Anxiety And Its Sure Cure

In order to be cured of our undue anxiety we need to study our God, become acquainted with his character. We must learn:-

1st The nature of God's proceedure; as to a) Regularity. b) System, exactness. c) Comprehensiveness.

and 2nd The great variety abundance of his provision.

3rd The character of his administration and manner of his distribution.

If we are going to be anxious let us be anxious about knowing our God, and his abundant supply.

- 2-The name of Jesus had to be magnified.
- 3-Sins had to be confessed.
- 4-Old customs and habits had to be given up.

2-That we may expect from the judgement of Christ sympathy, mercy and justice.

3-That there are great advantages in appearing before the judgement seat of Christ. a) We save time. b) We are saved from worry.c) We save hard feelings. a) We have matters settled right once for all.

Let us count it a privilege to appear before the judgement seat of Christ, where we shall always get justice.

Let us pray earnestly that God may make us normal christians. Let us endeavor to grow symetrically in our christian life that we may be physically strong, mentally clear and alert, spiritually alive and socially active and useful.

- 2-That the ear should be trained so that you may hear what you should hear.
- 5-That the ear should be trained so that you may hear whom you should hear.
- 4-That the ear should be trained so that you may hear when you should hear.
- 5-That the ear should be trained so that you may hear at the same time that your associates are hearing.
- 6-That we should help others to hear things that will be helpful to them.

May God help us to follow the Holy Spirit so that we will hear what, when and whom we should hear.

So long as right and wrong; justice and injustice; intelligence and ignorance have a place in this old world we must have war.

And every one of us, whether we wish to be or not is lined up on one side or the other.

And the side upon which we are will determine the kind of preparation we will make, and under whom we will receive our training.

There are many institutions in this old world in which men are trained to be unjust, selfish, impious and immoral: and they are working over time night and day, they are turning out large classes every day; not simply every year or every month but every day.
