On June 24, 1926, the Regents of the State of New York approved the course of study for a fourth year and authorized the school to grant the degree of Bachelor of Science (in Education). The last legislature made an appropriation for eight new positions, six of which are of professorial rank. In the near future application will be made for a change in the name of the institution to the "Buffalo State Teachers' College."
