## Obituary

Cassandra B. Hall was born January 31, 1942 to the late Major Brown and Floreed Willingham Brown in Talladega, Alabama. In August 1961. She was joined in matrimony with James Hall, Sr. They later relocated to Buffalo, New York.

After completing her education at Buffalo State College, she became employed with Allstate Insurance Company, becoming one of the first black female Insurance Agents in Western New York. In her spare time she enjoyed participating in various political campaigns and organizations.
