Hip roof porch has exposed rafter tails, square supports, stick balustrade. Square-headed windows 1/1 lights on first and second floor. Small rectangular single light window over porch on second floor. Hip roof dormer with flared eaves. Tri-partite 1/1 window.

## 20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Typical American Four Square, Amherst Street, originally known as Ferry Street, was a pre-existing street incorporated into Olmsted's parkside subdivision with restrictive residential development. The land was conveyed to George L. Thorne and Byron Angell by James Tillinghast and the Buffalo Cement Co, in July 1889 to be subdivided for residential use. The subdivision named "Meadow View Park" carried restrictive covenants in its deeds of sale and stipulated that the dweelings be of "tasteful design."
