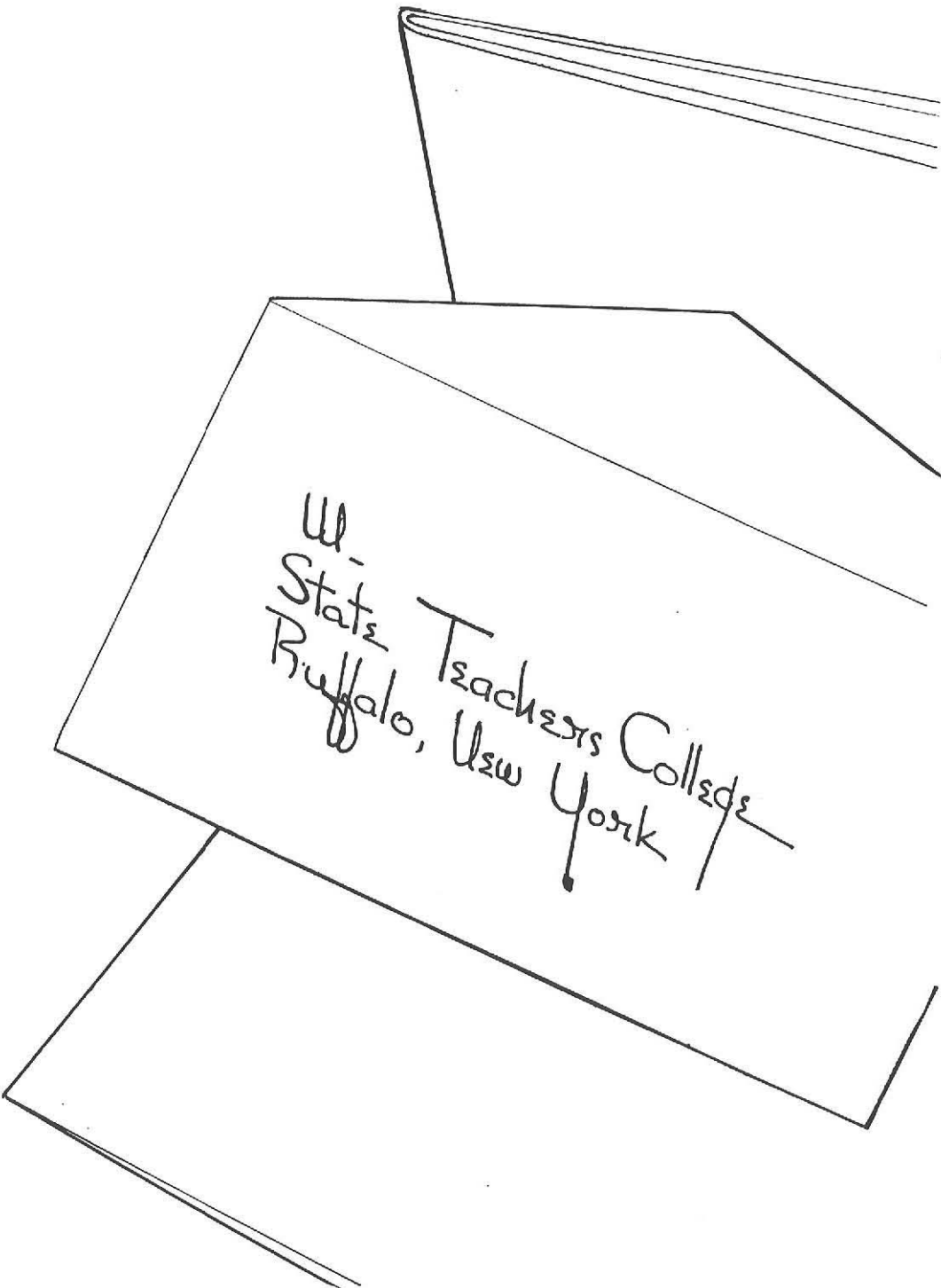

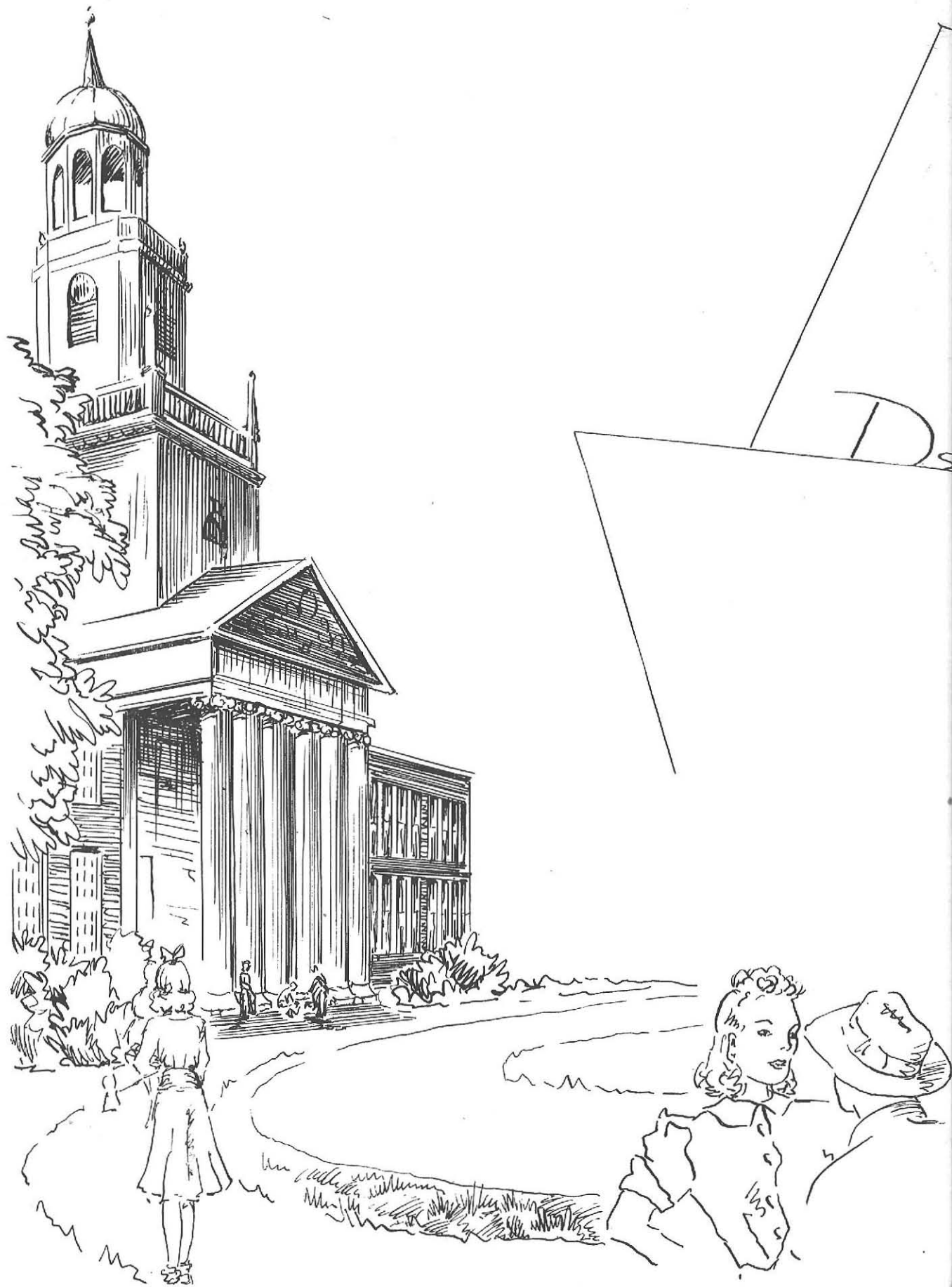

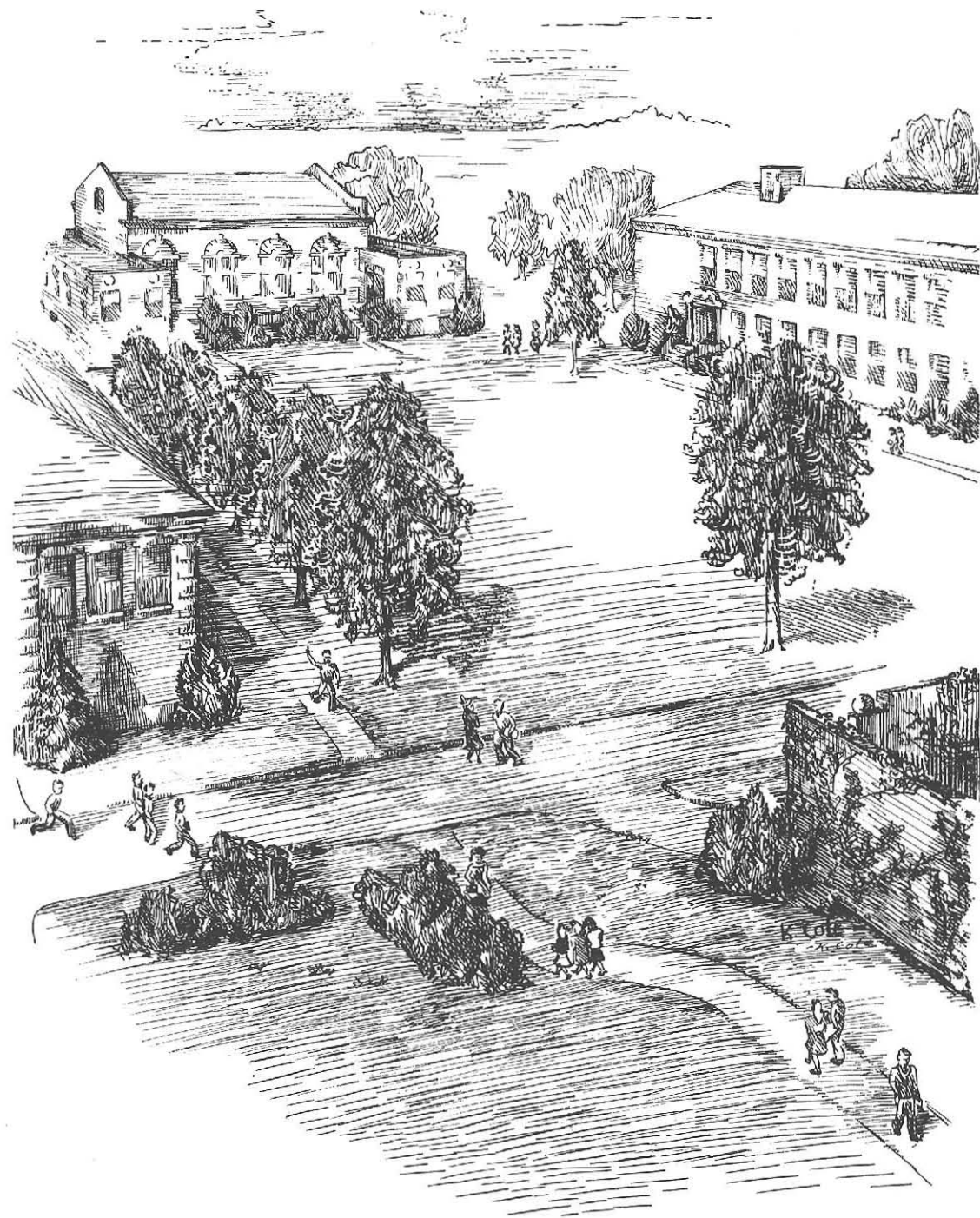
To Dr. Kate Vixon Wofford, nationally outstanding in the field of rural education, we dedicate the 1940 ELMS as an expression of our esteem.

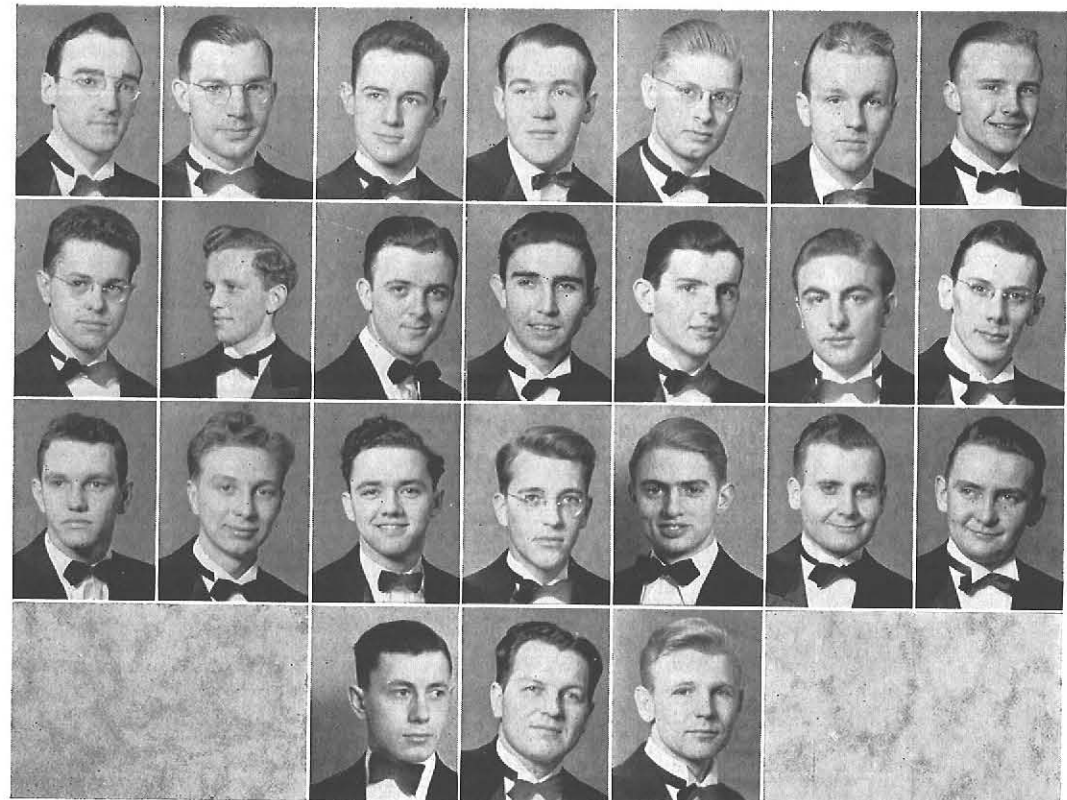
Psi Phi

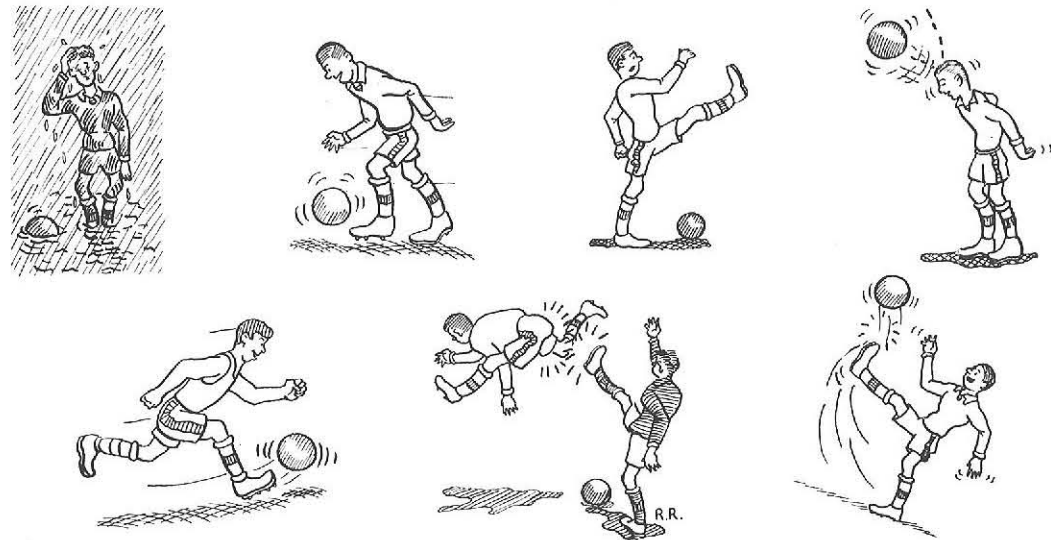
This year saw a major upset in the pool as Tom Tierney was defeated for the first time in four years of College Varsity swimming competition.

After a splendid 1938 season in which State's Varsity Soccer Team achieved renown by spirited victories over Colgate University, McMasters University, Oberlin College, Oswego Normal, Slippery Rock, (Pa.) Teachers, Allegheny College, a tie game with the powerful University of Toronto eleven, and a solitary loss to Cortland Normal, the practice-starved 1939 outfit dropped decisions to three of last season's vanquished, and were decisively defeated by a new opponent, the national contender, University of Rochester.

Highlighting an otherwise dull season was the development of Freshman and Sophomore booters through competition in Var-

sity games to a point where several unknowns will probably be mainstays of next year's Varsity.
