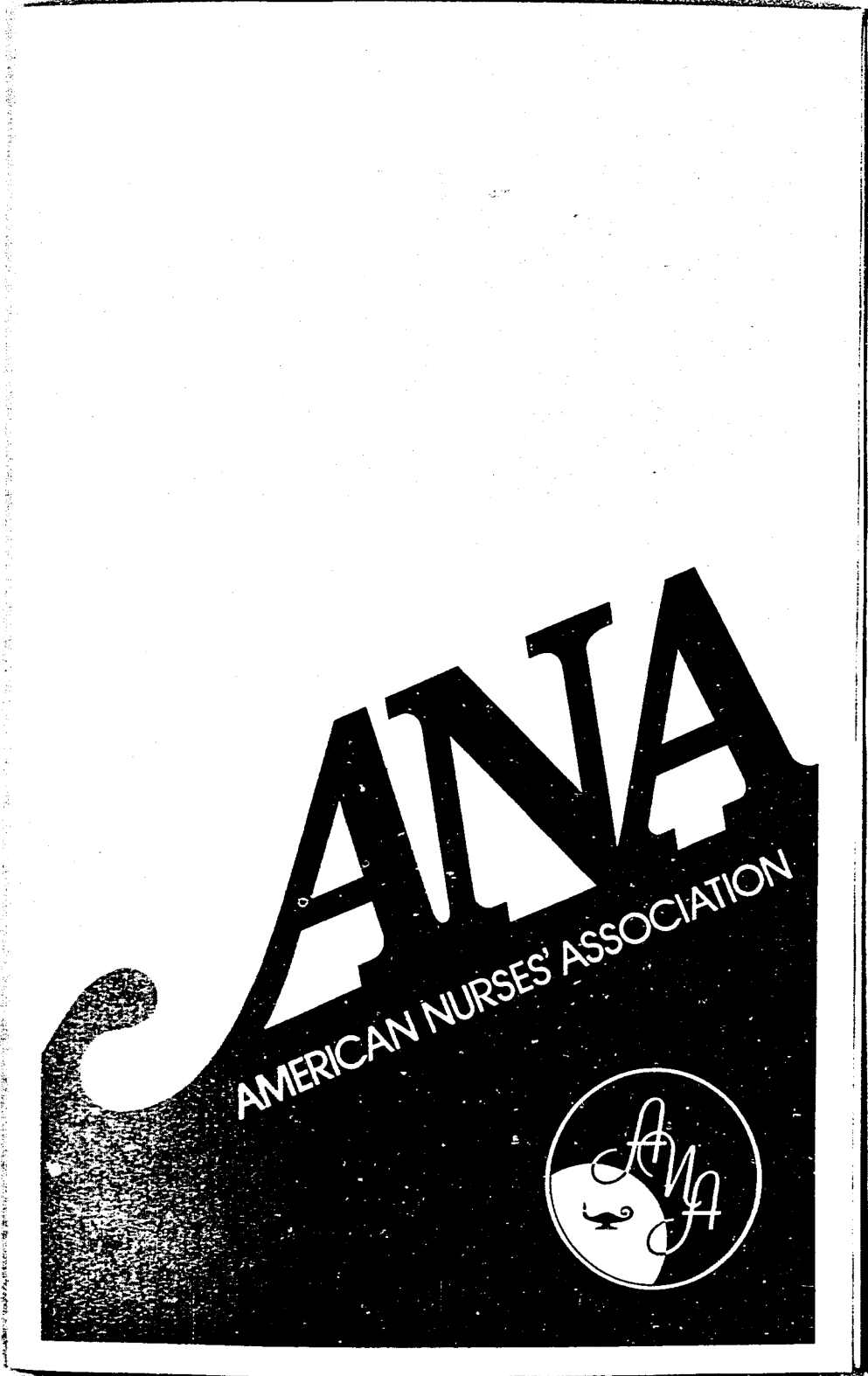

This is to inform you of the program for the awards luncheon, Issues for Women in Nursing and Other Professions. Formal programs will be printed and distributed at the door. I have advised all awardees to come at least 15 minutes early (11:45 a.m.) to the Grand Ballroom E in the Anaheim Marriott, as the doors will be open at 11:30 a.m. The luncheon is scheduled to begin at 12:00 noon and end at 3:00 p.m.

For the luncheon, you will be seated at a head table. The 16 honorees will be just below a stage with a podium. After dessert has been served, or at 1:30 p.m., whichever comes first, Dr. Carnegie begins the program by walking up to the podium on the stage and extending greetings and comments (limited to five minutes) on minorities in nursing and the women's movement. Dr. Hunter will follow up on stage with comments (limited to five minutes) on human rights in nursing and the women's movement. I will then briefly introduce each of the awardees and the keynote speaker, Barbara Nichols.

Ms. Nichols will speak for 15 minutes. Dr. Carnegie will then make a short statement about the awards and its purpose. Then I will introduce each awardee individually to come up on stage and receive her plaque. Each awardee has been told to limit their acceptance speech to two minutes. I have estimated the program will be approximately 1-1/2 hours long, keeping to the time limitations stated above, and allowing for time for each awardee to come up to the stage.

If you have any questions, please call me before June 2, which is when I will leave for California. I look forward to seeing you then.
