some of the meetings. The first to look forward to will be a visit from Newbury St. and a wig and makeup show. This is tentatively set for the May meeting.

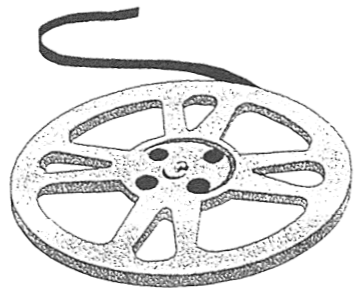

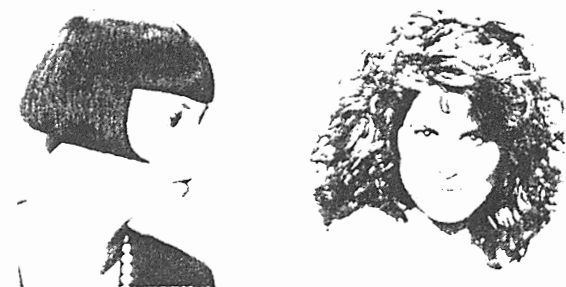

Librarian "97"

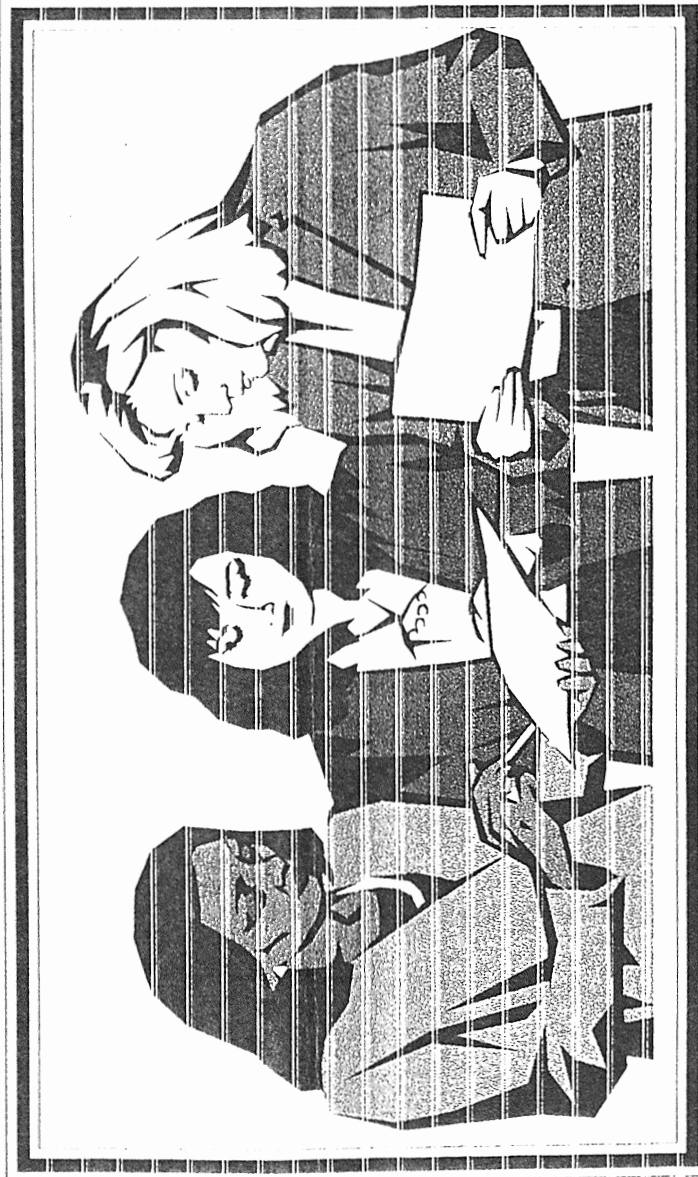

Police link burglaries to man's fetish

Christopher Hoesel turned to burglary to satisfy his sexual desires, according to Cheektowaga police.

Police have accused the 25-year-old Cheektowaga man of breaking into homes in the town's Cedar Grove Heights area with the intention of taking — not jewelry or appliances — but women's underwear.

The excitement of breaking into a home and stealing women's lingerie was sexually arousing for Hoesel, police said after interviewing the suspect last week.

"Every so often we get some cases that are more unusual," said Lt. James Morath. "This is one of them."

Police are happy to put an end to the bizarre string of burglaries, as Hoesel is scheduled for a felony hearing today in Cheektowaga Town Court. He still was being held Wednesday in the Erie County Holding Center in lieu of \$5,000 bail.

Hoesel last Friday turned himself in to Cheektowaga police, who charged him with second-degree burglary and petit larceny in the Feb. 10 break-in at a home on Pendlewood Drive in Cheektowaga.

Hoesel for now has been charged with just the Feb. 10 burglary, but authorities connect him to a total of 17 burglaries and attempted burglaries where stolen underwear was the common link.

The age of the women burglary victims ranged from 16 to 61. Some were married, some were single, some had children. They were targeted for a reason.

"How he would decide (whom to burglarize) was basically by just canvassing the area by walking or biking," Morath said. "He'd just find a woman that appealed to him and that would be the house he would break into."

The burglaries occurred on the north side of Cheektowaga — and two on South Forest Drive in Amherst — within close proximity of Hoesel's Sandstone Drive home, police said.

It was relatively easy breaking into the homes, police said. In some instances, the doors were left unlocked or access was gained through a window, police added.

A few of the homes were broken into twice. Going back to the same house added to the excitement, investigators said. In some cases, personal effects were taken to connect with the women, police added.

In one burglary, photographs of the female were stolen; in another, a dress. Pornographic videotapes were taken from one of the homes, and a VCR to watch them was stolen from another, investigators said. Only once was cash taken.

Police earlier this month got a break in the burglary investigations — which were led by Detective Dan Conley and included Detectives Gary Martz, Tom Wentland and Morath — after a man spotted a man trying to break into a Westbrook Drive home.

A composite of the suspect was made and police knocked on hundreds of doors showing residents the sketch.

Police, coincidentally, knocked on Hoesel's door, too. Although he did not answer, it scared him into telling his girlfriend, minister and family members about the burglaries, police said. They persuaded Hoesel to turn himself in to police.

Friends and family members would not comment Wednesday. Dennis A. Kitchen Jr., Hoesel's attorney, said this week that he just started handling the case and did not have a chance to meet with his client.

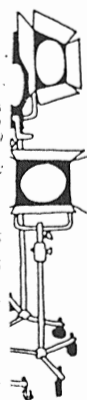

After a four year absence from clinical medicine, I have returned to medical practice. Although my work with IFGE as their Director of Medical Research and Liaison, was and will remain rewarding to me personally and most importantly provides a vital service for our community, I am increasingly aware of the real and crucial need for experienced and dedicated physicians, like myself, to provide the highest standards of care and concern for all of our transgender community members in all stages of our medical needs. Inroads have been made, it is true, but they remain limited and few medical physicians have the knowledge and more tragically the interest in educating themselves in the unique medical circumstances that occur with members of our community.


Because of that very real need in our community, I have chosen to shift my focus and return to medical practice. As a transgendered physician with over 20 years of experience in endocrinology, gynecology related surgeries and clinical management as well as a decade as a transgender medicine specialist, I offer valuable experience that will serve our community in the best possible way.

Although the majority of my practice will be devoted to the MTF and FTM person who is intending to or currently involved in contragender living, seeking SRS surgery and aftercare, my practice will not be limited to those individuals. Too many of us avoid routine medical care because we fear we will be "ostracized" if even our subtle feminizing or masculinizing is discovered and hence seriously jeopardize our health and longevity. All of us in the Transgendered spectrum deserve and need to receive the best possible medical care from an experienced, dedicated physician specializing in transgender medicine. In addition, concerned consultation with your mental health care provider, cosmetic surgeon and SRS surgeon is a vital component of complete "wellness." My medical practice takes into consideration all of these factors and I am dedicated to providing the best possible medical care to you in a safe, comfortable environment.
