

2	O. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:  Typical American Four Square, Similiar in building design to 1475 and 1471 Amherst Street. Amherst Street, originally known as Ferry Street, was a pre-existing street incorporated into Olmsted's parkside subdivision with restrictive residential development. The land was conveyed to the Parkside Land and Improvement Co., by Elam R. Jewett in November of 1885 at a cost of \$44,158. The land was to be developed according to a subdivision map drawn up by Jewett and one stipulation that a "factory for the manufacture of cement shall not be erected."
